MERE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. The Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You will be permitted to raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be on **Monday, 2nd June** at 7.30pm in the Andy Young Pavilion.

The Chairman writes

I am pleased to report that, at the Annual Parish Council meeting held on 12th May, I was re-elected as Chairman for a further year. I would like to thank the Councillors for their support and pledge that I will do my best to serve the community. The Parish Council's new Vice-Chairman is Mr. Eric Mitchell. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mary White (the retiring Vice-Chairman) for her help and support during the past year.

We were very pleased to see so many parishioners at our Annual Parish Meeting where we discussed, amongst other things, Salisbury District Council's consultation documents that will be used to form the policies and strategies for development in and around the Mere area during the next 20 years. We agreed with those present that we would publish the Parish Council's consultation submission on the latest policy consultation document 'Core Strategy – Preferred Options'.

I can report that this submission has been on display on the Parish Council notice board (outside the Lecture Hall), in the Library, available to view in the Post Office and on the Mere website: **www.merewilts.org** We would welcome your comments and views on this submission.

Mr. Peter Button, the Parish Council's footpath representative, recently reported on a meeting he had attended where he learnt that Wiltshire County Council has all the materials to build and repair stiles and would be happy to make these available to any community volunteer groups. Mere used to have an extremely active and award-winning footpath group who gave up their time in order to keep our footpaths open and repair stiles and bridges etc. Sadly, the group has now disbanded but

we have heard that there could be some interest for occasional volunteer help. We are able to provide liability and accident insurance for community volunteers and so, if there is anyone interested that would be prepared to give up some time to repair and refurbish our footpath stiles, please contact the Parish Clerk, Lindsey Wood 201747 860701.

I would like to advise groups and organisations of a new grant scheme that Salisbury District Council has made available for 2008/09 called the General Community Fund, which aims to support community projects that improve the quality of life and wellbeing of the residents of South Wiltshire. The total grant fund is £130,000 and the minimum grant award will be £5,000, but at least 10% of the project costs must be raised locally by the applicant. We had the showers in April, totalling 92 mms (3.62 ins). Last year we only had 18.5 mms (0.73 ins). We also had snow on the 5th and 6th, but on both days it soon melted. Up to the 18th May, we had 18 mms (0.71 ins) of rain. From the 6th May we had a week of very warm weather - up to 72 °F (22°C) equalling parts of the Mediterranean at the same time. But, summer had not arrived! On the 14th we had clouds, a little rain, and a cold East wind which is still with us at the time of writing.

MERE POLICE NEWS



We do not have space to include the entire May edition of "Neighbourhood Policing News" for Mere and surrounding parishes, produced by our Mere Neighbourhood Police Team but here are a few highlights:

Incidents: Although there were a number of incidents in the surrounding district, there were none actually in Mere, but your attention is drawn to the fact that between 7th-16th April, 300-400 litres of heating oil was taken from a tank in Bourton. Many of us have similar tanks, so please ensure, if possible, that locks are in place and tanks are secure when you are away from them.

CCTV Coverage: "We were wondering whether members of Mere and surrounding parishes would be able to assist us. We are only aware of a few shops and a couple of roads covered by CCTV in the area. If you have CCTV coverage anywhere, please could you contact PCSO Michael Tryhorn via email or telephone so that we can compile a list of areas covered."

Neighbourhood Watch (NHW): "Firstly, thank you to everyone involved and those playing their part to help make our area safer! Statistically, over the last year, ours has been shown as the safest community in Wiltshire. Jointly, Tisbury and Mere receive <u>less than one</u> reported crime per day. If you would like to know whom your NHW Coordinator is, please contact one of us via email or telephone. Please bear in mind, however, that some areas still have a vacancy for a Coordinator – volunteers are always welcome! The role requires little work but is of great benefit to the community - and you aren't obliged to attend any meetings if you don't want to!"

Community Contact Point: "As you are aware, Police Enquiry Offices have been closing all across the county. We have been fortunate enough to be able to open a Community Contact Point in Mere Library, which is open during Library opening hours. These Community Contact Points work on the same principle as an Enquiry Office. However, instead of being staffed by members of the immediate Police family they are staffed by external, trained staff (in this case, our local Librarians, whom we thank for being trained to assist us). Please use this contact point as we will be working with the Library staff as another way of dealing with enquiries."

