GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, MERE DIVISION, WRITES

Remembrance Sunday in Mere this year was as usual around Mere Town Clock in the square. An excellent turn out of people, over 300, I believe. PC Richard Salter must be thanked for attending on his day off and organizing extra Police from Warminster. It was nice to have the traffic stopped for safety and silence. The photographer Graham Russell took some very professional pictures, this was despite him having a hernia operation three days previously. The pictures appeared in all the local press and facebook, allowing those who could not attend to see the remembrance. The Royal British Legion poppy Appeal organised in Mere by Col. Walker raised over £1,500 and this without the local shops' collections that are yet to be counted.

A Campus for many services is well underway at Tisbury. A Community hub may be offered to Mere before too long. If you have ideas as to what might be wanted, i.e. a covered swimming pool (rather hopeful!), let me know.

Following the new housing allocation policy (rental property) that was approved at Cabinet in November 2013, Wiltshire Council is now ready to implement the new policy on 9th December 2014, which will be followed by an 8 week transition period. During this period Wiltshire Council will be required to re-register and re-band all applicants onto the new system.

The new policy will no longer prioritise those applicants with no housing need, which means that as from the 9th December their housing application will be cancelled and they will no longer be able to bid for social housing. Therefore from 9 December 2014 these 'Bronze housing application' will be cancelled and those in that band will no longer be able to actively bid for properties that are being advertised through 'Homes 4 Wiltshire'.

From 9th December applicants can decide to express an interest in other forms of housing under the Open Market Register. These other options will not include general needs housing but will include:

- Private rented accommodation.
- Low Cost Home Ownership.
- Shared Ownership.
- Home Buy.
- Properties in low demand that clients on the housing register have not bid for.
- Specialist accommodation tailored for those with specific disabilities or needs.

With only 2,000 social housing lets each year, Wiltshire Council needs to ensure they identify and give priority to those most in need. Wiltshire is also aiming to better manage client expectations by not registering those who are unlikely to be re-housed

through this scheme and encourage clients to look at the alternative options available to them.

The South West Wiltshire Area Board is now charged with providing a youth service for young people aged 13 to 19. A Chat LYN (Local Youth Network) will be held at the Andy Young Pavilion, Mere from 6.00 to 8.30pm on Tuesday, 2nd December, 2014. All youth are welcome, chip supper free (see following article).

The Deputy Leader of Wiltshire Council has asked if local parish councils will fund the SIDs (Speed Indicator Device) programme at around $\pounds75,000$, which would be around $\pounds4,200$ per Area Board. At a recent Community Area Transport Group meeting, interest was shown for their retention.

Should you know where drop curbs are required, let me know, these are usually in pairs opposite each other and on a safe length of carriageway.

A local charity has agreed another Salt bin for Westfields, Zeals.

I have put a lost red commercial BIFFA waste bin in the car park; if you are the owner, please contact me.

Parish Council annual finance meetings usually take place in the period of November to January each year. I understand more and more demands are being put on Parish precepts. Grant contributions that Parishes offer to my Area Board are **discretionary** and the final decision is made by the Area Board. However, the grant from Wiltshire Council to our Area Board is decreasing year on year, and it is my view that we need to be certain in many cases the community supports the grant. One way of doing this is through a financial contribution from the local Parish or Town Council. My fellow Councillors agree with this approach, whilst accepting that certain cases may need flexibility of approach. In the personal guide that I have written and circulated to the 38 Parish Councils in my Board's area, I suggest that smaller Parish Councils should allow approximately an extra two hundred pounds in their precept for contributions towards grants from the South West Wiltshire Area Board.

Larger Town and Parish Councils can be expected to be asked for larger contributions up to 50% of the grant application.

It may be a good time to highlight to you, that Wiltshire Council's support grant from Central Government is projected by the Treasury to reduce to zero by 2022-23. Wiltshire Council will then only receive from central government business rates from those businesses that are new to Wiltshire, and the amount Wiltshire will receive will be capped and unlikely to be more than £2.5m per annum, plus the precept, which will also be capped.

The Community Infrastructure Levy is now proposed to come into force for Wiltshire around next April. Any new dwelling built in Mere, will require a payment of £30 per square meter for infrastructure. Mere Parish Council will receive 15% of this unless

Mere produces a Neighbourhood Plan, when they would receive 25%. A Neighbourhood Plan would require a lot of local input.

A developer has offered West Knoyle four starter homes, a mix of low market cost and 80% of market rental. Four private 80% of market rental homes have been approved at Gasper.

Wilsons, a law firm in Salisbury, hosted a function where Lindsey Wood, Mere Parish Clerk, attended with me to hear Stephen Hawkins, Head of Planning Enforcement at Wiltshire Council, speak. Solicitors also spoke on planning. Mere now has a Parish Clerk well versed on planning enforcement.

I get a steady request for "Digital Champions", to train those with little experience of a computer. In other parts of Wiltshire we get volunteers coming forward, but Mere bucks the trend. However we need some volunteers in Mere to train those with little computer knowledge.

