

DR ANDREW MURRISON MP WRITES:

My first few weeks as a minister have been fairly exhausting. The fact is being a backbench MP is full-on if you do the job properly so time for the extra responsibilities inevitably must be carved out of existing commitments. So, there's less time at home with the family in Mere! However, having served in the Armed Forces in one way or another for 30 years, it is a very great privilege to land up in the Ministry of Defence.

I've learnt to tweet, or rather succumbed to the inevitability of bending technology to get a message across quickly given pressure on time. The trouble is, you have to be so very careful as a number of high profile imprudent tweets have put their senders in an unhappy place. I thought I was doing rather well with 300 followers so far but apparently colleagues have followings into the tens of thousands, presumably because they're writing more risqué things. So far I have confined my interest in Facebook to, as far as any parent can, keeping a watching brief on what my daughters get up to.

The recent iteration of the parliamentary constituency boundary review still has Mere at the heart of a new constituency called Warminster and Shaftesbury which takes in the larger part of my existing South West Wiltshire seat. The revised proposals I suspect are now pretty much as they will be put to the Commons late next year. However, it is unclear at this point whether they will get through because of tensions within the coalition.

I have had some correspondence on the state of the A303. The solution usually pressed is dualling throughout but the Stonehenge bottleneck remains a real hurdle, the tunnelling proposal having been rejected. My priority is improving the road safety record of the A303 in the vicinity of Mere together with sorting out the worst bits of the A350 and A36. I am in touch with neighbouring MPs on this and with both the County Council and Highways Agency.

May I wish all my neighbours in Mere and West Knoyle a very merry Christmas and a peaceful and prosperous New Year.

The Chairman writes:

After a glorious summer of sport in the UK, I am pleased to be able to praise the excellent state of sport in Mere. The recent annual Sports Development meeting was well attended by representatives of the towns' sports clubs, and they reported that the men's football team is top of its league, and the archery clubs have two World

Champions within their memberships. The Bowls club goes from strength to strength, and a hundred or so youngsters regularly play football and cricket. Unfortunately, the swimming pool has not been usable this summer as extensive repairs are required. It is hoped that, with the help of grants, fundraising and an enthusiastic committee, it will be possible to restore this amenity. We would like to congratulate and thank the organisers for the second Mere Firework Festival, which was extremely well attended, in spite of the weather. We do hope that it was a huge success.

I was pleased to represent the Parish Council on Remembrance Day. Many people attended the memorial at 11.00am, and the church was full for the service afterwards.

I would like to say how happy the Council is to welcome back to work our groundsman, Tony Suter, after his recent illness. He is a much valued member of our staff. On behalf on the council I would like to thank John Thorpe who has carried out groundsman duties during Tony's absence.

At the last Parish Council meeting we discussed various planning applications as well as a consultation document on Community Infrastructure Levy – this is a charge that will be imposed on developers in order to help pay for off-site infrastructure. The Parish Council also agreed that it should ask Wiltshire Council to prioritise a small length of double-yellow lines in Salisbury Street just to the west of the car park junction, in order that visibility is not obstructed for cars coming out of the car park.

Some of you will have noticed that there are now goats grazing on Long Hill. As you may be aware, the Higher Level Environment Stewardship Scheme requires us to graze the hill with cattle between April & September but Natural England has agreed that, in the meantime, the goats may have environmental benefits as they will eat the scrub. We have erected notices on the gates into Long Hill and would request that dog walkers keep their dogs on leads when going onto the hill. So far, the response from the public has been very positive.

As there will not be a Mere Matters now until the New Year, I would like to wish you all a Very Happy Christmas and a Peaceful New Year.

GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, WRITES

The Environment Agency website has a page for the Cranborne Chase area, including Mere. It currently states that following the wet summer groundwater is at unseasonal high levels. Many winterbournes are already at their capacity levels and will slowly rise even further. This situation will continue until there is a prolonged break in the unsettled weather.

2,730 bottles will have been lit on Bradley Knowle near Kilmington in aid of Breast Cancer by the time this article is published, which has been made possible by kind permission of the landowner, Angus Neish and farmer, Martin Brown. Hopefully, the pink and blue lights you will still be able to see in the evenings by the time you read this. At five metres wide and three metres high, the installation, called 'Beacon On The Hill, is by Bruce Munro, a local British lighting designer and installation artist. Bruce Munro is best known for lighting installations such as 'Field of Light', which was first exhibited at the Victoria and Albert Museum, London, in 2004.

I have received various questions and queries in Mere, Zeals and West Knoyle relating to boulders, stones, bollards, hedges and fences being placed on verges adjacent to the highway and have sought advice from the Highway Authority regarding "highway rights". In short, the adjoining landowner (the frontager) can apply for a Section 142 licence from Wiltshire Council to allow them to cut grass and plant non-invasive ground cover type species, but not trees or hedges.

