The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. The Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You will be permitted to raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be held in the Andy Young Pavilion at 7.30pm on **Monday, 2nd July 2012**. There will be NO meeting in August.

The Chairman writes:

I think the highlight of this past month must be all the celebrations that have taken place throughout the country in celebration of Her Majesty The Queen's Diamond Jubilee. Even though the weather for the Jubilee weekend was not at its best, the enthusiasm for colourful celebration was undimmed, and Mere joined in with flags and bunting throughout the town and even the flower tubs displaying patriotic colours. Our Civic Service of Celebration in St. Michael's Church was a truly joyful occasion' and congratulations and thanks must go to Mrs. Jane Hurd, our Licensed Lay Minister for all her hard work in preparing and conducting the service.

We have had many comments on how good it was to see a beacon on Castle Hill again and thanks for that go not only to our clerk, Lindsey Wood, for dealing with the amount of paperwork for consent for the beacon, but also to ClIrs Phillip Coward and Rodney Coward, and all their helpers, for undertaking all the practicalities of getting everything to the top of the hill on the day – and of course down again afterwards. Not just beacon building involved but some body building too, I think! The fireworks coinciding with the beacon were spectacular and very much appreciated, from all the comments we have received, and many thanks must go to Mr. Bill Deeker for organising and firing the display.

The many street parties and events which took place in Mere were caught on camera by George Jeans and I understand these images will go into the Mere archive and will perhaps be included when our Museum next has a display to celebrate a jubilee, though I fear it will be very many years indeed before another diamond jubilee comes around!

On other matters, it was agreed at the last Parish Council meeting to make a contribution to the South West Wiltshire Area Board Community Area Transport Group for the alteration of line markings at the Walnut Road/Shaftesbury Road roundabout and

GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, MERE DIVISION, WRITES

The Year of Celebration is going well. I attended over ten street parties and functions in Mere, Kilmington, West Knoyle and Zeals. Kilmington and Stourton joined together, the good weather, a marquee and tractor rides around the village brought people together: it was a joy to be amongst so much local celebration.

The very local street parties in Mere were numerous. I cannot name them all, but Denes Avenue and Well Head were the larger ones and again you had to be there to understand the community bonding, celebration and atmosphere. I, and I think many younger ones, will not forget the event, with a beacon on Castle Hill and a red, white and blue salute of fireworks over Mere on the night of the 4th of June.

I would like to thank Bill Deeker for his efforts in providing the fireworks and setting up and releasing the display. I would like it recorded that the very large firework at the end of the display was paid for by Bill as a memory to his dad who died close to the date of the event. Philip and Rodney Coward, with helpers, did well to get the heavy metal beacon to the top of Castle Hill where I would guess around 200 people stood around the burning beacon, witnessing all the beacons around in the distance. Mark Cassidy and Mere Carnival Club provided an excellent community function, which raised money for local good causes.

I took much video and still photography during the extended bank holiday and around that time at many events in Mere, Kilmington, West Knoyle and Zeals. Andrew Holder has offered to edit this with me and possibly present it to the museum with a public viewing. Whatever happens, I will ensure this record is lodged with the museum.

Many in the area need to be thanked, however there is not room to name all individually. I thank the South West Area Board for providing funds for our area. A young lad, Daniel Cook, voluntarily helped me for many evenings to put up the flags and bunting in Mere. Another young person, Josh Howden, with his dad stopped their car one evening and started to help and came along other evenings, people came out of their houses to help, this list goes on and I am sorry I cannot name you all.

The Olympics are now about to start in The UK. The Olympic Torch arrives in Salisbury on 11th July with an event in Hudson's field that evening, and then setting off from Salisbury Cathedral on 12th July.

Grass cutting etc or lack of it. I get more complaints about this every year. Drivers complain they cannot see at junctions and people cannot walk the footpaths without getting wet, in some cases because the path is blocked with vegetation. Some of these footpaths are maintained by the council and therefore are not maintained by the landowner who would normally be responsible. We could do with footpath groups in some areas who work with the parish councils in many cases. Do we have any volunteers who would help with the work of keeping the footpaths clear in some areas of overgrowth, which sometimes would involve physical effort? The man and woman power is short at this time of year. If extra labour were to be brought in at this time of year, for example by Mere Parish Council, it would be a cost to the Mere residents. This is a contentious question.

A consultation meeting with the youth and adults was held in The Youth Development Centre, The Mere Peace Memorial Recreation Field, on the evening of the 14th June. We need extra grants to what we have, and we need proof that the facility has been consulted on by potential users. I still hope that by the middle of the school holidays we will have a skate park in place. Clive Hazzard has also volunteered to push this forward.

Many seem interested in the following, as stated last month for those that missed it. Great Western Broadband a partnership of Swindon, Wiltshire and South Gloucestershire Councils plus finance from others, which will roll out a minimum broadband speed of 2Mbt/s at peak time of about 5.00pm for all (virtually) in Wiltshire by 2015. Many of us will be able to get speeds of 10 to 25 Mbt/s at our local BT green cabinet. There will also be options for local community involvement for those who wish to improve the availability in their area.

