

MERE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen.

The Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You will be permitted to raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be on **Monday**, **4th March 2013** at 7.30pm in the Andy Young Pavilion.

The Chairman writes:

As March begins, there is a feeling that surely Spring must be on our doorstep with longer days and more clement weather, and on the subject of the weather I would like to thank our groundsmen, Tony Suter and John Thorpe for all their hard work in clearing the snow and ice around the streets of Mere during the snowy outburst in January. I have had many comments of gratitude from residents who are very appreciative of being able to get to the shops and necessary appointments during that time.

At the Parish Council Meeting in February there was confirmation from Wiltshire Council's Area Highway Engineer of his recommendation that the repainting of the yellow lines in The Square and those extending from Boar Street towards Barton Lane should take place as soon as practicable. As you will be aware, the yellow lines in The Square have become extremely worn and hard to see in places, but unfortunately this does not prevent the WC Parking Ambassadors issuing tickets for those parked on the lines, visible or not, and therefore they do need to be repainted in fairness to all.

I am happy to report that, with the agreement of the Parish Council, the newly formed Mere Footpath Group has already been busy surveying some of our most used footpaths with a view to start work on cutting back encroaching brambles and weeds to make passage easier for walkers of both the two and four legged variety — which leads me to once again add a reminder to **please pick up after your dogs**. Thank you.

At the beginning of February I attended the Annual Carnival Meeting to hear the news and reports of their sterling efforts over the year to produce such a colourful and entertaining Carnival. The work of the Carnival Committee goes on all year round and there is much to be done to produce such a wonderful event, but the Committee is always in need of more help, not just on the Committee but also at the fundraising events themselves. At the Budget Meeting in December the budget was set for the coming financial year and approved by the full Council last month. We are fully aware of the continuing need to keep a tight rein on expenditure whilst ensuring that necessary work continues efficiently, and this year the parish precept will increase by 2.09% which the Parish Council feels is an acceptable level.

Finally, local government elections for both county and parish councillors take place on Thursday, 2nd May. This is not only an opportunity for everyone on the electoral roll to vote for their local councillors but also a chance for anyone in Mere who so wishes to put their name forward and stand for election as a Parish Councillor for the next four years.

GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, MERE DIVISION, WRITES:

As I said last month, 2012 was a fantastic year for Mere Town Football Club. Not only did the 1st team win their division for the second season running and gain promotion to the Dorset Senior League (the highest the club has ever been), but the Reserve team also won Division 5.

Wiltshire Council's South West Area Board has awarded a grant of £5,000 to the Mere Town Football Clubs for maintenance equipment. Also, the Mere Town Youth Football Club has been awarded a grant of £1,400 for a storage container.

The South West Area Board is being requested for the funds already awarded for a Skate Park in Mere to be rolled over at a special South West Area Board grants meeting that will take place at The Nadder Hall, Tisbury on Wednesday, 13th March 2013, for those interested.

Project Sunrise, a vision for Mere to bring businesses and other local organisations together to revitalise the area through commerce, trade and tourism was awarded a grant of £14,000 over two years, by The South West Area Board. As said last month if any more of our shops or services fail, we could end up like some communities of just short of 3,000 adults like ourselves, with just one pub and one community shop. We need a range of local services.

At the South West Area Board it was explained by The Youth Development Centre, that young drivers face a ban on carrying anyone other than family members as passengers under proposals being considered by the Government to cut the number of road accidents involving teenagers. It was stated this would impact on our rural environment, for instance any young person who offers to car share to a night work job, would be prevented from doing so.

Anyone considering being a Parish Councillor should note that the Returning Officer for Wiltshire Electoral Services will be accepting nomination papers from Monday, 18th March 2013 and the deadline for receipt of nominations is noon on Friday, 5th April 2013.

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is now postponed until 2014. This is referred to sometimes as the "the roof tax". It could be a discouragement to small development, but it could produce money for infrastructure. I sit on the CIL task group and will keep you informed.

I also sit on the Car Park Project Board, and Councillors have now had to give up their dedicated car parking area. In other cost saving measures, workers are encouraged to work from home, my computer now has a camera, speaker and microphone built in, enabling me to communicate not only with sound but also with vision as well.

As a reminder, I have previously stated 2,730 bottles would have been lit during December 2012 on Bradley Knowle near Kilmington in aid of Breast Cancer. However, this had to be postponed due to poor weather conditions. It is now hoped that you will be able to see the pink and blue lights during June 2013. At five metres wide and three metres high, the installation, called 'Beacon On The Hill', will be the work of Bruce Munro, of Kilmington.

I have encouraged Mere, Zeals, Kilmington, Stourton and West Knoyle parish councils to claim Finger Post Sign grants as several of these directional signs are now missing from our area.

As I said last month, Wiltshire Council now is responsible for health matters including public health, health improvement, health protection and healthcare. This is not responsibility for individual care, but for heath improvement generally. Wiltshire Council is now responsible for screening programmes for early detection of diseases. This includes Bowel and Breast screening and now extends to other diseases including aortic aneurysm screening, which is one I had not heard of!

