There is no meeting in August.

The Chairman writes:

Planning applications and financial matters seemed to be at the fore of the Parish Council's June meeting and I am happy to say that planning was dealt with in good order. At this time of year financial matters take up rather more time and consideration as we go from one financial year to the next and there are many required checks and balances, audits and reconciliations to be undertaken. However, thanks to the hard work, efficiency and expertise of Lindsey Wood, our Parish Clerk, these requirements have been satisfied and happily the books balance.

Many people, particularly newcomers to Mere, express astonishment at the number of events of one sort or another that take place in Mere, and it is indeed a wonderful thing, when you see how many spring sales, spring bazaars and plant sales took place during May that so many people do so much for the various charities and organisations within our community. Long may it continue!

I joined in with all the activity at the Church Fête at the beginning of June and have to confess to a slight feeling of disappointment that I was unable to emulate the winning touch of my predecessor on the bottle stall! However, I made various very useful purchases and thoroughly enjoyed the event, as did many others, judging by the crowd.

GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, MERE DIVISION, WRITES

Car parking for those of you who drive to Salisbury, and park in the main car park of Wiltshire Council is still controversial. You have to pay for two hours minimum, unless you can find 'on street' meters, although they are often taken. I have noticed a decline in the number of people in Fisherton Street, which is an indication of our economy and I have noticed of late that Salisbury car parks have many empty places. Some of the small traders that give character to the area tell me that Wiltshire Council will do nothing

to help them in these difficult times. Furthermore, all the Superstores on the edge of the City have their own free parking.

I attend the Parish Council of Mere and those of the surrounding villages of Mere when other meetings do not clash. Often individuals of my Mere Division phone me about housing or housing problems, roads, noise, footpaths etc. You can contact me on 01747 860215 and I can give you a mobile number when required. As expected, I am getting many calls for grass and vegetation removal at the present time.

Should you need planning advice from Wiltshire Council, it is currently asking for a fee of at least £30. However, the following list outlining topics for which advice can be obtained free of charge from Wiltshire Council may interest some of you:

- Advice relating to protected trees (covered by a Tree Preservation Order or within a Conservation Area) and high hedges.
- Advice to third parties affected by development proposals.
- Advice to parish, city, town councils and area boards relating to development they will commission/undertake.
- Advice relating to development specifically for the benefit/use of disabled persons. (A disabled person is one to whom Section 29 of the National Assistance Act 1948 applies or a child who is disabled for the purposes of part III of the Children Act 1989. A medical practitioner's certificate may be required in some cases.)
- Applications required following the removal of permitted development rights by planning condition or Article 4 Direction.
- Advice on playing fields/recreational facilities for their own use sought by a non-profit making club, society or other organisations, whose objectives are to provide facilities for sport and recreation.

An enquiry made for a revised proposal within 3 months of the date of the response to the initial enquiry will be free of charge provided that:

- The enquiry is made by the same person as the previous enquiry.
- The enquiry relates to the same site or part of the same site as the previous enquiry.
- The development is of the same character or description as the development to which the earlier enquiry related.

At present many small voluntary groups will need to pay, for the little Wiltshire Council will lose, I hope it will allow these small 'not for profit 'voluntary groups an exception.

It is unfortunate that largely due to the economy, Wiltshire Council has again had to renegotiate, and agree, to allow the low cost houses at Old Hollow to be sold for occupation by anyone at the market price. The plus point is about 40% of the capital raised will go back to social housing for those in South Wiltshire. (Until I questioned this

however, it was going to be Wiltshire Wide). Also one house was sold on this site to someone qualifying as local.

On the 13th June 'The Wiltshire Core Strategy' went out to consultation. If you are interested in the future of our area please get involved. Apparently there was a shortage of paper copies. However, Mere Library certainly has one.

Our summer should now be here, have a great July and August.

WEATHER REPORT

The total rainfall for May was 41.5mms (1.59ins). Last year it was 35mms (1.38ins). I recorded the second week as cold, but generally the weather was sunny with wind.

Flaming June? The first three days were fine, including the Saturday of the church fête, then some one up there turned the tap on to quench the flames! Up to the 18th, we had 82.5mms (3.25ins) with thunder on the 4th. Nice steady drops of rain, just right for the garden!

Brunel's SS 'Great Britain'

Designed by Isambard Kingdom Brunel, the SS 'Great Britain' was the world's first great ocean liner and is now the centrepiece of a major attraction in a dry dock in Bristol. At the end of a long and varied career, she was abandoned in the Falklands in 1937, but subsequently brought home to the dry dock in Bristol where she had been built, and has since been restored and conserved.

We will have a guided tour of the 'Great Britain', after which there will be time to look further at the ship, to lunch in the café or to explore the area, including the ferry over the floating harbour and perhaps to visit the 'Matthew' the replica of Cabot's ship.

We will leave Salisbury Street Car Park at 10.00am and return by 5.00pm.

JANE HURD, LICENSED LAY MINISTER AT ST MICHAELS, WRITES:

This is the first time I have been invited to contribute to Mere Matters so I thought I had better introduce myself to begin with. I am a Licensed Lay Minister for Mere. I am not ordained, so I don't wear a dog collar and I'm not called 'Reverend' but I was Licensed as a Lay Minister by the Bishop of Salisbury in 2007. No doubt many of you know me as I have lived in Mere for 32 years.

As human beings, we all have different gifts to offer and it can sometimes seem that God calls the most apparently unlikely people into his service. It's not necessary to be a church minister to do God's work for we are all able to love and care for one another.

Indeed, the community in Mere is a very good example of that loving and caring, with so many clubs, societies and organisations – something for everyone.

Friends who came to stay with me recently commented on what an extraordinarily friendly place Mere was, with cheerful service in our shops and even total strangers wishing them 'good morning'. Perhaps this is something that we who have the privilege of living here too often take for granted.

Even going to church has become a different experience to what it was when I first moved here and didn't know anyone. It seems difficult to believe today that I was asked not to attend with my children because they were too disruptive, sitting at the back playing quietly with their cars. Today we are a community with our doors wide open to anyone and everyone: children are welcome and there is a children's corner for them to play in; the elderly and not so able-bodied are given every assistance to be able to attend. Coffee is offered in the Friends' Corner after the service, a great way to meet people.

The church is part of the wider community and the wider community is part of the church. It is not a 'them and us' situation. To take just one example, were you at the Fête on 4th June? It is St. Michael's Church Fete in theory, but in practice it is Mere's Fête, a happy event for everyone in Mere, supported by those who call themselves Christians and those who don't. This is surely 'community' at its best.

'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me' said Jesus (Matthew 25: 40) and we are all members of God's family, whether we go to church or not. I pray that Mere will continue to grow as a friendly, loving community where strangers nod 'hello' and neighbours look out for one another. That is something we are all called upon to do.
