MERE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. The Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You will be permitted to raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be held at 7.30pm in the Andy Young Pavilion on Monday, 1st March 2010.

The Chairman writes:

Mere Parish Council is doing everything possible to impress upon Wiltshire Council the need to keep our car parks free to use. We feel strongly that Wiltshire Council needs to take into the account the differing needs of rural and urban areas, and that there should be provision for free public car parking in small towns and villages in the rural areas in order to encourage people to shop locally. Also to protect local services and community facilities in order to achieve sustainable economic growth and promote self containment.

As I am writing this, the Highways Agency are about to close the A303. You will probably, by now, all be aware of the extra traffic this has created locally and the congestion in Gillingham (my predictions) – all so that the A303, 'the Gateway to the West Country' can be fitted with new drains and resurfacing. I wouldn't mind putting up with the congestion and inconvenience if it was being dualled. When will this road get the improvements that it deserves, bearing in mind the amount of traffic it carries?

Weather wise, we should soon be saying goodbye to an old-fashioned winter. Let's hope we can look forward to an old-fashioned summer.

GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, MERE DIVISION, WRITES

The A303 will have been closed by the time you are reading this. For those who live near to where the diverted traffic passes or likely to pass, especially in West Knoyle, I hope life will not be to stressful. The road into West Knoyle from the A303 services will have cones shaped so that as cars can go through, but very difficult for lorries etc., someone will be on duty and large loads will be discouraged. No doubt some of you will see increased traffic as will other affected local areas, some may complain, however the majority of us would not be happy if the A303 was not maintained. Some of the older residents will remember when the A303 passed through Mere. When Mere was bypassed I could not sleep for several nights for the "lack" of noise. Geoffrey Colenso from Balfour Beatty Mott MacDonald, the service provider for the Highways Agency on the A303, has made contact with me and agreed that I can contact him in case of "real emergency". The contractors have done all they can locally to date, and I am sure they will carry out the repairs and improvements, such as widening Chaddenwick Hill (Charnage Hill) efficiently. I am told that no utility services to West Knoyle or indeed Mere will be affected.

Pot holes are, as most of you know, a problem after the inclement weather. In the first instance report the presence of pot holes to Clarence 201225 777234, should you not then be satisfied, you are welcome to contact me.

The next financial year's Community Grants should be available for community groups etc. to apply for soon. If all goes well an application would need to be lodged well before the South West Area Board meeting of the 21st April, 2010, when a decision would be made regarding such applications. I did complain regarding the lack of frequency of our South West Area Board meetings, making it difficult to diary them ahead. Now sense seems to have prevailed, up until the autumn they will be every 9 weeks on a Wednesday.

I am attending the Core Strategy hearings at Salisbury in March and April, in my own right, and as a representative of Mere Parish Council, on two issues. My own personal representation is challenging the soundness of the proposed core strategy. At present, the aspiration is to reduce car usage, in reality with very limited public transport. Mere and its hinterland and beyond in the majority rely on the car, therefore I argue as Planning Policy Guidance 4 states, the rural and urban areas have differing needs, which I cannot see that the proposed Core Strategy allows for.

AMBULANCE SERVICE AWARD FOR MERE FIREFIGHTERS

Four Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service firefighters from Mere have received Chief Officer's Awards from Great Western Ambulance Service for their efforts to save a man's life.

Crew Manager Mike Tealey and Firefighters Wendy Bailey, Wayne Brundish and Steve Pester were called to a house in The Fields, Mere on 23 April 2009 to give medical support to a 78-year-old man who had suffered a heart attack.

The call was part of the co-responding scheme operated by Wiltshire Fire & Rescue Service on behalf of Great Western Ambulance Service, which sees personnel at 11 fire stations being trained to provide an essential level of first aid until an ambulance arrives.

On this occasion, the Mere crew arrived at the same time as the paramedics and helped them to carry out CPR on the casualty. The air ambulance was called, and the firefighters brought the man out of his home – which in itself was complicated by narrow stairs and differing floor levels – and continued resuscitation while he was transported to the local recreation field, where the fire service's Land Rover was used to light the helicopter's landing zone.

Sadly, despite the efforts of all concerned, the patient died before he could be flown to hospital.

Chief Fire Officer Andy Goves visited Mere fire station to congratulate the crew on their efforts. He said: "Co-responding is a vital service in our rural areas, where fire crews are often able to attend more quickly than an ambulance. I am very proud that the Mere crew has been recognised by the Great Western Ambulance Service for their outstanding efforts, and I am sure the local community appreciates having such dedicated firefighters in their midst."

