MERE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. The Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You will be permitted to raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be held in the Andy Young Pavilion at 7.30pm on **Monday, 2nd April 2012**.

The Chairman writes:

Our March Parish Council meeting was attended by Fiona Bowles from Wessex Water who outlined their initiatives for Mere water resources. The Parish Council will facilitate an effective partnership with residents of Mere and Wessex Water to monitor water consumption and promote water efficiency in order to run a trial reduction in water abstraction. This was welcomed by all those in attendance.

The Parish Council was also informed at this meeting that our local Police will be instigating a drive to encourage safer parking in Mere as there has been an increasing incidence of inappropriate parking, particularly too close to road junctions as well as to the zebra crossings, which can be hazardous and may be illegal. You have been warned!

The Annual Parish Meeting will take place on Wednesday 25th April in the Grove Buildings at 7.30pm with refreshments available from 7.00pm. This is a public meeting convened by the Parish Council when parishioners have the opportunity to come along and discuss concerns and hear reports from the various organisations in the Town.

A great many events and activities take place in Mere and many of these are advertised through posters pinned up around the Town. The Parish Council would like to encourage those who place these posters to please remove them once the events have taken place. The faded and slightly mangled remains of posters well past their dates do nothing to enhance the beauty of our Town!

GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, MERE DIVISION, WRITES

The centre of Mere has been improved with the arrival of Walton Antiques and I wish them every success. The business would welcome you to come and browse, you do not need purchase, just pass the word that they are here. I understand The Old Ship Hotel is reopening shortly, already a community Lunch has taken place which I attended. Mere Parish Council Chairman, Mary White, was in attendance and she read some passages from "A Confection of Poetry & Prose". Mary, with Adrienne Howell and others form Pennybank Writers made, I believe, a major contribution to literature with this publication (ISBN number 9780957002715), should you wish to read it.

You can now download books electronically from Wiltshire Library. To do so, you will need go into the Library and get a pin number to go with your Library card. However there are many, like me, who still like a printed book.

Boar Street, Pettridge Lane and Shaftesbury Road (The Causeway) will be resurfaced as far as the 30 mph speed limit signs, in May, weather etc. permitting. These roads will be closed for repairs, except for access, from 9.30am to 3.30pm from Tuesday the 8th of May for three days. Again on Tuesday the 22nd, they will be closed for micro asphalting, which will form the finished surface. This Shaftesbury Road closure will affect some people from Zeals, Kilmington and Stourton as they use it as a route to Shaftesbury avoiding Gillingham. Often, I note that more traffic is now using Pettridge Lane than Salisbury Street!

Further along Shaftesbury Road, I hope funds will be available in a year or so to resurface with tar and chip. In the meantime the potholes, etc. will have to continue to be patched. A potentially dangerous round man-hole along Shaftesbury Road, Mere (that has been so for a year or more), was the cause of a defect notice being served on Wessex Water, and after I involved the appropriate Wiltshire Council Cabinet member, it has now been replaced.

Southbrook will be closed for two days from Friday the 11th of May, weather permitting, etc. This will be to improve the hill, albeit only temporarily, the area being the second wettest ground in Europe I am told, (it is on soft clay). The road can move up to 150mm (6 inches) in a year, thus, as I understand it, without major funding it cannot be repaired permanently. Obviously, it probably never will be repaired up to a high standard, however I inspect it every 6 or 12 months and ask the officers to repair the worst of it. This year should see a much better than average repair. The contractors will put letters through residents' front doors before work starts and emergency telephone numbers will be displayed. A gate will be operated to stop a rat run through Limpers Hill.

A grant of £20,000 is being sought from the Area Board towards a skate park in Mere for use of the Mere Area, which includes West Knoyle, Kilmington, Zeals, Stourton and

further villages around Mere. Grants have also been requested from the Area Board for celebrations for The Royal Jubilee from Mere and most of the surrounding villages, all being well Monday, 4th June, 2012 will be well remembered in our area, one reason being a large firework display and official beacon. Many thanks to Bill Deeker for agreeing to put this together.

A joint strategic assessment for community planning is being formed for Mere, Tisbury and Wilton. Should you have any concerns, please let me know. One I have raised already is that Mere will not be generally allowed to construct one-bedroom social or market price dwellings, according to the proposed Wiltshire Structure Plan.

In February 2011, Wiltshire Council stated that it expect a £13.3 million decrease in government funding. The actual decrease is only £3.2 million, so Wiltshire Council is £10.1 million better off than originally forecast. This resulted from new government grants, a one-off £5.5 million council tax freeze grant, and as more homes have been built by Wiltshire Council, a £2.9 million 'new homes bonus' was received, plus the additional council tax and the council tax collection rate is high, despite the current economic climate.

Superfast Broadband should be arriving in Wiltshire and hopefully be here by 2015, please contact me for further information.

I have informed Forward Planning that West Knoyle does exist as a Parish, in the core strategy it is greyed out. However all other parishes around are easily identified.

Leaping Frogs Nursery have asked Zeals Parish Council if they can take over the old picnic site at Zeals, which has been well received by Zeals Parish Council.

Lastly, the definition of The Town of Mere in planning terms! It is now known as a 'Local Service Centre.'

