MERE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. The Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You will be permitted to raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be held in the **Andy Young Pavilion at 7.30pm on Monday, 7th March 2011**.

The Chairman writes:

The Parish Council is feeling rather angry at the way we, and the people of Mere, have been treated over Wiltshire Council's library review.

Firstly, at our November 2010 Parish Council meeting, we had a presentation from Mr. Wayne Smith, Wiltshire Council's Customer Services Manager to talk about service provision in Mere for Tourist Information & Customer Services because the Parish Council learned, by accident, that our Tourist Information service at the library had discontinued and that Wiltshire Council had agreed a phased reduction in customer service staffing from 5½ days a week to 2 days a week. Mr. Smith informed us that Wiltshire Council was conducting a library review but said, and I quote 'I do not think there are any plans to reduce Mere's library service at the moment. There are some libraries in the county that are not used as much as Mere library and they may be more vulnerable.'

On Tuesday, 18th January our Clerk and Wiltshire Councillor, George Jeans, attended a meeting at Salisbury City Hall, hosted by Wiltshire Council to discuss budget cuts. The threat of any library cuts was not mentioned yet on Thursday, 20th January, only 2 days later, we found out, through the local newspapers, that our library opening hours would be cut from 45 to just 14 hours per week. Cllr. Jeans and residents from Mere attended a meeting in Devizes on Tuesday, 25th January where the situation was, we were told, re-evaluated and Mere library would now be open 31 hours a week. This news was warmly welcomed by residents and staff, only a week later to be told, via an email to a third party, that the 31 hours would consist of 17 hours of library staffing and 14 hours of customer service staffing with the warning that this is likely to be reduced in the longer term. The Parish Council has not received any direct communication about any of these decisions.

Back in 2002 Mere lost its dedicated town centre Tourist Information office and although the sale of the property was made by Salisbury District Council, we were assured by SDC and Wiltshire County Council that the move was justified because all the partnership services would be provided in the Mere Library under one roof and it would become a general Information Centre and One Stop Shop with extended opening hours. Now, it would appear, we are to be left with a very basic service, and unless volunteers

can be found, it is likely to get reduced again and again. At the South West Wiltshire Area Board meeting last week, we were told by Wiltshire Council officers that the library review was still in the proposal stage and that no 'final decision' has yet been made and that they are willing to listen to our suggestions – we therefore urge you all to send in your suggestions to Wiltshire Council.

Wiltshire Council is also conducting a Street Trading Scheme consultation – they are proposing a county wide street trading policy that, we think, will result in excessive regulation that will hinder, obstruct and deter the fund-raising activities and community vitality in rural towns and villages such as Mere. I would therefore urge you, especially all the organizations that carry out fundraising activities, to make some kind of response to Wiltshire Council.

Lastly, at the South West Wiltshire Area Board meeting I became aware that retained firefighters are needed to provide cover in Mere or there is a danger that our fire engine will be 'off the run' and unable to respond to local emergencies. This is a great second career opportunity. Retained firefighters are paid volunteers who carry an alerter and are 'on call' to respond to emergencies for an agreed number of hours every week. They are trained to deal with everything from extinguishing burning buildings to providing first aid. Potential recruits need to be aged 18 or over, and able to pass the various recruitment and selection tests. They should either live or work within five minutes of the fire station and be 'on call' during the day, Monday to Friday in particular. In return, there is a good salary and the opportunity to learn a range of new skills, many of which will be of benefit to an employer — such as first aid and manual handling. GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, MERE DIVISION, WRITES

Our Mere car parks hopefully will now stay free to the user in Mere. I note those of you who have cause to visit Salisbury centre and park by car, have quite a variance in tariffs to face. For instance Culver Street Multi Storey would cost you £4.20 for over 5 hours, whereas The Old George Mall Multi Storey would cost you £7.00 all day and £30.00 overnight. You can park in a secure car park on Bournemouth sea front for half of that.

