#### MERE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. The Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You will be permitted to raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be held in the Andy Young Pavilion at **7.30pm on Monday, 7th April 2008**.

#### The Chairman writes:

I am pleased to report that, having attended the Mere Swimming Club AGM, a committee was elected and there are plans to open the swimming pool on 3rd May.

Mere is entering the Best Kept Village Competition – we hope everyone will support this by keeping up the high standards of cleanliness and tidiness.

We are sorry to report that our groundsman is on sick leave for the next three months. We wish him a speedy recovery and we hope that the residents of Mere will be understanding if we are unable to keep up the high standards that he has set during this time. We are hoping to employ a temporary groundsman in order to try and keep the disruption to a minimum.

We have arranged to hold the Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 23rd April at 7.30 p.m. in the Grove Buildings (refreshments will be served from 7.00 p.m.). This is a public meeting convened by the Parish Council where parishioners have the opportunity to come along and discuss concerns and hear reports from various organisations in the town. We will also be inviting representatives from the Three Rivers Partnership to give a presentation about sports provision in Gillingham and we also hope to discuss the promotion of tourism for Mere.

Lastly but most importantly, I would like to urge all parishioners to read and comment on the consultation paper recently produced by Salisbury District Council, 'Core Strategy Preferred Options – A Plan for Salisbury & South Wiltshire'. The results of this consultation will go towards shaping this area until the year 2026. The document is available to

#### **MERE WEATHER**

February was the driest month since last September. We had only 49mms (1.93 ins) of rain. Last year was 160.5mms (6.32ins). We had six frosty mornings, which soon cleared with bright sunshine. Generally we had cold winds and above average sunshine.

So far in March it has been wetter with 84.5 mms (3.33 ins.) of rain (36 mms on the 15th alone) with hail on the 9th. We had less sunshine than in February, but still strong winds.

#### MERE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

VISIT ONE: Wednesday 14th May 2008

#### Sandford Orcas Manor

Sandford Orcas Manor, near Sherborne, is a lovely example of a small Tudor Manor House. Built in honey-coloured Ham stone in the 1550s on the foundations of a mediaeval house, it survives virtually unaltered inside as well as out. Only three families have owned this house, the present family, the Medlycotts for about the last 250 years. Our guide will be Sir Mervyn Medlycott who will take us round his manor and will include the Great Hall with its Jacobean screen and massive mullioned windows, the Parlour, Great Chamber and Gatehouse Chamber. The Church of St Nicholas has a Norman font and a 15th century tower, and its small chapel contains a number of monuments. We will also be able to view the gardens, at its best in May at lilac and laburnum time, and with herbaceous borders, terraces and mature trees.

After we will have an included tea at The Mitre.

We will leave Salisbury Street Car Park at 1.15pm and return to Mere by 5.30pm approx.



#### THE REV'D PAUL BARNES WRITES:

Bob Long had a very peculiar passion!
He loved attending Annual General Meetings!!!

I never inspected his diary but had he permitted me to do so I am sure that the dates of the AGM of every organisation, business, and charity that Bob had dealings with, and I'm sure some he didn't, would have been entered in bold, red, ink. In the village where I grew-up it became a joke. When fixing the date for their AGM people would say, "Well, if nobody else turns up, you can guarantee Bob will". And many times he was the only non-committee member who signed the attendance book.

Bob didn't just attend AGM's because he had nothing better to do, or for the refreshments that were usually provided free of charge, he attended because he had an opinion to voice, a question, or two, or three, to ask. Bob will have closely scrutinised the Annual Report and Accounts, and if there were any discrepancies or irregularities he would have noticed them. As you can imagine he kept everybody on their toes!

At some meetings there was an audible groan when Bob rose to his feet and uttered his familiar introduction, "Chairman, might I be permitted to draw the meetings attention to..." But, when Bob became ill and eventually died AGM's were never the same again, his questions were missed, but more than that his interest in what the organisation had been doing and planned to do was missed. Bob might have been an irritant, but it is often the irritant that produces the pearl of wisdom.