Neighbourhood plans I am often asked about, on the North Dorset web site, is an application from **http://www.dorsetforyou.com/gillinghamneighbourhoodplan**. Gillingham, being our neighbour, this may interest you.

The speed of street lighting repairs has improved. Lindsey Wood and I now have a direct number to the contractor's engineer.

A water leak on the hill at The Lynch, Mere has been a concern for many months to one householder, where the water was entering their house. Also, if it was to freeze next winter, road users would be compromised. After communication with many, the land owner now has had the water leak repaired. The moral is, even with a major problem, councils and large agencies just take their time, and without Councillors they probably would take even longer!

'Families In Need' have been started by Amy Nugent \cong 07505 314304 and Kate Marshall \exists 07825 7874874, they collect old items voluntarily, an example being bedding etc., and hand back out to those who enquire.

I continue to attend meetings around the County using the knowledge gained to help the Mere Area. One example is when I attended a core strategy (development proposals) meeting at Chippenham, I stated that one-bedroom houses are required amongst other issues. The council do not agree with me. However, you all still have a chance to contest the document when it goes to the inspector, although to my knowledge the date is not yet set.

JOIN THE SUMMER READING CHALLENGE For Children from Saturday, 14th July 2012



- It's makes children want to read
- lt's free
- It's great fun!

The national Summer Reading Challenge for 4 to 11 year olds is run in Wiltshire libraries every summer during school holidays. It's a fun

personal challenge which encourages children to read more, and in so doing get better at reading and enjoy it more. With 780,000 children aged 4-11 taking part across the country, the Summer Reading Challenge is the biggest national reading initiative.

The challenge is simple – for children to read six books over the summer, talk to library staff and volunteers about their books and collect rewards to mark their progress - such as stickers, a wristband and a medal.

Families love the challenge and over 90% said that by taking part in the challenge their child's reading had improved a little or a lot.

Last year 8,156 Wiltshire children joined the Circus Stars challenge, with 4,494 children reading all six books and over 30,000 books being read in total.

Comments on the 2011 Circus Stars challenge:

"...my youngest son (4) enjoys being read to. However, discussing his books with the library staff has actually encouraged him to start reading!" (Melksham parent)

"It has given my child a reason to read over the holidays, but as a parent [I] was particularly keen on my child having the confidence to talk to a stranger about the book she has read. By week 6 she was amazing!" (Westbury parent)

"I think it's really good because you discover new writers and you see how much fun it is." (7 year old Bradford on Avon)

"I think the challenge was very good and helpful. It made me feel a bit more confident about reading. Now I have lots of fun with reading." (10 year old, Westbury)



Story Lab - the Summer Reading Challenge 2012

In Wiltshire the Summer Reading Challenge will run from 14 July to 8 September 2012, children will receive a membership card on registering and their own 'Story Lab' after reading one book. Children then receive sets of stickers for each book read, a wristband when they get to book 4, a medal and certificate when they finish.

This year the Summer Reading Challenge will be an official programme within the Cultural Olympiad London 2012 Festival, the largest cultural celebration in the history of the modern Olympic and Paralympic Movements. The aim is for 1 million children to take part in the 2012 Summer Reading Challenge across the country.

Being Anchored

Back in June you couldn't help but notice miles of bunting; decorating streets, houses, shops, gardens, schools, offices and even car wing mirrors. Some places appear to be keeping the bunting up to greet the Olympic torch as it crosses the country. The Union Flag I was familiar with, but not so the red, white, and yellow, or to be more exact: pantone, white and gold, which is the flag of Dorset, adopted in 2008. Being newly resident in Dorset, I wanted to find out more about the flag.

Red and white come from the County Council coat of arms whilst the gold alludes to Gold Cap, highest point on the Jurassic coast, and also Gold Hill. The flag is also called "St Wites Cross" and recognises St Wite, a female Dorset Saint.

Very little is known about St Wite except that she was buried in Whitchurch Canonicorum and her tomb, with relics, was one of only two in Britain which survived the Reformation.

Wite was a Saxon Holy woman and it is suggested that she was an "anchoress", a type of hermit, who was martyred by the Danes during a raid in 831. Mother Julian of Norwich (1342-1416) was a well- known anchoress who did much good work in a later day. By the 13th Century a set of rules was written for anchoresses, to give these female recluses guidance.

Anchoresses moved from living out in the countryside in caves, into cells adjacent to the church; they would apply for permission to be "sealed in" and many such recluses would live out their days in the cell and be buried there too. These holy women were "anchored" to the church - they were not just people who had a strong faith; their lives were literally part of the church building.

The cells were supposed to have three windows - one to open into the church so that she could receive communion, one to allow her helper to assist her and the third window to enable ordinary people to come and seek her wisdom, advice and prayer.

It may seem a long way from 21st Century celebration of national events to the thought of holy women voluntarily being bricked up in cells, but history can raise questions. Having found out a little about the Dorset flag, I wonder whether we feel ourselves anchored into something greater than our own lives... Our family? Our community? Our faith? Finding out who has come before us, can influence our thinking about who we are and where we want to fit into a bigger picture.

Enjoy your summer whether it involves flag waving, or putting paper flags onto sand castles, or just sitting and quietly being ...and have a lovely time.
