



Mere Town Council

If you are reading this before the 1st of May then I hope that you have been able to register to vote and will be voting. There are candidates to choose from in both the Unitary (Wiltshire) and Town Council elections. The returning officer and team are efficient and you should be able to find out the results within a couple of days at

most. The Town Council Office will publish results.

My apologies for not getting the Chairman's report in last month, I shall be brief this month. My first task is to thank the volunteers who went out to Litter Pick, one and all.

At the last town council meeting we discussed:



- The plans for the Annual Town Meeting, which will have happened on the 23rd April.
- Planning applications.
- A request to use part of the Salisbury Street car park for a small funfair on the evening of the Mere Carnival. We turned the plan as presented down and asked the Carnival and Funfair to consider something taking less of the car park.
- We adopted the recommendations of a working group meeting on the effectiveness of our Internal Control Measures.
- Heard, from our Clerk on the allotment rent audit.

The next Town Council meeting will be on **12**th **May**, with the newly elected Town Councillors attending. The Venue will be the Duchy Manor Foyer, adjacent to the Town Council offices.

Wiltshire Councillor ~ George Jeans Writes

Roads in the Mere Division consisting of Mere, Kilmington, Stourton, West Knoyle and Zeals need repair. Some are in very poor order such as by Park Corner Farm West Knoyle, for which I was pleased to receive the following reply: "Park Corner Farm - The C297 at Park Corner Farm has been assessed for in situ recycling, a process which is designed to produce a lasting solution to the underlying reasons for the deterioration of the carriageway at this location. Coring and testing carried out earlier this year have identified that the carriageway at this location is suitable for in situ recycling and the team are now in the process of agreeing the design with the contractor, with the aim of carrying out the works this financial year."

National Trading Standards operation results in illegal cigarettes and tobacco seized in Trowbridge. Wiltshire Council Trading Standards has taken part in a large-scale, nationally funded, Illegal tobacco disruption operation, (Op CeCe), in Trowbridge.

I attended an open Mere WI meeting where The Wiltshire Bobby Van Trust put on a presentation. We learnt of a scheme called **Buy with Confidence**, if you have a problem with a member of the scheme or any other trader, you can contact Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on 08082231133. If you are a business interested in becoming a member you can also contact the above number. The Wiltshire Bobby Van Trust in 2024 attended 314 domestic abuse cases and made 1191 visits to victims of crime. A scheme called **TrueCall** which stops nuisance calls was advertised, if interested call 08000336330.

Wiltshire Council manages the Household Support Fund. The primary objective of The Fund is to provide crisis support to vulnerable households in the most need; particularly those who may not be eligible for the other support government has recently made available but who are, nevertheless, in need and who require crisis support. Wiltshire Council has been allocated £4,809,175.90 from the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP). The Fund is to provide crisis support to vulnerable households in the most need with the cost of essentials. Without this support they would struggle to buy food or pay essential utility bills or meet other essential living costs to help them with significantly rising living costs for the following twelve-month period: 1 April 2025 -31 March 2026. The grant is a 12% reduction on the previous 12-month round of funding provided by the government. Through the schemes, households with children, disabled persons and pensioners have been supported. Help has included food and fuel vouchers, housing costs, advice services, white goods, furniture poverty and flooring. Following the introduction of the means tested winter fuel allowance in late 2024, a large cohort of low income, pensionable age households didn't meet the threshold for government support. The household support fund 6 has provided £300 of energy support to 1,231 residents aged 80 and over.

I am getting increasing numbers of complaints again in regard Dog fowling. By highlighting it here again, hopefully it will send out a message again to curb the problem, however any improvements always seem to be forgotten in a short time. Dog fouling is the responsibility of the dog owner – it is NOT the dog's fault. Please do challenge any handlers you see not doing the 'right thing'.

