

The Christmas period was busy for me, helping to provide electrics for The Mere Town clock, tree and for Father Christmas, all of which kept me occupied. Richard Coward kindly donated a LED Star, which he would have liked to have been put at the very top

of The Mere Town Clock, however this year the star was mounted separately on a pole in The Square.

2013 is now here. Mere Town Football Club are looking to the future with hope and pride for 2013. 2012 was a fantastic year for the Club. Not only did the 1st team win their division for the second season running and gain promotion to the Dorset Senior League (the highest the club has ever been), but the Reserve team also won Division 5. This season has seen continued playing success with the 1st team sitting proudly on top of the Senior League whilst the Reserves lie 2nd in Division 4. Apart from the playing side, the new pitch development is almost complete, which will allow the club to progress further. Chairman Pete Down said "The aim for this season is to get the 1st team into the Dorset Premier League and have a strong reserve team supporting it. We are growing as a club and have firm foundations with a very strong Youth set up which has seen players progress through into the 1st team over the past two seasons, which I can only hope continues."

The groundwater is at unseasonal high levels. I had one household inform me before Christmas 2012 that the water was within 6 feet of their house, luckily I do not think Wiltshire Council has had to provide sand bags anywhere in The Mere area.

I had previously stated 2,730 bottles would have been lit during December 2012 on Bradley Knowle near Kilmington in aid of Breast Cancer. However, this had to be postponed due to poor weather conditions. It is now hoped that you will be able to see the pink and blue lights during June 2013. At five metres wide and three metres high, the installation, called 'Beacon On The Hill', will be by Bruce Munro, of Kilmington.

I have asked for a more effective sign on the Island at the Junction of Water Street and Salisbury Street, to try and deter large vehicles destined for Woodlands Industrial Estate or lost looking for Gillingham. I will attend Community Area Transport Group at Dinton on 15th January to pursue this, plus other Highway safety signs.

Wiltshire Council now is responsible for health matters including public health, health improvement, health protection and healthcare. The average time for an ambulance service to reach Mere is now 8 minutes for a Red 1 or 2 life threatening emergency call, this speed is achieved by the help of our local Fire Brigade, which I am very thankful for. Changes are proposed at present for the ambulance service that covers our area and I shall be mindful of this fact. Parish Councillor Christopher Reeves has reminded me that the defibrillator lock numbers cannot be seen by all, I hope some of you will remember, it is important to have a torch or reading glasses should an emergency arise, not only just in the case of the defibrillator above.

Please look around Mere Square, or ask in the Library for a new bus timetable, dated January 2013, which now displays in effect a reintroduced bus service for Salisbury on a Saturday as well as other services.

A skate park for Mere is being progressed; our new volunteer Roland Heming gave an update to Mere Parish Council at its January 2013 meeting.

Mere Chamber of Trade is applying for funds to work with our local Area of Natural Beauty (ANOB) to promote tourism and help the survival of our shops and services for the next three years. If any more of our shops or services fail, we could end up like some populations of just short of 3,000 adults like ourselves, with one pub and a community shop.

The Hill Brush Company is proposing to move and create 13 more jobs. Businesses usually get bigger or smaller rarely staying the same size. We have a local employer which is growing and bucking the trend of many, which is downward. A Public Consultation event will be at The Grove Building, Church Street, Mere, on Tuesday, 19th February 2013 between 2.30 and 7.30pm.

At our local events I take a camera and over Christmas have had some success publicising Mere in the local media. Lastly, well done all the local residents who helped light up Mere with twinkling lights over the Christmas period.

STAYING WARM THIS WINTER

Checklist

- Wear several thin layers of clothing, rather than one thick one.
- Go for clothes made from wool, cotton or fleecy fabrics.
- Draw your curtains as soon as it gets dark to keep the heat in.
- Keep any windows and internal doors closed to retain heat.
- A lot of heat is lost through the head and neck so if you are chilly indoors try wearing a
 hat and scarf.
- Your body keeps warm by burning food you have eaten, so make sure you have regular hot meals that contain carbohydrates such as potatoes, pasta, bread and rice. Try porridge with hot milk for breakfast and soups and stews for lunch and dinner.
- If you are sitting down, a shawl or blanket will provide extra warmth.
- Try to keep your feet up, because air is cooler at ground level.
- Wear warm clothes in bed.
- When it is really cold wear thermal underwear, bed socks and even a hat.
- Staying warm is a priority.
 The recommended temperature for your main living is 21°C (70°F) and the ideal temperature for your bedroom is 18°C. It is important to keep warm as you are



at risk of a heart attack or a stroke or even hypothermia if you are exposed to a cold environment for a long time or extreme cold for a short time.