I would like to thank a resident in Hazards Hill, Mere for making Halloween a joyous occasion for many children. It was eye catching, and spooky with fun.

I have asked Wiltshire Council to be aware that land is needed beyond the next four years regarding the development of a small number of council houses across Wiltshire. Enough land is probably owned by Wiltshire Council, if they do not sell it.

Broadband improvement in Wiltshire is in partnership with South Gloucestershire. Many are interested to know when we are going to get faster broadband. I had a Meeting in Trowbridge at County Hall on the 5th November 2014, regarding roll out of superfast broadband. I have put forward an argument that we should have three presentations from BT with the first one for Wilton, which I have asked to be at South Newton on the 10th of December. For our community areas approximate presentation times would be March 2015 for Tisbury and in Mere in June, (or later with slippage). If we have a combined presentation for all three area boards, it may not be to the end of next year. So far there is no reply from our officers regarding a presentation on 10th December. I will keep pushing for a dedicated presentation for our area.

READING MADE EASY

A new reading scheme, which aims to help adults who struggle to read, has been launched for the Gillingham & Shaftesbury area by volunteers.

"Most of us take reading for granted" says Murray Walker, chairman of the group's management committee, "but it is estimated that one in twenty adults in England has a reading age at or below the level expected of a five year old, so we can help change lives with this free literacy service".

Read Easy Gillingham & Shaftesbury will use a simple, proven system based on 'phonics' to help new readers 'crack the code' in one-to-one learning as part of Read Easy UK (**www.readeasy.org.uk**). This registered charity has grown quickly from the first group in Dorchester four years ago and currently new groups are being set up in North London, Leeds, Winchester and Oxford among other places.

The Gillingham & Shaftesbury group is now looking to appoint a volunteer Co-ordinator who will match readers with coaches, organise and keep records, arrange training and meetings, and provide support throughout, linking with the management committee of the group. Fire Safety in The Home

The majority of fire deaths in the home are those of older people where their mobility is poor and smoke alarms have not been fitted. Wiltshire Fire and Rescue are happy to visit elderly people in their homes free of charge and give them a home fire risk assessment.

Trained Firemen will carry out the inspection to identify potential fire risks and give advice on how to prevent a fire.

If smoke alarms have already been installed they will be checked to ensure they are in working order and also checked that they have been placed in the appropriate place in your home. These may be replaced free of charge, and if you do not have smoke alarms then free ones may be fitted for you.

They will check other potential fire risks such as your electric blankets, if you have overloaded plug sockets, and any unsafe electric wires.

Community Architectural Modelling Competition

Last month we told you that the club was bringing the railway to Mere. Well, not quite a full sized one, but the club has decided to build a 4mm to the foot model of a fictitious railway that ran through Salisbury Street to Castle Street. The focus will be the north side of these streets from **Chalke's Garage through to the 'Butt of Sherry' public house.** The challenge is to select a building of your choice and model it in a material of your choice. The square and clock tower will be included, as will 'The George Inn'.

Mere Station will naturally be located where Castle Street Car Park stands! The goods yard and loading facilities will be located where Church Street is in reality.

THE REV'D PAUL ARNOLD, THE METHODIST CHURCH MINISTER, WRITES:

When did you last have a really good sing? In the shower? At a 'karaoke' night? I often hear it said that, as a nation, we sing less than in the past. I am sure that is true - 'piped muzak', radios and i-pods mean we have a constant supply of music – why would we need to make our own? However, the success of TV shows like 'The Voice' and 'The Choir' prove that people's desire to sing music of all kinds is far from extinct.

This is the time of year when people who do not normally attend church often find themselves in Services and have the chance to loosen their vocal chords and let rip with a few good carols! There can be something incredibly liberating about a good sing, indeed there are health benefits! Researchers at the University of Gothenburg, Sweden, asked a group of teenagers to perform three choral exercises – humming, singing a hymn and chanting – and monitored their heart rhythms during each. It was shown that singing has a dramatic effect on heart rate variability, which is linked to a reduced risk of heart disease. The calming effect is as beneficial as yoga. Other studies have shown that people who sing tend to live longer than people who don't!

It is sometimes said that the Methodist Church was, 'born in song' because Charles Wesley, who helped establish the church along with his brother John, wrote (almost) 9,000 hymns and songs! Most of them will be forgotten, but there are many which live on and are still sung with real passion and power today - 'Love Divine, all loves excelling,' 'Jesus, lover of my soul' and perhaps best known around this time of year, 'Hark the herald angels sing!'

Song continues to be at the heart of the worship and mission of all Churches today. Singing can express joy, regret, hope, sorrow and so many more emotions. Christians worship God in song, not just because it makes us feel better, but because it expresses the hope that lies at the heart of the Christmas story that, 'God's love in Jesus has made all the difference'. So, in the coming days when you sing 'Hark, the herald' – sing it loud (!) and thank God for Jesus: '*Glory to the new-born king!*' Have a wonderful Christmas and peaceful New Year....
