The scheme has been devised to reduce the digital divide by providing community and charitable organisations with a route to access ICT equipment and broadband and to provide a UK wide award scheme open to all community and charitable organisations by offering a sustainable award system which adds value to new and previous applicants.

The scheme supports a diverse range of community and charitable organisations. In the past voluntary projects, silver-surfers, conservation organisations, family support groups, sports teams and youth groups have all been supported.

Almost any organisation, working in any field of community benefit, located anywhere within the United Kingdom or the Republic of Ireland can apply for a laptop and a year's free broadband connection.

MERE WEATHER

During October, we had a total of 83.5mms (3.29ins) of rain. Last year we had 110mms (4.33ins). In fact, we have had less rain each month than last year. Most of the rain was small drops over night. We only had three days with more than 10mms (0.39ins). The weather has been mild with most days having sun in the afternoon.

Up to the 15th November, it has been wet. Very wet! We have had 109.5mms (4.3ins) of rain in the two weeks, as much as the total for August and September with strong winds, particularly on the 14th. It is getting cooler as winter approaches. *Peter Durkee*

A 'WILTSHIRE WOODTURNERS GROUP'?

Have you seen the displays of local craft-work at the 'Made By Hand' exhibition at Mere Museum in the Library? Fantastic! It is on until the end of December and is well worth a visit.

Feedback on my own exhibits there and in generally talking to people over the last year indicate that within our local community there are many others who would like to learn how to turn wood, or have some experience and would just like to get together and further their knowledge and skills. If you haven't tried it and would like to, please contact me and arrangements can be made for you to come and give it go. I can assure you that it is a very pleasant and therapeutic experience.

Before moving to Mere, I was an active member within a wood turner's group with a membership of 80 (plus a waiting list). Ages of the membership ranged from 18 to 80+, male and female, one in a wheel chair, one turned with his single arm and several were partially sighted – so anyone can do it. We owned 10 lathes, met once a week, supported local charities and public functions and had visits from professional turners who would inspire us with their demonstrations on a regular basis. In time, we could have something similar going in our area.

'Big Oaks from little acorns grow'. I am more than happy to co-ordinate and organise a venue etc., for an inaugural meeting/session perhaps in January so if you are over the age of 18 and would like to get together to form such a group then please do let me know. A Sure Start Children's Centre

As always a huge thank you to everyone that supports us, including the families, childminders, volunteers and staff, as it has been such a busy month. That said, we know that there are lots of families that may not know what a Children's Centre is and have not yet been in to any of the sessions that now run in Mere, Maiden Bradley, Zeals and Kilmington.

Mere Footprints Children's Centre is now into the last quarter of its first year and we are here helping and supporting families both directly and indirectly. We have fun sessions, stage special events and workshops, help individuals and families on a one to one basis through our outreach team. We don't pretend that we have all the answers BUT we can promise that we can definitely find them so if you need help with benefits, or are thinking of going back to work (now or in the future), if you have housing queries or questions relating to your children or those that you care for we can ALWAYS help. All our services

and activities are FREE including refreshments for families with children between 0-5, and we are open from Monday – Friday 8.00am to 5.00pm and every other Saturday.

You can just 'drop in' to meet friends or come with the children to play with our toys. You can use the IT suite and internet for FREE and you can always find tea and toast and someone to talk to.

We are also open every other Saturday morning. Last week saw us making lanterns in preparation for the Lantern Parade on the 17th December (please let us know if you want to join in as we are booking transport – we have plenty of lanterns to share).

November saw the first Speech and Language drop in session (run by Pia Grant and her team from Salisbury Hospital) and it was a huge hit. From this we have met some new families who are dropping in with many of the other regulars in the Children's Centre based in the Duchy Manor Building. The next session is 11th January.

New to Mondays are our 'Winter Walks' from 9:30am for about an hour. Pull on your wellies and wrap up warm and join Kate for a walk, toddle or push with your children followed by a mug of hot chocolate and refreshments - the routes will all be easy and the time is guaranteed to fly.

Tuesdays are now officially for 'Late Breakfasts'. Join Kate and Danielle for Free Breakfast and a chat from 9:30 – 11:30 in one of the locations. We also have the Wilshire College advisors in for anyone wanting to start or considering an IT course – Many courses are FREE or funding is available.

Wednesday mornings are 'Messy Mornings'. Come to 'Crafty Kids', a range of themed activities (and refreshments). Our outreach team leads a morning of FUN & MESS finishing with drinks and yummy snacks which are sometimes made during the session. During December we are making decorations and gifts finishing with a Party on 16th December.

Wednesday Evenings from 7.00-9.00pm cookery classes are held in Mere Children's Centre free for parents with children between 0-5.

Thursdays continue with Pilates from 2.00 -3.00pm in the Children's Centre with a free crèche; bookings in advance are usually required. Please bring a mat with you if you have one!

'Kindermusik' sessions continue on Fridays but due to their popularity, and in response to requests, we are going to rotate sessions around the villages within the area. The 9.45am session will continue in Mere followed by one at 11.00am in: Maiden Bradley, Kilmington, Zeals or Semley. Please call us or have a look at our website for details.

If you haven't yet been to try out the Baby and Toddlers massage sessions we strongly advise you to book for the 4th December and 8th January Sessions - these are all FREE.

Help Required - we are looking for more parents and people with time on their hands to get involved with our centre to help us understand what you want and need. Please do

come to our Steering Group sessions or just drop in! Free Refreshments will be available. If you are a childminder, or are looking for one please do come in as we keep a notice board for you to advertise.

There is a lovely story about an unusual accident which is supposed to have taken place on the streets of Liverpool, but it might have happened anywhere....