Fibre broadband by Wessex Internet in Mere has been cancelled until further notice due to lack of funding and the need to prioritise their government-funded BDUK/Project Gigabit projects. There are 80 properties that are in a position to be installed. These are in the western edge of the Town. A communication will be sent to all their registered leads or orders, according to whether they can reach them or not. The future of Wessex Internet in Mere essentially relies on being able to secure funding through BDUK. According to them (BDUK), there is another operator planning to fibre Mere, and so their request to include Mere in their Project Gigabit contract was denied.

Wiltshire's new High Sheriff was sworn in on Friday, 4th April 2025 in a ceremony which dates back to Saxon times. Mr Martin Nye made his Declaration at St Martin's Church, Bremhill, nr Calne, taking over from Dr Olivia Chapple. Around 80 guests attended the ceremony and reception.

Wiltshire Council has successfully prosecuted two farmers following mistreatment of cattle. In January 2024, the farm was visited where twenty-three cattle were found to have no access to water. One cow was seen to be licking from an empty water container for five minutes. There is no water provision at the site and the animals rely on this being brought to the farm in a container. The visiting vet's opinion was that the cattle were being given insufficient amounts of water. Records for the farm showed an overall mortality rate of 31% for cattle. Overall mortality rate in England for all cattle in 2023 was 5.03%.

Fly Tipping: A load of waste including a carpet was dumped in the road at Kilmington. It is worth noting Wiltshire Council is reminding businesses owners of their legal responsibility to dispose of their commercial waste correctly after a Warminster resident was issued with a fixed penalty notice (FPN) for waste offences. There is no suggestion that a business dumped the above, that is to be investigated.

While at The Police and Crime Panel I was informed Wiltshire has 54 "special" officers who are volunteers. They worked 5882 hours this year to March. Specials have the same powers as a PC. I was also informed some shops now have radio communication in some form with the Police. I was also informed the prisons are full again and to my surprise the number of days courts can run are limited and to be reduced.

Penny Fennon gave March rainfall for Salisbury Street as a total of only 1 cm with 0.5cm on both 22nd and 28th March.

Pam Baldock gave the rainfall for Lordsmead in March to 29th, very dry for 22 days from 27th February to 29th March, 2.25mm. The Met Office predicted 30th and 31st would be dry at that date of the 29th March.

Some of our favourites include macaroni cheese, chicken and ham pie, chicken korma and lasagne followed by fruit crumble and custard.



cheesecake, pancakes with strawberries and bananas and banoffee pie. The meals are 'made from scratch' using quality ingredients – we believe there is nothing more important than a high-quality lunch for our young children. It also helps them to concentrate during the afternoon.

Children are expected to sit around a table with their friends and use their very best table manners. Our older children help the younger ones – pouring drinks, cutting up food and clearing away.

Mrs Gulliver talks to the children about what they enjoy and she adjusts her menus accordingly. We have also had a whole school focus on reducing food waste, which has been very successful. Our Governing Body keep a very close eye on ensuring the 'best value for money' and have been delighted with the financial savings from reducing our food waste.

Sometimes we have special meals and snacks – Mrs Gulliver is working on creating an Italian meal for our Italian day shortly. We buy cakes to raise funds for charities - Red Nose Day and Children in Need and we all enjoyed hot chocolate and a cookie on World Book Day.

We are delighted that we are now providing meals twice a week to the Mere and District Day Centre. They are a registered charity whose aim is reduce Ioneliness isolation for elderly people from the locality. The Centre provides a safe and sociable environment for people aged over 60 to meet, enjoy a hot nutritious meal. stimulating activities and entertainments, occasional outing chosen by the guests. Sessions run under the supervision of the



manager, enthusiastically supported by a team of trained volunteers. I understand that the clients are really enjoying the meals!