Dog fouling. I am getting complaints as usual. If you see someone not "clearing up after their dog" on a public highway, please tell me. Footpaths in general are always needing attention and seeing Frank Marshall voluntarily carrying out maintenance to a footpath reminded me to thank all of you who do this and other helpful deeds without any recognition.

WEATHER REPORT

On the 18th of January we were hit by the first real signs of winter-SNOW. A good 76.2mms (3.0ins) fell overnight and stayed with us until another smaller fall of about 25.4mms (1.0in) on the 22nd followed by on the 25th an overnight fall of 31.0mms (1.22ins) of rain, which washed most of it away. During this period we had bright sunny days and cold wind.

The total rain for the month was 111mms (4.37 ins). Last year was 53.5mms (2.11ins). We had rain every day after the 25th.

February started dry with hail on the 5th and a total of 28mms (1.10ins) rain until the IOth. It was generally cold with rain over night.

PROJECT SUNRISE - MERE

During the last eight or nine months, Mere & District Chamber of Trade Committee has been discussing ways in which trade and tourism could be encouraged in the area. While strategies and plans are fine, carrying them out demanded finance beyond the

direct means of the Chamber. We are delighted to announce that the Wiltshire Council's South West Wiltshire Area Board has accepted our Proposal for a Community Project and granted funding of £14,000 over the next two years. We are extremely grateful for this recognition and expression of confidence in our plans and for the guidance of Councillor George Jeans.

What are these plans? We shall be having an open evening and project launch in a couple of month's time, and will be looking for people from the area to assist in delivering the vision of this project. If you would like to help, please get in touch. In the meantime here are some tasters.

There are many micro businesses in the area which need encouragement. Identifying and publicising them, and other people whose skills should be more widely recognised, will be a prime task. They will be linked to a dedicated business portal website for which local designers will be used. There will also be assistance to small businesses to build individual websites.

In conjunction with the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, the Parish Council and local societies, we will be undertaking promotion of the historical and natural attributes of the area. There will be joint representations made to implement improved signage both on the A303 and locally, again using local craftspeople as far as possible.

With the help of local businesses, there will be an investigation to consider how local industrial sites could be adapted to attract new firms to the area, and encourage business start-ups, especially if they can provide youth employment.

Local artists will be consulted to see how gallery space can be found for them to display their work all year round.

Every year in the UK over 1,000 people experience a spinal cord injury and there are an estimated 40,000 spinal cord injured people in the UK alone.

Community Fundraising Manager, Elizabeth Wright, says, "The Fish and Chip Supper is a wonderful opportunity for a great evening with friends and family. We are also encouraging people who work to hold a Fish and Chip Lunch in their work places to

raise even more funds. You may be even a local community group wanting to run a fun evening with your group. REV'D CHRIS MOORSOM, RECTOR OF UPPER STOUR, WRITES:

The Priorities of the Kingdom

For many Christians, March is a season for reflection on our priorities, but not just in the spiritual sphere (meditating on Christ's life and Passion), but also in matters of Stewardship (how we spend our time, talents and treasure). It is also common for the annual financial accounts of churches and charities to be presented, so that we can reflect on the way money has been raised and spent, and set priorities for the coming financial year.

How do Christians set their priorities? Lent studies and services can be a help, but then we need to earth our spiritual exercises into our daily living and choices.

So here are a couple of suggested Lenten exercises which might help:

- 1) Take a look at personal income and spending, and assess what percentage you spend on different aspects of life.
- 2) Over a few weeks, keep a log of time spent on the various activities of your life, and then work out the percentages over the period.

A day might look something like this (a fictional day):

Monday

Domestic	Sleep	Work(paid/ unpaid)	Spiritual	Recreational
Chores 2½ hrs	7½ hrs	Travel 1 hr	Reading 10 min	Dog walks/gym 40 min
Meals 2½ hrs		At work 7 hrs		TV – 1 hr
Other ½hr		Homework ½ hr	Prayers – 10min	Book/chat – ½ hr
Total 5½ 23%	7½ 31%	8½ 35½ %	20 mins 1½%	2 hr 10 min 9%

Then ask yourself honestly: Does this reflect the priorities that I believe in? How might the Lord call me to spend my resources more wisely and generously?

As we are reminded of the story of Jesus' setting his face towards Jerusalem, his priority becomes clear: he is to proclaim God's kingdom at the heart of the nation's life and religion, knowing that the cost will be his own suffering and death. Those around him have very different priorities: survival, power, success, escape from suffering; but Jesus is single-minded in focussing on his Father's will ('not my will but Yours be done'), though this brought him great suffering and a cruel death. Yet without this, the victory of the cross and the hope revealed through his resurrection could not have been fulfilled.

So as we celebrate the new and living relationship which Jesus has forged for us with the Father, we too have the opportunity to re-align our lives with his purposes of love, and to give more generously for Christ's work to be done through us and his Church today.