A MERE "SON" DOES WELL

A few readers may just have seen the recent announcements in The Times and Daily Telegraph of the forthcoming promotion of Captain William Walworth OBE of the Royal Fleet Auxiliary to the rank of Commodore Royal Fleet Auxiliary, and to his appointment as Assistant Chief of Staff Afloat Support with effect from 2nd September 2008.

The interest to us in Mere is that William Walworth OBE is the son of former Mere Estate Agent, the late "Bill" Walworth, and that he spent his formative years living in the village, attending the former St Leonards School at Motcombe Grange before going on to Shaftesbury Grammar School.

William first went to sea at sixteen and worked his way up the seniority ladder in various British mercantile marine companies before joining the Royal Fleet Auxiliary (RFA), which is a civilian manned fleet, owned by the Ministry of Defence. Its main task is to supply warships of the Royal Navy at sea with fuel, food, stores and ammunition which they need to remain operational while away from base. It also provides aviation support for the Royal Navy, together with amphibious support and secure sea transport for Army units and their equipment.

The RFA is managed by the Commodore RFA who is directly responsible to the Commander in Chief Fleet, as a Fleet Type Commander, for the day to day administration and operation of the RFA Flotilla.

On your behalf, I have offered him congratulations from the people of Mere and wished him well for his forthcoming management of the Royal Navy's Royal Fleet Auxiliary.

VISIT THREE: Wednesday 8th July 2008

Somerset Churches

Somerset is famous for its churches, and we will be starting with the church of All Saints at Sutton Bingham. This delightful little church was built in 1111, but underwent major alterations before 1300 when some of the finest wall paintings in Somerset were probably added. The death of the Virgin Mary is the outstanding section. After we will make the short journey to East Coker, made famous by T. S. Elliot, where you will be free to wander round the church of St Michael where the poet's ashes are buried and there is a memorial to William Dampier, buccaneer and explorer. There will be time to have a picnic or a snack at the Helyar Arms (service can be slow).

We will then go on to Hinton St George where we will be guided around the church of St George and it's many fascinating monuments to the Poulett family, including the Poulett Chapel which is normally kept locked. Here there is a magnificent monument to the first Lord Poulett. After our church tour we will have a brief look at the village, followed by afternoon tea at Dorothy's Tea Room.

THE REV'D CHRIS MOORSOM WRITES:

Summer time - not enough time?

There's a lot going on this June: in my diary, there are three weddings, the Sunday Funday with Roly the Clown in Mere, a Children's Workshop, a village fete (or two), St. Peter's Patronal Festival, and plenty else too. At the same time, the bread and butter necessities continue, there are other people's deadlines and expectations to meet, and, it seems, not enough hours in the day.

In Prayers of Life, Michel Quoist wrote, 'I am not asking you tonight, Lord, for *[more]* time to do this and then that, but your grace to do conscientiously, in the time that you give me, what you want me to do.' The trick is not to worry too much about the things we can't do, but to focus on doing the things we can and to do them as well as possible.

Added to our little problems, are the bigger demands of the world. If we have any conscience at all, this moves us to be concerned. "When comes the promised time that war shall be no more, and lust,

oppression, crime shall flee thy face before?" asks the hymn-writer, and many of us echo these sentiments.

When Peter said "Yes" to Christ's call to be the leader of the apostles, he must have been daunted by the sheer enormity of the task he was given. "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matt.28). But then the Gospel adds, "and remember, I am with you, to the end of the age." On that scale, perhaps our worries can appear less significant, and we can put our own anxieties behind us as we reflect on the eternal timescale of God's kingdom.

Busy or not, "Time is only for love, and life only that we may find God" (St. Bernard) – i.e. to seek and (we pray) find the quality of life that Christ came to reveal, calling us to put his Way of living first, and so become ourselves lights in the world. So let's pray for a productive June, but not allow busyness to take away our eternal perspective.