Mere & District Link Scheme

Community First, which oversees the 43 Link Schemes in Wiltshire, carries out an annual audit of Link Scheme activity. The 2024 details for the Mere and District Link Scheme and all the Link Schemes are shown in the infographics below. These highlight the fantastic work by Link volunteers across Wiltshire and, once again, show that Mere Link Scheme drivers covered many more miles than the overall average of 20,201 with MDLS drivers covering 50,773 - a tremendous effort from all of our drivers.

In March we did 116 trips. As ever, Salisbury District Hospital was the busiest destination with 44 trips. With this number of trips we have estimated that our five volunteer co-ordinators made/received around 400 phone calls during the month. Well done.



If you want to use the Link, once you have an appointment please call 01747 860096 to book a driver. As a charity we do not charge for trips but ask for a donation. Please remember that our co-ordinators work in their own homes – we do not have an office - so please keep calls to 9-5 Monday to Friday and only use the 01747 860096 number. Also, it is a great help if you can give us a minimum of 48 hours notice (not including Saturdays and Sundays). Our co-ordinator has to ring round to find a driver who is available to take you to your appointment and we cannot guarantee our co-ordinator will be at home to arrange last minute requests.

Do you want to volunteer as a Link driver? We are a local charity and we take clients to medical appointments, including Covid vaccinations, and even shopping when resources allow. **New drivers are always welcome.** You choose when you want to drive, use your own car and we pay 45p/mile to cover your costs. Letter from the Churches

A non- driving friend and her husband who had to give up driving recently moved to be near their children. She had been very active organising local knit and natter, walks, games days, singing sessions etc. for the elderly and has been much missed. She wrote saying she missed it all and was trying to find where God wanted her to continue her work for Him.

Three weeks earlier I had received a phone call from a friend, from my previous church who no longer drives, and is getting very forgetful, after a very active and helpful life, who said almost the same thing. When my husband died, I remember saying almost the same to my minister. He advised me to "be patient and wait. You'll know when He thinks you are ready". In my case, a month later, I was invited to an evening 'do' at a small local village for the elderly, complete with its own village hall hospital and village transport. There I was asked to take weekly Art and Craft classes for the residents- which I did for the next 7 years until I moved.

Many of those residents who joined me had been very active helpers, until forced to stop, and felt uncomfortable having to rely on others instead of giving the help. I know the feeling and it seems to be quite common.

Perhaps the best way we can remain 'givers' is by giving others a chance to do for us what we had enjoyed doing for others in the past.

Paul tells us that Jesus said it is more blessed to be a giver than a receiver. But without receivers, to whom do we give? and even when receiving, we can be gracious giving our Thanks, as we do to God who gives us everything. He is a model receiver.

From Times Gone By!

WHEREAS William Coombs, late of the parish of Kingston Deverell, Richard Watts, late of the parish of Longbridge Deverell, Elijah Mardment, lete of the parish of Mere, and Israel Mills, late of the parish of Mere, who were enrolled to serve in the Third Battalion of the Wilts Local Militia ... have neglected to attend training and exercises of the said Battalion, which commenced at Salisbury on Thursday the 10th of May instant, whereby they are deemed Deserters. A reward of twenty shillings for each of the said Deserters is allowed by Act of Parliament.

TWENTY GUINEAS REWARD

ESCAPED from Justice, charged with stealing yarn from the bleaching yard of Mr Thomas Mitchell, of Gillingham, Dorset, JAMES COWLEY of Mere, Wilts, 55 years of age, about 5 feet 8 inches, thin growth, with brown hair, teeth uneven before, crooked nose, his eyes generally on the alert, walks very loosely, and commonly wears a brown great coat; by trade a Tick Weaver, but occasionally works Husbandry. Whoever will apprehend the said James Cowley, and lodge him in any of his Majesty's Gaols, or deliver him to the Constable in Gillingham, shall receive Twenty Guineas Reward, by applying to me, THOMAS MITCHELL. N. B.—if the said James Cowley will discover his accomplice or accomplices, every endeavour will be used to obtain him in a pardon.




