MERE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. The Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You will be permitted to raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be held in the **Andy Young Pavilion at 7.30pm on Monday, 7th September 2009.**

The Chairman writes:

With reference to the recent spate of vandalism outside the Andy Young Pavilion, I would like to thank members of the public for being so observant. I am pleased to report that the police are acting on information received.

Local Development Framework

I am sure that you will not have forgotten the meetings and discussions that we held last year over Salisbury District Council's discussion paper 'Our Place in the Future' and I am sure that you all responded to the paper. The latest document, Wiltshire Council's 'South Wiltshire Core Strategy' has just been produced which sets out the planning policies for the next 20 years and indicates where managed growth will be encouraged. This is the 'Publication Stage' of the South Wiltshire Core Strategy and Wiltshire Council say that they are inviting representations on whether the document is considered to be sound and legally compliant. The consultation period for the Strategy started on 10th August and ends on 30th September 2009. Details of the Strategy will be presented to South West Wiltshire Area Board meeting, which is to be held on Wednesday, 16th September at 7.00 p.m. in Nadder Hall, Tisbury. There will also be a public exhibition in the Lecture Hall, Mere on Tuesday, 8th September. (See page five.)

You may be interested to know that the Strategy is proposing 290 homes for the Mere area up to the year 2026, (270 in Mere itself and 20 homes in the rest of the Mere Community Area). Where exactly this growth will take place will be identified through a subsequent Site Specific Allocations Development Plan Document, we are told.

Copies of the South Wiltshire Core Strategy are available at Mere Library and the Parish Clerk has been given a copy also.

Allotments adjacent to the new cemetery – Your opinion is requested?

As you may be aware, the field purchased by the Parish Council to use as a new cemetery is far larger than we need for the present time. The Parish Council therefore

fenced off a manageable area to use as a new cemetery for the next 50 – 60 years. The remainder of the field has no distinct use until after that time and, owing to the present demand for allotments, it has occurred to the Parish Council that it may please parishioners if we plotted out some allotments on the land. However, it has also occurred to the Parish Council that some people may feel that it is inappropriate to provide allotments adjacent to the cemetery. Before making a decision, the Parish Council agreed to put this notice into Mere Matters to see if there were any strong views from parishioners – please respond to the Parish Clerk – details at end of this report.

My first two months as a Wiltshire Councillor have been enjoyable and interesting. I have travelled the county for training and meetings. Now down to practical matters, I wish people would not leave sheets of glass by the bottle bank in the main Mere car park; it is dangerous for those using the facility, especially after dark.

The first South West Area Board meeting has taken place in Mere; it was well attended and gave me some hope that “the board system” can be made to work. On another topic, housing is one of the main issues for which people contact the council. I have noticed an increase in the numbers contacting me in this regard. To be able to apply for social housing an applicant now has to use the special website: www.homes4wiltshire.co.uk Please note that “Homes4Wiltshire” does not appear on the home page of the Wiltshire Council web site at the present time. I have informed the Council about this omission.

Wiltshire Council has published the proposed submission documents for South Wiltshire's Core Strategy Development Plan Document, part of the Local Development Framework. The Core Strategy sets out a strategy over the next 20 years to 2026 for the Mere Community Area of a planned growth in Mere itself of 270 homes and three hectares of employment land. The rest of the Mere Community Area will have 20 homes developed. Where exactly this growth will take place will be identified through a subsequent Site Specific Allocations Development Plan Document. Proposed submission documents will be available to view at a special exhibition in Mere Lecture Hall on the 8th September 2009 from 12.30pm – 7.00pm. (See page five.)

EXHIBITION IN MERE FOR THE SOUTH WILTSHIRE CORE STRATEGY DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Wiltshire Council has published the proposed submission documents for South Wiltshire's Core Strategy Development Plan Document, part of the Local Development Framework. The Core Strategy sets out a clear strategy for delivery of growth in a managed way over the next 20 years to 2026, which balances meeting local needs with the protection of the environment. The Core Strategy will make strategic site specific allocations.

The Core Strategy covers the whole administrative area of south Wiltshire except for that area where the New Forest National Park is the local planning authority.

The council is inviting representations on proposed submission documents. The period for representations to be made will run from Monday 10th August until 5.00pm on Wednesday 30th September 2009. The proposed submission documents, as well as the Core Strategy include:

- Sustainability Appraisal
- Habitats Regulations Assessment
- Equality Impact Assessment
- Consultation Methodology and Output report

The Proposed Submission documents and supporting documents are available to view online at: www.wiltshire.gov.uk They are also available for inspection, free of charge, in Mere Library, Barton lane, Mere (Mondays 10.00am – 7.00pm, Tuesdays-Fridays 9.00am – 5.00pm or Saturdays 9.00am – 1.00pm)

Proposed submission documents will also be available to view at an exhibition in the Lecture Hall, Mere on Tuesday 8th September from 12.30pm until 7.00pm. Officers will be available there to answer any queries.

The proposed submission documents have been published in order for representations to be made prior to submission of the Development Plan Document (DPD) to the Secretary of State. Representations received during the period will be considered alongside the submitted DPD, which will be examined by an independent Planning Inspector. The purpose of the examination is to consider whether the Core Strategy complies with the legal requirements and is 'sound' against the tests of soundness as detailed on the representations form. Representation forms are available to download on the council's website (www.wiltshire.gov.uk) or from the Spatial Planning team using the contact details below or by calling ☎ 01722 434 390. Representations should be submitted in writing on the official representation form to: Spatial Planning South, Wiltshire Council, 61 Wyndham Road, Salisbury, SP1 3AH. Alternatively, they can be emailed to: james.sutton@wiltshire.gov.uk or faxed to 01 722 434 247.