David Whiting, Chief Executive of Great Western Ambulance Service, added: "Our crews regularly work with other members of the emergency services. What these awards recognise is that the four firefighters went the extra mile to do the very best for the patient. Co-responders provide an essential service to patients in their local communities in those vital first few minutes while an ambulance crew is en route. I was proud to lead the celebrations that recognised their efforts."

MERE SURGERY Swine Flu Vaccination Programme

Following instructions given by the Department of Health the Surgery are still able to offer the Swine Flu vaccination to those patients who fall in the risk categories listed below and have not yet had their vaccination.

Risk categories:

1. <u>Individuals aged between six months and 65 years</u> with a diagnosis of chronic respiratory disease, asthma (that requires continuous or repeated

use of medication), chronic heart disease, chronic renal disease, chronic liver disease, chronic neurological disease (stroke or TIA), diabetes, immunosuppression or individuals who are the main carer for an elderly or disabled person.

- 2. All pregnant women
- 3. Any individual who has contact with a person who is immunocompromised.
- 4. Individuals aged 65 and over in the above risk categories.

If you fall within one of the risk categories and have not yet had your vaccination but wish to, please contact the surgery to make an appointment.

'SCORES ON DOORS' IN MERE

Wiltshire Environmental Services (part of Wiltshire Council) has recently introduced a food safety rating scheme which can provide you with information on how hygienic a

catering establishment is. It is called "Scores on Doors" because establishments are encouraged to proudly display their star ratings on their doors.

The scheme aims to improve food hygiene standards and give the public a more informed choice about where to eat based on food safety. The following is a summary of the results for Mere published in early February 2010.

It is reassuring to see that our establishments that serve young and elderly people, who are the most vulnerable to food poisoning, do very well. So, Bramley House, Fives Court and Mere Primary School all get the maximum five stars.

Our pubs do well too; the Butt of Sherry, the George, the Spread Eagle and the Walnut Tree all score four stars whilst the Red Lion at Kilmington and the Fox & Hounds at East Knoyle get a superb five. The Seymour Arms at East Knoyle scored three stars.

Two retail food shops scored five stars (the Co-op and Stourhead Farm Shop) whilst Mere Fish Farm did well with four.

Takeaways are often a problem area but not in Mere: the fish and chip shop does well with four stars and the Golden Valley Chinese takeaway manages a still respectable three.

Amongst our restaurants, the Angel Corner Tea Room scored three stars whilst the Indigo Blue restaurant was rated only one star.

The inspections were carried out between November 2007 and August 2009 (the higher the level of risk the more frequent the inspections). So in some cases the management may have changed since the inspection and some of the lower-scoring establishments will have had time to improve.

Journey's End

Our journey through Lent is a journey to the cross and the empty tomb beyond. The pilgrimage metaphor for Christian existence is helpful here – a personal journey that can be likened to a literal pilgrimage to a sacred place. In the past, many of the benefits of a pilgrimage were found not at the destination itself, but on the road getting there; when the pilgrims arrived they were just as likely to be giving thanks for what they had already received on the way as for what they received when they got there.

Jesus, too, was a traveller on the road. The gospels tell us about his journeys around Judea and Galilee: Jesus himself is challenged and changed by his encounters on the way. Eventually he turns his face towards Jerusalem and his destination on the cross. Only beyond the cross lies the true goal, the true prize. His disciples learn from him as they travel along: discipleship is tough and costly, troubles will need to be overcome and the journey will not be easy, but if we keep our eyes firmly fixed on Jesus we shall eventually reach the goal and claim the prize.

But I'd like to take you on a real pilgrimage to that sacred place where Jesus died and rose again. In February next year, I am leading a tour of the Holy Land, and I'd love you to join me if you can. I am giving you plenty of notice so that you can make your holiday plans accordingly and save up the money. For some it may be the only holiday they take in 2011. Of course, we will not be walking there! We will travel by plane and coach, but for ten days we will be following in the footsteps of Jesus from Bethlehem to Jerusalem, "the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God" (Hebrews 11.10). I know that you will be challenged and changed by your encounters on the way. I know that your faith will be strengthened. I know these things because so it was for me when I went there in 2008. And I hope that you will come to understand more clearly that our journey's end, just as it was for Jesus, is not Jerusalem after all, but "a better country, that is, a heavenly one" (Hebrews 11.16).
