The Chairman writes:

This is my last report as Parish Council Chairman. My term of office expires in May when the new Chairman will be elected. The last year has been quite busy for the Council, the sports facilities have been expanded with the laying of new cricket wickets and a new archery club being formed. New equipment for the play area in the Recreation Ground has been ordered and will be installed very soon. The Youth Club have almost completed the footpath around Long Hill which now makes a lovely walk.

Rodney Snook (Sid), our groundsman for several years, has had to take early retirement on medical grounds and the Parish Council wish him well for the future. We also extend the same wishes to Henry Pike, who will be retiring at the end of June.

We held meetings with the public to discuss 'Our Place in the Future' and responded to the consultation documents. The new Unitary Council for Wiltshire with its Area Boards and Community Partnerships is giving us sleepless nights and endless meetings.

From time to time there is minor vandalism in the town which is regrettable but Mere is still a very safe and lovely place to live. How nice to see some life in the Old Ship Hotel again. I wish it every success in the future, along with all the other businesses in Mere. The loss of several shops is a worry and I hope everyone will support those that remain.

I would like to thank my fellow councillors for their support and my special thanks to our Parish Clerk, Lindsey Wood, for all her hard work and guidance. It has been an honour to serve as Chairman for the last two years.

NEW WILTSHIRE COUNCIL PROPOSES A MERE COMMUNITY AREA PARTNERSHIP

On the 31st March 2009, I attended a meeting in The Lecture Hall, which was the last day I was officially a Salisbury District Councillor. A presentation was given by representatives of the new Wiltshire Council, which culminated in a workshop and then a request for volunteers to form a Community Area Partnership (CAP) for the Mere

Community Area. The purpose of a CAP is to provide a strong local voice through local members who know the area. A shared agenda based on local priorities should help in providing improved co-ordination of local services leading to quicker, simpler and better decisions.

A Debate took place as to whether we needed a CAP or not. However, several residents present put their names down, and through the pages of "Mere Matters", I can tell you that Wiltshire Council will be looking for members to join the Mere CAP, should it be formed. They will be looking particularly for representatives from: local interest and community groups; the voluntary sector and charities; the business community; faith groups; local partner agencies, such as the Neighbourhood Police Team and Highways representatives; user Groups, such as tenants, carers and disability groups; young people and the Parish Council and councillors.

Funds are available for a venue and clerk, for which I understand finance will be provided through our new to be formed South West Area Board. There is already an appointed Community Area Manager (CAM) who is a senior Wiltshire Council Officer, Katharine Dew.

WEATHER REPORT

March seemed a very dry month, but we had 62.5mms of rain (2.46ins) against February's 46.5mms (1.83ins). In both months most of the rain fell in the first week, 44 mms (1.73ins) in February and March, all 62.5mms (1.7ins).

Up to the 19th April, we only had 14.5mms (0.57ins) of rain. This fell usually mostly at night, only recording 0.5mms (0.02ins). Generally, the weather has been fine with many sunny days but cold winds. The daffodils and tulips are doing well!

GLIDING CLUB INVITES VISITORS TO OPEN DAY

As a resident of Mere and its surroundings, you may not realise that an eco-friendly aviation sport has been taking place on your doorstep at Kingston Deverill since 1991. Now's your chance to find out more about Gliding.

The Bath, Wilts and North Dorset Gliding club is hoping for a big turn out to its Open Day on Sunday 24th May. The previous two such events have been washed out by

rain. This year the club is hoping for fine weather. Its airfield at Kingston Deverill, just outside Mere, will be alive with activity at this family event designed to educate and inform visitors about the club itself and the sport of gliding. It will be offering trial flights in its modern 2-seater training gliders, and for those who prefer terra firma, in a ground-based glider simulator.

There will be a static display of gliders, and free information and videos to watch about this fascinating and challenging sport. Special membership prices will be on offer to anyone joining the club on the day. One day courses will also be on offer, as will presentation vouchers for giving to others as "experience" presents.

THE REV'D ROS HOLLINGSWORTH, METHODIST CHURCH MINISTER, WRITES:

I was recently eating with friends in a restaurant and the following poster caption caught my eye:

“Thought the King was dead? Think again. Watch this space. The King is alive.”

What on earth did this mean?

I have to admit total ignorance of what the poster was alluding to, and I started to discuss the poster with my friends. They were able to put me right quite quickly! The king in question is, of course, Elvis Presley, the ‘Undisputed King of Rock ‘n’ Roll’. This ‘king’ being for many, a great musician, but also a drug addict, who died of an overdose in 1977.

The poster reminded me of Jesus' disciples and followers on Resurrection Sunday. Despite, on a number of occasions, Jesus telling them what was going to happen to him, they could not believe him. They thought that his crucifixion was the end and that death had been victorious. The women indeed had prepared the spices and ointments to anoint Jesus' body but when they arrived at the tomb, they found that the stone had been rolled away and there was no body.

By the end of the day, the risen King had appeared to some of the disciples, both men and women, and they were able to say: "The Lord has risen indeed".

I am reminded of a chorus:

*Jesus is alive today
I know, I know it's true,
Sovereign of the universe,

Jesus lives and reigns in me
That's how I know it's true.*

I pray that you discover the power of the risen Lord and King, Jesus Christ, and that He lives and reigns in you.