Following the representation period, the Council will consider any comments received to ensure that no fundamental issues have been raised on the soundness of the Plan before submitting the document to the Secretary of State for independent examination by a Government appointed Inspector. It is the role of the Inspector to consider any representations received and to propose changes to the document in light of these rather than the Council.

MERE WEATHER

August last year we had 124mms (4.88ins) of rain. This August, up to the 16th we had 56.5mms (2.22ins) with a small bit of thunder on the 3rd, followed by 27mms (1.06ins) of rain on the 4th. There have been more sunny days so far this month with rain at night.

Swine Flu Vaccinations

At the time of writing, we have not been given confirmed guidance from the Department of Health on the immunisation programme for Swine Flu, although we believe the vaccinations will be given at the surgery when they become available.

Current information is that the vaccine will become available over the next couple of months and that it will be sent to surgeries in batches. It will be important for everyone that we stick to the Department of Health guidance on vaccinating the 'most at risk' patients first.

If we have to implement a vaccination programme for all patients we will have to provide limited medical cover for urgent patient cases only so that the remainder of our medical staff are available to give the vaccinations.

If this situation arises, we may have to cancel all routine, non urgent appointments for a few days while the vaccination programme is carried out.

Full details of when we expect to receive the vaccine together with details of which patients will have priority to be vaccinated will be shown on posters, which we will display at the Surgery, Mere Post Office and the Pharmacy.

If you fall within one of the 'at risk' categories, we anticipate using an open surgery system for vaccinations. You will not need to phone the surgery for an appointment, patients will be vaccinated in the order that they arrive at the surgery.

We would like to thank everyone for their patience whilst the vaccination programme is carried out.

WILTSHIRE'S ORCHARDS: USE THEM OR LOSE THEM!

Orchards are hotspots for wildlife and are composed of a network of habitats. They provide an abundance of food sources and support a number of UK Biodiversity Action Plan species that are rare, protected or scarce such as the Noble Chafer beetle. And, their products can also be enjoyed by you, the people of Wiltshire.

Since the last world war, Wiltshire, along with its neighbouring counties, has lost many of its traditional orchards. This has primarily been caused by changes in land use, development and agricultural intensification. English Nature's research report on

traditional orchards in England revealed that since the 1950s the area covered by orchards has declined by 57% (Lush et al 2005). As a result, traditional orchards have recently been added to the UK Biodiversity Action Plan as a priority habitat and an inventory has been undertaken by the Peoples Trust for Endangered Species (PTES), with the aim of conserving this distinctive habitat.

Wiltshire Traditional Orchards Project (WTOP) has been set up by a group of volunteers working in partnership with the PTES. WTOP aim to halt further loss of orchards across the county and prevent further neglect to this valuable habitat.

Very little is known about Wiltshire's orchards and WTOP are having to start from scratch to find out exactly what still exists. As Wiltshire is a large rural county the project needs your help. We are looking for:

- volunteers to become orchard surveyors – people who are happy to go out to a pre-defined site and undertake a survey of the condition of the orchard.
- orchard owners – if you have 5 or more fruit trees on your land, whether these be for personal or commercial use, we would love to hear from you.

MERE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

VISIT FOUR: Wednesday 9th September 2009

Iminster Town Walk

This trip gives us a chance to appreciate the history of the attractive Somerset country town of Iminster, which takes its name from the Minster founded by the river Ile by the Saxon King Ina (689 – 728 AD)

We will leave Salisbury Street Car Park at 12 noon and return to Mere by 5.30pm approx.

FR BEDE, THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH MINISTER, WRITES:

The Late Fr Bede Rowe

As anyone who knows me will readily tell you, I am not the most punctual of people. It is ironic really, as I have clocks all around the presbytery which mysteriously tell the exact time by the use of radio waves. I have no idea how they work, and my life is far too short to find out. Suffice it to say that I know when I am late, to the exact second. In theory, it should help me be on time, but so far... well no.

Warminster Community Radio broadcasts live during the summer, and I had agreed to do the 'God-slot' for a week. It began at 10.22am. Well... in theory that is when it began. On the first morning the young chap telephoned me to check that I knew that I had agreed to do it. The conversation went like this.

Young chap: "Fr Bede, do you remember that you're doing the 'Thought for the Day' this week?"

Fr Bede: *(desperately trying to remember what it was that he had said he was doing)* "Yes, it begins today doesn't it? What time do you want me?"

Young chap: "Three minutes time."

Fr Bede *silence* "Hmmm, three minutes you say? I'll be there in four."

And so I was, with a 'Thought for the Day' which owed more to desperation than planning. I thought it was rather good.

A few days before one of my parishioners had died at the age of 81. She had felt fine but was getting tired easily so went to see the doctor. She was dead within the month. A fine, faith-filled death. She had the chance to say her goodbyes and prepare her soul. But who would have thought that it would have been quite so sudden, from being full of life, to passing from it.

That was what my 'Thought for the Day' was about. You do not know what is round the corner. It may be a telephone call from a young chap telling you that you should be on the radio, or it could be news from the Doctor.

Now is the moment that you are alive.

Now is the moment to do something extraordinary for God.

Tomorrow is all well and good if you wake up to see it. It is not of much use if you wake to see the eternal judgement seat of Almighty God, and you had intended to do so many good things, but never got round to them!

Live for today! (*... and don't complain too much if I'm late*)