NEW WASTE COLLECTION ARRANGEMENTS

Fortnightly household and garden waste collections start

Residents in south Wiltshire now have a fortnightly, non-charged, garden waste service and their household waste collected fortnightly. This brings collections of household waste in the south in line with those in the rest of the county where fortnightly collections are already in place. A new free garden waste collection service has been introduced for those households that have requested it.

These changes should enable Wiltshire Council to increase recycling to 50 percent and reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill to less than 25 per cent by 2014. Wiltshire currently sends 37 per cent of the waste it collects to landfill and recycles 41 per cent of household waste. Linda Conley, portfolio holder for waste said "Residents in East and West Wiltshire have had a fortnightly collection of household waste for many years now

and from data collected across Wiltshire we know that by moving to a fortnightly collection of waste, residents will recycle more".

"We need to recycle more and landfill less because the amount we pay in Landfill Tax will be rapidly increasing from £56 per tonne to £80 per tonne by 2014. Last year Wiltshire Council spent £3.9 million on Landfill Tax. The introduction of fortnightly collection and the new free garden waste collection, means that residents across Wiltshire will receive the same level of service".

New garden waste bins have been delivered to those people who signed up before Christmas for this new service. Residents in the South, who already had a garden waste bin and previously paid for collections, will now receive this service free of charge but they need to check their new collection calendar as their collection day or week may change.

People can still register for the new garden waste service and receive a garden waste bin this summer. Anyone wishing to sign up for a new garden waste bin to be delivered in the summer can do so online at: **www.wiltshire.gov.uk** or by contacting the council 3000 456 0102.

An information pack containing a leaflet explaining the new waste and recycling service and a collection calendar setting out on which date each bin will be emptied has been sent to every household. You will need to have log in details and a password issued from the surgery but this system will allow you to order repeat medication and make appointments at times convenient for you.

Repeat prescription slip

Tick the items that you require on your repeat prescription re-order slip and place it in the box in the front foyer of the surgery. Repeat slips can be put through the letter box if the surgery is closed.

THE MERE AND DISTRICT CHAMBER OF TRADE

At its Committee Meeting on 14th March, Mere Chamber of Trade appointed Hamish Bell as interim Chair until the AGM in November. Hamish is a Chartered Engineer and operates a management and engineering consultancy based in Mere, dealing mainly with small and medium sized companies in the south of England.

Speaking later, Hamish paid tribute to the local Secretary, Julie Cousins, and said "Great advances have been made during the last year in re-building the local organisation, largely due to Julie's efforts. Consolidation of this to ensure that local business needs are recognised and represented is the priority for the remainder of this year. To this end, Mere Chamber of Trade expects to play a greater part in the Wessex Association of Chambers of Commerce and will also ensure that local business needs are represented to the new Wiltshire Local Enterprise Partnership, with the support of Mere Parish Council."

The Chamber is particularly interested in enhancing the opportunities for new businesses to locate to the area. It will support the provision of higher broadband speeds and arrange business training and advice, through local schemes, to existing businesses. St Michael's Churchwardens Tim Merrell and Jean Knapp have welcomed the news of Mr Taylor's visit, saying how much the parish appreciates having a senior clergyman to help during the difficult time of the unexpected vacancy of the parish priest.

Mr Taylor says, "It's a great privilege to be sharing Holy Week with Mere, and I greatly look forward to meeting everyone in April".

He will be preaching on Maundy Thursday and on Good Friday, and will be present at the children's Stations of the Cross and Walk of Witness to the top of Castle Hill, and will lead the service of the Last Hour in the afternoon. He will also be getting up very early on Easter morning to drive from Dorchester to preside at the 6.30am Vigil and Dawn Service of Light at Barrow Street Barn. Unfortunately he cannot be at St Michael's for the main morning Easter Day service, because of a previous commitment near Sherborne.

THE REV'D HELEN CAINE, METHODIST MINISTER, WRITES

"A picture paints a thousand words", they say. So I wasn't surprised that the Lent Course, featuring paintings, some overtly religious, some not, and leading into thoughtful discussion, is proving helpful.

I have a large collection of images clipped from various publications over the years. I recently took some pictures of Jesus on the Cross, to a family service that I was leading. Knowing there might be young children, I had deliberately removed the most distressing pictures. Everyone looked at the pictures and chose one. Some people then had the opportunity to talk about their choice, which I found quite moving.

One young boy chose a sketch of Jesus with some marks of blood on his head and shoulders, and just the suggestion of the rest of his figure. "It's a wonder he survived!" said the child. By the expression on his face he was sensing something of Jesus's suffering.

Of course, Jesus didn't survive the ordeal of a deliberate, slow and painful death, with the anguish that must bring. All the gospel writers are clear about the fact, even if they do not dwell on the gruesome details of crucifixion. This is probably because such death was more commonplace amongst them than it is amongst us. (Except as it comes to us from places where there is war and civil conflict, as in Syria at present.)

We might understand the child's comment about the crucifixion, though, because all of us only know about Jesus's death, because we know of his resurrection. Jesus is alive. The experience of Jesus's friends first, and then so many more witnesses, is that God raised Jesus from death to a new life. And that by some mystery, which the many word pictures in the New Testament struggle to capture, everyone else has the possibility of new life, with Christ.

That local child was right. The suffering of Jesus is "a wonder". The resurrection of Jesus, which we celebrate on Easter Sunday, underlines that. We have a gift of God's generous love, for this life and the next.

After various activities in our own locality to mark Jesus's suffering and death, I wish you a Happy Easter.
