

LETTER FROM MR ANDREW HOLDER

Further to the report from Mere Parish Council in the April edition of Mere Matters, it was "regrettable" that I was singled out for attention over the Long Hill issue.

The website: www.savelonghill.org was set up purely as a conduit for the feelings of anger and frustration of many people encountered during daily walks on Long Hill.

It has never been a personal campaign, but a joining of people who feel helpless in the face of decisions made about their environment.

There is now an organisation, Friends of Long Hill, who are attempting to gain clarity and transparency of the Parish Council's plan for this area. There has, so far, been a big response from people who wish to know more about the proposals.

To date, we have not seen a definitive plan of which trees will be felled, but it certainly appears to be the majority. We have also not had any indication that the Parish Council is prepared to listen to the concerns of residents and change their actions accordingly.

GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, MERE DIVISION. WRITES

The Royal Wedding will soon be here. I have ensured that there is a nice new Union Jack on Castle Hill for the occasion. Mr. Collard of Mere has kindly paid for a spare Union Jack. I know some Churches locally are putting on some functions on the day of The Royal Wedding.

After the Licensing committee on which I sit met on the 5th April, it is now unlikely that Street Trading Licenses for Church Fetes, Carnivals, Functions on Parish Council Land etc., will now be needed. I will be monitoring this issue.

The Countess of Wessex officially opened Wiltshire County's Bourne Hill offices, in Salisbury, on the 30th March, and signed the visitors book "Sophie".

It is hoped the Wiltshire Council will transfer some assets to Mere Parish Council: the Mere Croquet Club and the Old Band Hut in Castle Street car park at Mere.

Some services are now being moved outside Wiltshire Council. However its expertise is being kept in house, i.e. architects, solicitors etc., thereby ensuring these services will still be efficiently monitored and controlled.

"Localism" will not be parochial as I understand it. Should a local community want to develop a community building that may not otherwise be allowed, that community should find it easier to develop such a building under "localism". Conversely, should a community wish to prevent a development, no additional weight will be added by localism, to that which already exists.

In the new financial year, there is about £3.7 million extra forthcoming from government for pot holes etc, but it will not be until September that we will know how the money can be spent. However, the Government is now imposing a carbon tax on Wiltshire Council of £600,000, which is ten times more than expected.

Footpath queries can take forever. One local footpath, known in Mere as "16", has been the subject of argument for 10 years or so. In recent months it has now been decided that the path is to stay exactly as it is at present. Footpath "16" starts close to Old Hollow. Mere.

BIG SOCIETY, "LOCALISM" AND WHAT IT MEANS FOR SOUTH WEST WILTSHIRE

The South West Wiltshire Area Board will be hosting a seminar about important issues now facing South West Wiltshire. The event will take place in Dinton Village Hall on Thursday, 12th May starting at 5.00pm.

The seminar will cover the implications of the Government's 'Big Society' proposals (as set out in the Localism Bill now before Parliament) and what this is likely to mean in South West Wiltshire. We will look at how Wiltshire Council plans to develop its own local arrangements through the Area Boards, with new ways of involving people in decisions about services. We will also look at how the Government is proposing to change the current planning system to give local people more of a say over the future development of the places where they live. We have lined up some excellent speakers and there will be plenty of opportunity to ask questions and put forward your own points of view. This promises to be a very lively and stimulating evening, so do please join us — it is a genuine chance for you influence things in South West Wiltshire.

Toenail Clipping Service in Lynch Close

Age UK Salisbury District (previously Age Concern) offer a number of services, one of which is a toenail cutting service for older people who do not meet the criteria for NHS Chiropody. The plan is to hold sessions on a Monday every six weeks at the Community Rooms, Lynch Close, Mere. The fees are a one-off charge of £13.50 for the toenail clipping pack, then a charge of £9 for each follow-up session. Age UK however are unable to offer the service to people who have Diabetes, Rheumatoid Arthritis, lack of sensation in the feet, poor circulation, or if you are taking Warfarin or steroids. FR BEDE, CATHOLIC PRIEST OF ST MARY'S IN MERE, WRITES

I recently had a disturbing experience with a rabbit. It was the soulless eyes and the strange rubberised feet that eventually did it. Had I been a child then, when I would have grown up I would have sued the Easter Bunny for traumatising me. Those eyes... those feet...

Really I have no problems about celebrating Easter in the most bizarre ways. I am a paid up devotee of the High School Musical Luxury Easter Egg Experience (available at your local super market for several thousand pounds) or the chocolate novelties which look suspiciously like Santa Clause Christmas Tree decorations with bunny ears printed on the paper. I even cooed over a child's Easter Card that was a beautifully drawn egg with a rabbit inside. Think about that for a moment... what freakish generically modified nonsense ends up with rabbits being born from eggs... Yikes!

I love it all.

But we just have to be careful about one thing. We can use anything to celebrate the resurrection of Christ from the dead, the miracle of Easter (eggs and bunnies and anything else at all), but we cannot allow the feast to be usurped by something else. This is not a celebration of spring, or the turning of the year, or anything else. This is not the feast of the Easter Bunny, with or without soulless eyes and rubberised feet.

You want soulless eyes and rubberised feet? Let me serve it to you à la Herod's Head!

But Easter gives us more... much more.
