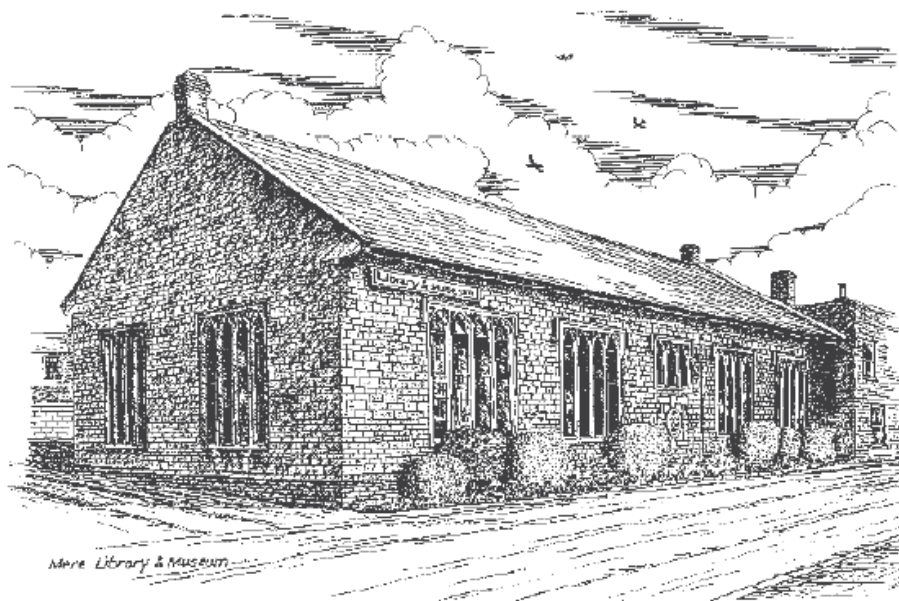

The Parish Council meets every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You can raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be on **Monday, 13th May** at 7.30pm in the Andy Young Pavilion.

The Chairman writes:

As the current term of this Parish Council comes to an end with the elections for a new Council on Thursday, 2nd May, the work of the council continues unabated. At the April Parish Council Meeting many matters of what might be called an everyday nature, though still important, were discussed; the interest for community use of the Band Hut and we would still like to hear of any other group who may be interested in its use; the continuing work of the Mere Rivers Group in river monitoring and management; the possible provision of a Public Access Defibrillator in the Duchy Manor Sports Ground; consultations on planning applications and the annual allotments rent audit together with permissions and consultations on various activities.

Councillors were also concerned to hear that at a recent Neighbourhood Task Group Meeting one issue of priority was the matter of dog fouling, which does seem to be on the increase again, and the prosecutions which should follow. At the risk of sounding like a broken record can I just reiterate **again** that it is an offence for a dog to be allowed to foul *any* public area whether it is pavement, footpath or green area such as beside the cemetery or even Castle Hill, so please pick up after your dog and place the bags either in the various dog bins provided or in the litter bins, all of which are emptied regularly, and therefore avoid prosecution.

As I mentioned in the beginning, elections for both County and Parish Councils take place on Thursday, 2nd May, after which you will have a new Parish Council for the next four years. These elections are your opportunity to vote for councillors who will be working on your behalf to ensure that Mere remains a good and welcoming place to live. Please vote and support your Parish Council.

This is my last Chairman's Report as my two-year term of office ends this month. It has been an honour to serve on this Parish Council and particularly as Chairman, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank both my Vice-Chairman, Lesley Traves, for her help and support over the last two years, and most particularly our Parish Clerk, Lindsey Wood, whose inestimable abilities in this demanding job are extraordinary. She has my gratitude for so often keeping me, and at times all of us, on the right track.

GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, MERE DIVISION, WRITES

As I said last month, Mere Parish Council has now taken over the Mere Salisbury Street and Castle Street Car Parks and toilets. I have been asked when the marked out parking bays will be improved. I know it is the intention of The Mere Parish Council to improve the two car parks marked bays in the long term.

Some will have noticed the bus service 158 which links Mere to Zeals has had timetable changes. The service is principally subsidised by Dorset; however Wiltshire does put some subsidy into it. The service has been changed to allow children in Gillingham who wish to attend school in Shaftesbury to do so. What happens across "the border" does affect us. In the summer another Dorset service may help Mere - it is hoped this one can be used to travel to Yeovil from Mere.

Wiltshire Council has taken some rental payments from local residents' bank accounts a month before it should have done so. This has happened to some tenants over the

years by mistake, but it has come to light that it now takes a month before a cheque is received returning the overpayment, which could financially embarrass some.

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) “roof tax” now proposed for implementation in 2014 will bring money to some or all the local parish councils. I have pushed for accurate information to be given to the parishes well before the time Precepts are set, which is usually in November, regarding the amount available to Parishes, enabling them to make a balanced decision when setting local precepts (rates). I understand the amount available to a parish or Town Council will be between 15 and 25% of the CIL collected. Also, I am against imposing a CIL on permitted residential development. For example, being permitted development who reports the money is owing? It may be the next door neighbour in some instances, which I do not think is a good idea!

Some residents in Salisbury Street, Mere have for many months suffered from noise caused by several broken drain covers. The pavement on the north side is difficult for some users as another cover has sunk throwing some of the users towards the traffic. I am told residents will soon have a letter stating when the work will begin. This could affect motorists as traffic lights will be in place.