The placement of stones, fences or other types of hard furniture or barriers on the highway verge is illegal and may lead to enforcement action and or prosecution against the perpetrator by Wiltshire Council. Furthermore, if an adjoining landowner fails to keep the verge free of obstructions and a road user comes into contact with same i.e. when taking evasive action, then that landowner is liable in law for any loss or damage incurred. The Highway Authority has the right to remove any obstructions on the verge and recover all reasonable costs from the perpetrator. 'Obstruction' includes hedges, which are sometimes planted too close to the verge, and their foliage and root system can cause problems for the highway user.

Remembrance Day this year being a Sunday, a service was held by Mere Town Clock when wreaths were laid. The Local Churches, Fire Brigade, Mere Parish Council and many others worked together. Mike Durkee voluntarily provided the sound system. I had to manually turn the Town Clock hands to 11.00am, because the clock mechanism

failed us. At one time our area of Mere received little or no coverage in the local press of our Remembrance Service as -photographers and reporters could not be at all the local towns at the same time. I used to send photos to the local press, which local people had taken and they were printed. Now with so many people using digital cameras, the photographs have to be good to get published. For those who do not get to the service or who have moved away, I and others like to see the Remembrance Service in the local press for the above reasons. It is difficult to take a good picture inconspicuously, I asked Graham Russell a local professional photographer to take some pictures, which he did and one was chosen and sent to the local Blackmore Vale magazine. They did print it. For this I would like to thank him. Again it was voluntary.

For those of you who get a rebate from your Wiltshire Council domestic rates, you will be subjected to a reduced maximum eligible council tax support of 80% of the Council Tax chargeable for all those of working age, except those in receipt of disability premium or war widows/disablement pensions. Those with social housing of non-pensionable age may be further affected as a "bedroom tax" will be imposed. One bedroom too many and 14% will be lost from housing benefit, and with more than one bedroom spare, 25% will be lost. This will effect about 3,000 people across Wiltshire. I believe Wiltshire Council is objecting to the Government about these changes forced upon it. This could cause people of non-pensionable age to have to leave the area. Those households on benefits of more than £500 a week could receive a further cap, back to £500 a week. Note for those of you who rent or have unoccupied and unfurnished property (Class C), only 3 months 100% exception will now be given.

I have asked for a sign at the west end of Chetcombe Road to say "Centre" or similar, there are those occasionally who turn right and then try a three point turn in The Hollow to get back on course.

The Wiltshire Council Cabinet agreed that the roles of the corporate director with statutory responsibility for adult social services and the joint director of public health are integrated to create one corporate director post with joint statutory responsibility for adult social services and public health. This decision will enable a re-structure of the senior management team to be completed by 1st April 2013 when the integration of public health takes effect and public health service staff transfer to the Council. The new role will be a statutory chief officer (corporate director), and the holder will be the principal advisor on all adult social services and health matters including public health, health improvement, health protection and healthcare.

I have already had complaints regarding the implementation of reduced speeds by Wiltshire Council to 50 mph from 60mph, the National Road Speed, through the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (50 mph) in the following places:

B3092, Maiden Bradley with Yarnfield and Kilmington - from a point 295 metres south east of its junction with Kingston Lane, Maiden Bradley with Yarnfield to a point 57 metres south west of its junction with The Street, Kilmington.

B3095 Warminster Hollow, Mere - from a point 66 metres south west of its junction with Mere Byway 11 to a point 113 metres north east of its junction with Downside Close.

B3092 Gillingham Road/Mapperton Hill, Mere - from its junction with B3095 Castle Street to the County Boundary with Dorset.

Any person aggrieved by the Orders and desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained in the Orders on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant Section of the above Act or on the grounds that any requirement of that Section or of Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act or any regulation made under the said Schedule, has not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court. The Orders will come into operation on 23rd November 2012.

My thanks to the Rev'd Judith Thompson, retired Church of England Minister, for voluntarily caring for the new defibrillator that is housed on a wall in Castle Street, Mere close to Barton Lane.

A skate park for Mere is still being progressed; Lindsey Wood and I met with a new volunteer who we believe will further push the scheme ahead.

Superfast broadband has a target date of 2015. The contract has been awarded to BT. It has been a year most of us will never forget with all the national celebrations, may I wish you all a Very Happy Christmas and New Year.

Our aim was to put on a community celebration in this important year, involving volunteers from across Mere and our villages, providing our children with a fantastic experience which they will remember with pride, and at the same time raising funds to revamp the school play areas.

Thank you to the 150 plus volunteers from across the community who made this possible. If you sold or bought raffle tickets, sponsored the festival, got sponsorship for us, paid a pitch fee, donated a raffle prize, told a story, donated money, baked cakes, took photographs for our publicity, delivered flyers, put up posters, helped or came along to the workshop, ran a stall, marshalled, helped with the lighting, worked on the gates or in the school kitchen, helped with traffic control, set up the fireworks and the event or with the clear up afterwards – you know who you are – thank you.

Just so you know (because people are already asking about Festival 2013!) provided there is continued support for the event we have decided to run it bi-annually.
