On Wednesday, 8th October, Mere Parish Council held a public meeting to discuss 'Our Place in the Future' (Salisbury District Council's Local Development Framework Consultation Document) which was attended by approximately 150 people, most of whom were in the senior age group.

Salisbury District Council officers attended the meeting and answered a variety of questions put to them during the evening. Some of the audience wanted the whole document rejected but I do not think that that is practical.

My family have lived, worked and died in Mere since 1571 when records first began. During that time there have been many changes to Mere, change will always happen, we cannot stop it. My children and grandchildren will see more changes than my forefathers could have imagined.

We have to manage that change to the best of our ability and aim to retain the character and qualities of Mere that we all love so much. I am sure the Parish Council will do its best now, and in the future, to achieve this objective.

MERE W.I. 1918-2008

Is it all just "Jam and Jerusalem"?

In November 1918, 32 women met in the Lecture Hall, founder members of Mere Women's Institute. They paid an annual subscription of 2/- (IOp). Florence Dean remained a member for more than 60 years. By 1926, there were 101 members. From the beginning, there was a range of activities, including a Drama Group, whose first production was extracts from "Twelfth Night." They played hockey in winter and tennis in summer. Crafts were then, as now, important, although the topics have changed. Early skills included glove making and millinery.

They collected a library of 351 books and in 1929 won 1st Prize in a county competition for a "Village History," receiving 2 oak trays, suitably inscribed, which were until recently still in the Lecture Hall.

We have no records surviving from the 1930s, but know more about the war years, when: "activities included knitting garments for the Red Cross, arranging social evenings for evacuees and collecting waste paper, rose hips, elderflowers and bags of dried nettles." They also earned their reputation as jam makers, producing 340lbs one year. After the war, a branch of the Wiltshire Library Service opened in Mere and for many years members helped with its running. Music and drama flourished with a choir, numerous one-act plays and the series of pantomimes, which earned a reputation well beyond Mere itself.

Probably the most notable achievement of these nine decades occurred in 1955 with the compilation of a Village Scrapbook, which won 3rd prize in a County competition, and was later expanded to a more ambitious project culminating in the publication of "The Story of Mere."

Today we are proud to be members of the National Federation of Women's Institutes, the largest women's organisation in the country, which is an influential voice for the countryside and its people, working with many other organisations and Governments departments. Your local W.I. still offers friendship and a variety of activities, both locally and by joining in events throughout the County.