Universal Credit will affect some people in the Mere area. Birmingham City Council was one of the 12 successful local authorities announced in August 2012, to carry out one of the Universal Credit local authority-led pilots. The 12 authorities are looking at how they can help get Universal Credit claimants ready for October 2013, by identifying and supporting people who need help with: getting online, managing and maintaining their finances and finding and staying in work. A full evaluation of the effectiveness of these pilot schemes will take place in October 2013 so that the Department of Works & Pensions can use the information for future claimant delivery.

The latest National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) in my view encourages a planning officer to “think twice” before refusing a planning application. The informative note now placed on every development planning officers reports read: “In accordance with paragraph 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF), this planning application has been processed in a proactive way”.

Thanks to the initiative of Julian Mackie, the Mere Croquet & Boule Club was included in a local supermarket scheme in March. It has now been advised that the club has benefited by some £110. If you require financial support for a community project it is worth remembering these supermarket initiatives.

Superfast Broadband is of interest to many. Wiltshire Council will be providing some updates to its web site (www.wiltshireonline.org) at the end of April that will show when work will be starting in the Mere area (i.e. late 2013, 2014 and 2015). Wiltshire is working with BT to be able to use the availability checker which provides more specific postcode related information as work starts relating to individual local BT cabinets

(usually green). After a local resident's enquiry, a Council officer has told me that in respect of Mere, this may not include the villages around, "I can say it is within our intervention area for the 91% coverage".

"Purdah" is the period in a council's political life during the run-up to an election and the general position is that the council should continue to run its services as it considers necessary in order to meet its statutory responsibilities and corporate priorities in the

interests of the people of Wiltshire. Proposals or issues which may be controversial and likely to arise during the critical period are identified and a common sense view taken in each case as to how the matter is to be handled. I still attend regularity functions such as Development Planning Committees and Licensing panels for those requesting entertainment licences etc.

Visiting the Mere Library, it has come to my attention that they would be pleased if anyone would be interested in volunteering to help maintain the present opening hours, which through the involvement of volunteers have been increased by two mornings a week, over that which would otherwise be provided. I would like to thank the present volunteers for their most appreciated work.

Stourton, Mere and West Knoyle all have contested elections for their Parish Councils on Thursday, 2nd May, the same day as the Wiltshire Council elections.

STAYING SAFE IN YOUR HOME



Hopefully the weather is going to warm up so you will be opening the windows to let all that lovely fresh air in and as the evenings are drawing out, the temptation is to be out in the garden. Don't forget that there are many opportunist intruders looking for an easy way into your home.

If you are out in the garden make sure windows onto the road are closed or locked at an opening size that no one can get through. Remember some of these opportunists may be children and can get through much smaller spaces. If you are in the back garden lock the front door, and visa versa you are in the front lock up the back. If you cannot see your front or back door from where you are working lock them both and take the key with you.

You might think this is a ridiculous measure but someone walked into my house through my back door when I was working in the garden and I didn't notice for 2 hours! Fortunately their intention was not to rob me but it shows just how easy it is.

Did you know that 38% of Burglaries occur in insecure premises? Make sure both front and back doors are locked when you are in the house and make sure if you have a conservatory that the doors are locked. Do not leave your door or car keys in view through a window or in line of sight through the letter box

FOODBANK NEWS

Warminster and District Foodbank exists to support those who unexpectedly find themselves in difficult circumstances, including those who live in Mere. If you have no money and no food, the Foodbank can provide you with an emergency food box to meet your immediate needs, containing nutritional, well-balanced meals to last for three days. However, those requiring a food box must first obtain a food box voucher, as shown below.

The food boxes are not intended as a long term solution, as a maximum of three boxes is given to those households in need. They are intended to help cover the gap before any payments under the national benefits system are available.

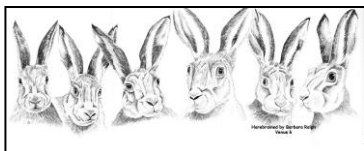

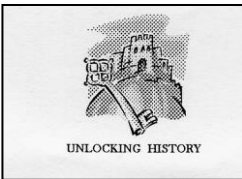

REV'D CAROL WILSON-BARKER, WRITING AS THE CHAIR OF CHURCHES TOGETHER IN MERE AND DISTRICT:

The walk of witness up Castle Hill was a special event and the weather was fine. The physical act of carrying a heavy cross, pausing to listen to words that provoke and test bring a new dimension to understanding. Thank you to everyone who took part and erected the cross. Sadly the cross on the hill is a source of discomfort to some and so we agreed to take it down on 8th April as a way of showing respect to our neighbours having had the opportunity to practice our faith. It brings to mind the way the Union Flag became the cause of conflict recently in Belfast: symbols can be a precious inspiration or the cause of pain and anger.

May is one of my favourite times of the year. In my mind it is the bridge between the worst of winter and the easiness of summer. It is the month of that nationwide campaign by Christian Aid to raise money and awareness of the plight of people throughout the world struggling against poverty or ignorance. It is a charity I particularly like to support because it helps where disaster strikes, but also has programmes which give money to people to encourage independent living and better education. Please help this campaign by becoming a collector door-to-door (speak to me or Judith Thompson about this).

On the 30th of June there is an exciting prospect for Churches Together, an 11.00am service in Stourhead Gardens at the cross by the lake followed by a picnic in the grounds.