Staying warm is your priority especially if you are elderly or infirm.

WEATHER REPORT

In November we had 139mms (5.47ins) of rain, last year 63mms (2.48ins). Most fell in the second half of the month. During the first half we had several frosty mornings followed by cold sunshine.

In December we had 175.5mms (6.91ins) and last year, 2011, we had 128.5 mms (5.06in). Again most of the rain fell in the second half of the month. In the first half we had several frosty mornings followed by sunshine.

2013 started drier. Up to the 13th we only had 22.5mms (0.89ins). Readers might be interested to know the monthly rainfall for the months of 2011 and 2012. They are as follows in mms:-

MERE SURGERY

Communication

Communication between the surgery and our patients is very important to ensuring that we deliver the best possible care. We are constantly looking at ways of making this more effective for individual patients.

Prescription messages

For patients who receive repeat medications, we have for some months now been using the repeat ordering side of your medication slip to communicate important messages. These are printed in bold type and are personalised to your own care. For instance, they are designed to remind or inform you of when your medications are due for review, a blood pressure check is necessary or blood tests may be needed. Please take a moment to check for new messages on your repeats slip when you pick up medication even if you request your medication online.

Mobile phone messaging (SMS)

We are planning to trial a new system using mobile phone reminders for patients who would like to use this service. Like other healthcare providers such as dentists, we plan to remind patients of upcoming appointments or if appointments need to be booked by patients, which will reduce the number of wasted appointments that we have each

month. This will only occur if you "opt-in" – i.e. you must both provide the surgery with your mobile phone number and sign a form agreeing to us using the mobile telephone for the messaging reminder service.

We plan to use the text-messaging service as an additional reminder, but please don't rely on it! There are many areas locally where reception is poor so it won't always work perfectly, but we hope it will be useful for our patients with mobile telephones who lead busy lives. If you would like to take advantage of the service, please ask one of our receptionists for a form to read and sign, and we can then add you to use the system.

Do you sometimes struggle to hear? Do you find it more difficult to join in conversations in a noisy environment? You don't need to be very deaf before this becomes a problem. Why not do something about it before it does!

Have you thought of trying to improve your ability to communicate more easily but don't know how? Well, help is at hand! Why not join our friendly Mere Lipreading Group. You will certainly meet people in the same boat and enjoy learning new skills in a small group of like-minded people. We are all people who used to be able to hear well and are struggling sometimes to go about our daily lives when we miss some of what is said to us.

The class explains how to use better strategies to cope with your hearing loss. It will help you access helpful equipment and give you an insight into why your hearing loss makes it difficult to understand what people are saying. It also explains to you why shouting at you is no use at all, but just makes you look cross! It will explain to you why you miss some bits of words, but hear some other bits perfectly well!

Lipreading to hearing loss is what a walking stick is to bad leg! It doesn't cure the condition, but it makes it much easier to cope with it! Along the way, you will meet some very friendly people and you will definitely start to look forward to Tuesday mornings!

REV'D HELEN CAINE, METHODIST MINISTER WRITES:

February sees the Church mark the beginning of Lent, in which we prepare for Easter. You may be thinking, "What? We have only just celebrated Christmas and already we look forward to Easter!" The Church's calendar can be relentless as well as confusing. A couple of years ago in a church I overheard a young boy, who on being told that the baby in the manger was called Jesus, suddenly exclaimed, "He died, didn't he?"

A text that links Christmas and Easter comes from Paul's letter to the Philippians (Ch 2: 5 - 8): "Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death – even death on a cross."

How can we humble ourselves in preparation for Easter? Possibly, by joining everyone else for Pancake Day. This day is the last remnant of a feast, before the fast of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, 13th February. Fasting takes many forms in 2013, reflecting the individual way that we interpret centuries' old tradition. There is giving up certain practices especially certain foods. And there is giving up giving up, or adopting special spiritual disciplines.

For a Methodist emphasis on Lent, I would commend joining with other people during this period. For the life of the Christian disciple is not meant to be a solitary one. John Wesley spoke about social holiness. And his brother Charles penned the lines:

"All praise to our redeeming Lord,

Who joins us by his grace,

And bids us, each to each restored.

Together seek his face." (Hymns & Psalms 753 v1)

Let's take this season seriously and seek new disciplines, and then share the insights God gives us along the way. Therefore I commend to you the Lent courses and the Lent lunches.

February can still be a dark and lonely month, so looking outward to our neighbours - of whatever faith, or none – could bring particular blessing.