The proposed shortening of the hours at the Mere Libraries came as a shock to many of us. I have spent hours with officers trying to get the hours up from the 14 which was

proposed. Now we are being told 17 hours for Library staff and 14 hours for customer services making 31 hours. We have 45 hours at present including Saturday mornings. The customer services hours in my opinion will not be sustainable just for Mere, if they do not serve the whole of Wiltshire, as one of 80 customer services operatives would do from Bradley Road at Trowbridge. The Wiltshire Council are firm they have no money to pay Library staff for longer hours. Should the hours in future drop to 17, I cannot see the Wiltshire Council paying the non-domestic rate, heating etc. long term, as they have now refused to do for our local car parks. I think it is most important to keep the building open, even if we have to have self service issue of the books for hours above the offered 17. Volunteers may do this, however I would feel more comfortable if I can get other officers from the many home works, or a fully functioning Wiltshire wide customer services operative to be present, then any volunteers have professional company and the continuity of volunteers' shift time would not be so important. One officer, Richard Munro, has already volunteered to spend 4 extra hours at Mere Library, and I hope he will be allowed to do so.

The South West Area Board was presented with a complaint regarding a Wiltshire Housing Survey. For every complaint received there are many more who have not the time or cannot be bothered to complain. I am investigating how a form of such length and complexity got approved for circulation. I understand that it cost £20K to £40K for the exercise; to the majority of everyday individuals, the cost with the cuts we are seeing cannot be justified. This survey I believe was sent at random to about one dwelling in ten. If you wish to complain try alistair.cunningham@wiltshire.gov.uk

I have helped Mere, Kilmington and West Knoyle Parish Councils to apply for a community grant to help provide a community public access defibrillator (PAD). Stourton and Gasper already have theirs and Zeals are in the process. The PAD is available to the public 24 hours a day and no specialist training is required, so any member of the public can use the PAD. As soon as a 999 call is made the emergency services are aware of the location of the defibrillator and will issue the key code to release the unit. At this point the Air Ambulance is also despatched. When the unit is swiched on full instructions are given as to the use of the unit (it talks you through each step of the procedure). Using the unit can increase survival rate by 60% to 80%, thus benefitting the local community and any visitors.

A new contract will be coming into effect for The Children's Centre in Mere from April 1st, 2011, therefore Mere will still be covered for Children's Centre Services, despite the government cuts.

Finally I am trying to find historical information regarding inhabitants of the Convent near Alfred's Tower, during living memory. This information will update a web site about

Metal detector enthusiast, Dave Crisp, last year uncovered a hoard of Roman coins buried in a field near Frome. The discovery of over 52,000 bronze and silver coins, dating from the 3rd century AD, is the largest single hoard of Roman coins ever found in Britain. Although it only measured 18in across, the coins were packed inside and would have weighed an estimated 350lb.

THE REV'D CHRIS MOORSOM WRITES:

Hard times – growing times.

Spring is a tough time for birds – as I look out of my study window onto the garden, I see the competition for food and mates getting more frenetic each day. Food is scarcer, and the requirement to show off their best plumage and displays takes up more energy. Spring songs ring out from trees and the males strut and fight to win the best mates. As I watch a crow dive-bombing a large buzzard repeatedly, I reflect that it also makes sacrificial heroes out of some and that the instinct to protect the weakest of one's own species (i.e. the offspring) is very strong.

Lent (= the Spring season) is likewise a tough time for some. Given that many are already struggling with the economic challenges of a recession, you might well say, 'Who needs a season of restraint and self-denial?' Yet all world religions recognize the importance of having times of restraint and reflection, training and testing in spiritual disciplines, so that their followers can grow fitter.

For Christians, learning to follow our Master and teacher, Lent is given to help us grow in Christ-like qualities, rather than competing to be the 'top cat' in spiritual endeavours. Our training in Christ's way should lead us to give more of ourselves for the sake of others, enabling them to flourish in body mind and spirit. To take up a personal spiritual discipline in Lent may well be right and good for us, but we're called even more to support and encourage others in finding food for body and spirit. Hence, Lent meetings, lunches, services etc. and similar shared activities enable Christ's people to grow as a community of faith, and to bring good news to a needy world.

Jesus put this starkly to make his point clear: 'If anyone wants to become a follower of mine, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will save it. (Luke 9.23,24)

Hard times, whether chosen or not, can with God's grace become the saving of us!
