MERE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You can raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be **on Monday**, **6th July** at 7.30pm in the Andy Young Pavilion. There is **NO** meeting in August.

The Chairman writes:

As I am writing this it is raining, but what ideal weather we had for the Church Fete, which was well supported by the public and well done to all the stall holders for their hard work. Having viewed the alcohol on the bottle stall, I bought several pounds worth of raffle tickets and luckily enough, I won two prizes – a bottle of lemonade and a bottle of sweet and sour sauce. Guidance from above?!

Our parish clerk is working very hard and trying to complete the accounts to send to the external auditor. The powers that be have moved forward the date by which the Annual Return needs to be approved by the Parish Council. It used to be 30th September and now it is 30th June and so she is up against a tight deadline now. The Annual Return, accounts and related documents will be available for public inspection, however, from 29th June 2009 on reasonable notice on application to the Clerk. Details of the exercise of electors' rights and inspection of the accounts will be displayed on the Parish Council noticeboard, outside the Lecture Hall, by 29th June. The Clerk will also be trying to sort out the water issue for the allotment holders at Wellhead.

Congratulations to George Jeans on being elected as an independent councillor for the Mere area. George, we know that you will work hard to support the residents of Mere and the surrounding villages.

Sadly, we have recently experienced a spate of vandalism in our beautiful town. For example, one mindless act involved someone climbing onto our sports pavilion roof and bending the clock hands on both clocks either side of the pavilion, for their own personal satisfaction. It was the kind people of Mere, whose sponsorship enabled the purchase of these clocks in the first place; and it seems such a pity that a small minority of heartless individuals are intent on

causing damage and expense. I would urge all members of the community to be vigilant and observant and to report any antisocial and suspicious behaviour to the police in the hope that we can stamp out this vandalism.

Here is hoping we have a long hot summer and that the Swimming Pool is full to capacity and all the other sporting facilities are thriving in the sunshine.

GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, WRITES

I would like to thank the readers of "Mere Matters" who took the time and trouble to vote at the Mere Division elections for Wiltshire Council. Democracy is alive and well in the Mere Division. The turnout was 61.41 percent, which was the highest in Wiltshire. I feel very honoured that 1188 people voted for me, giving me a majority over my nearest rival of just over 300 votes.

I sincerely thank all those that helped me, of which there were many, to become one of the first Wiltshire Councillors, and to carry on the tradition of an Independent Councillor as Andy Young and Jack Paul did before me. After visiting about 500 houses and speaking to many people, I have a fair idea of what is wanted locally and I shall strive to achieve these requests.

I have been fortunate to gain a seat on the Southern area Planning Committee. This committee carries out a regularity function for development planning in the old Salisbury District Council area of south Wiltshire. Meetings are usually held in Salisbury. This planning committee will determine the development planning applications that are not delegated and determined by officers, for the Mere Division, which includes Mere, Kilmington, Stourton, West Knoyle and Zeals. I shall also sit on the Audit Committee.

The South Wiltshire Core Strategy, which will have housing delivery as its key driver, is programmed for adoption in April 2010. The Wiltshire Core Strategy, which will be the first step in delivering consistent planning policy across all Wiltshire, including the Mere Division detailed above, should be adopted in August 2011.

I have only been elected for just over a week (Sunday, 14th June as I write), but I have had induction training in Trowbridge, Salisbury and Chippenham. I have met many old

faces and am enjoying being back on a "major council". I am now able to continue working directly with council officers on the electorate's behalf as I did as a District Councillor.

One of my most important roles is communicating, therefore please note that the first meeting of the new South West Wiltshire Area Board meeting, when the public and press are welcome to attend, will be in The Mere Lecture Hall on Tuesday, 14th July at 7.00pm (probably 6.30 for 7.00pm).

REPAIRS TO A303 WILLOUGHBY HEDGE TO MERE

Since the debacle at the end of last year over the inordinate 14 week planned A303 closure, the Highways Agency and its service provider, InterRoute, have spent a significant amount of time reviewing the planned works and has managed to substantially reduce the period required for a full closure to 5 weeks. This reduction was achieved by changing the design and working methods, allowing significant works to be undertaken safely under reduced traffic control, including lane restrictions, traffic signals and night-time closures. However, in addition to the 5 week full closure there will need to be 9 weeks of overnight traffic signals, allowing an alternating flow of traffic in both directions and approximately 5 weeks of overnight closures, during which time traffic will be diverted by other routes.

The work has been broken down into three separate phases to reflect the nature of work and limit disruptions. This will allow the maximum level of activity to be undertaken within the minimum amount of traffic management. Seasonal traffic fluctuations and events affecting the network have also influenced the timing of the works:

- 1. Phase 1: Investigation and drainage repairs (traffic signals, 19.00hrs 06.00hrs); May - July 2009
- 2. Phase 2: Widening preparation, drainage works, signage and safety fencing (traffic signals, 19.00hrs 06.00hrs and night closures 22.00hrs -05.30hrs); Nov Dec 2009
- 3. Phase 3: Drainage channel construction and signage (24 hour single lane closure on three lane section of Chaddenwick Hill); Jan - Feb 2010; and major surfacing and drainage channel works (24 Hour closure for 5 weeks excluding unusual weather risk); Feb - Mar 2010

The Highways Agency and InterRoute have worked closely with, and sought advice from, the Police and three highway authorities, Dorset, Somerset and Wiltshire, in devising the most suitable diversion routes. This considered the needs and concerns of road users, residents and businesses situated along the routes. After reviewing all available options, and taking into account the constraints across various routes, the preferred diversion routes are:

Night time closures:

Light vehicles to use the A350 and B3082 through Gillingham both ways; Heavy good vehicles to use A37/A361/A36 both ways; and High loads to use A359/A371/A361/A36

24 Hour closures:

All eastbound traffic to use the A37/A361/A36 except high loads; High loads to use A359/A371/A361/A36; and All westbound traffic to use A350/B3081 through Gillingham

I am sure you have read the articles in the local press about upgrading the A303 through Somerset, Dorset and Wiltshire to continuous dual carriageway. There is a petition for upgrade on the Prime Minister's "No 10" website. The website address is: http://petitions.number10.gov.uk/Upgrade-A303/ I signed it a couple of months ago, but when I checked on progress in mid June there were only a disappointing 514 signatures. If you believe that the road should be dualled, please sign up. You have a couple of months, but note that it closes to new signatures on the 5th September 2009. Editor

MORRIS DANCING COMES TO MERE

Treacle Eater Clog, a Northwest Tradition, or style, of morris team, based in Yeovil, will be dancing outside of The George Inn, Mere, at 8.50 pm on Monday, 27th July, and will be joined by Sarum Morris, who dance the Cotswold Morris Tradition.

Treacle Eater Clog originated in the old industrial Northwest of England, where it evolved as a processional dance, performed mainly in carnivals. The dancers dressed in brightly coloured clothing, and were accompanied by a large band so that the dancers could hear the music above the din. The Northwest tradition, like other styles of morris, has been taken up by teams throughout the country.

The dances consist of figures and step ups, or choruses. The step ups were used to process along the streets and if at any stage the procession stopped, the Squire, or team captain would call out for a static figure to be danced. When the carnival moved off again he would call out "up street" and the dancers would continue to process. It has been adapted so that it can be danced in static situations.

The team was formed in 1983, and our name derives from Jack the Treacle Eater, a character who sits on top of a folly in Barwick Park' near Yeovil. Legend has it that Jack was a servant at the big house and ran errands, sometimes as far away as London, sustained on treacle. 
