MERE TOWN COUNCIL

The Town Council meet every month. Whilst it is not a public meeting, members of the public are welcome to come and listen. Council members are working on YOUR behalf to sustain and improve the quality of life and the environment that we enjoy in the parish - come and hear what they are doing for you! You can raise questions in a public session before the meeting starts. The next meeting will be on Monday, 3rd July at 7.30pm in the Andy Young Pavilion. There is no meeting in August.

The Chairman writes:

There are a several important matters on the Town Council horizon, the largest of which is that we will be developing a Mere Neighbourhood Plan. We had excellent advice from David Beaton, who headed Gillingham's Neighbourhood Plan team. With a starting group of a few councillors we had enough information to convince the Council meeting that this was a 'must do' for Mere. We will now start the process and will be looking to have a first draft of ideas ready for some time in September, after which we will be consulting you, the residents of Mere, about how you see Mere developing in the future. We have the offer of several people who would like to help, and will be receiving assistance from Wiltshire Planning team.

We now have a firm quote on equipment which will improve the time keeping of the Town Clock, which, sadly, needs constant adjustment due to temperature and humidity changes. The auto-adjuster recommended is the same as the one used in the Hampton Court Palace clock, and many others, so the supplier is confident that we will have perfect time keeping. We hope to commission the work in July.

The issue of dog faeces not being picked up by owners in public places has prompted one of our new councillors, Aubrey Colman, to develop a range of suggestions. Can I thank him now for his suggestions and welcome him to the council. He and councillor Mead have both raised the issue, and we will be having a Wiltshire dog warden coming to discuss their ideas and also to provide us with some regular patrols to check on notorious areas for fouling. The dog warden has powers to issue fixed penalty notices, which may lead to prosecutions. It would be better if this was unnecessary, and we hope that those few dog owners who continue to offend will change their behaviour.

One of our June meeting's major items was to approve the accounts from last year and this was done with the knowledge that our clerk takes great care managing our accounts and that we have the benefit of Mary White ready to audit the process . The Annual Return, accounts and related documents have now been submitted to the external auditors and are available for public inspection, on reasonable notice, on application to the Clerk. Details of the exercise of electors' rights and inspection of the accounts will be displayed on the Town Council noticeboard, outside the Lecture Hall, by Friday, 30th June. Information on the accounts is also published on the Mere website.

We had an opening discussion on the future of the public toilets and the car parks. The lease for the car parks runs out next year and we need to be prepared. The feeling of the council is that the public toilets are of great importance, but would benefit from improvement. How we manage the car parks in future depends on agreement with Wiltshire Council and there are many ways in which we could finance them in the future.

One further matter of a personal nature came up at the meeting. In the general election campaign, I was asked for, and gave an endorsement for, a friend who was contesting our parliamentary constituency. With the snap election, I hadn't time to see a proof of the leaflet and my endorsement was signed with my name, but also Chair of Mere Town Council. This was not how I sent in the endorsement, and I apologise for any upset it may have caused where readers thought the endorsement was from the Council.

We have just been informed, by Wiltshire Council, that it is intending to permanently close the mini recycling site network across the county. This will include the mini recycling site located at Salisbury Street Car Park, which will close on 18th July with the containers being physically removed shortly after this date. We will be discussing this matter at our July Town Council meeting (3rd July) and if you have any views on this, please let us know.

I had the pleasure of visiting the launch of the Flower and Music festival and may I compliment all involved in a splendid occasion.

I often meet people who have concerns and recommendations about Mere, and I now have an email for you to write to share your ideas if you aren't able to catch up with me. WEST KNOYLE PARISH COUNCIL

The Chairman writes:

The Parish Council met on 16th May for the Annual Parish Meeting and the Annual Parish Council meeting where I was re-elected as Chairman, and Paul Yates was re-elected as Vice-Chairman for the coming year, and we welcomed our two new members, Cathleen Hoskins and Tony Davis. I congratulated George Jeans on his re-election as Wiltshire Councillor and thanked our Clerk, Lindsey Wood, for her guidance and advice.

With regard to Wiltshire Council's response to the C297 New Close (the road leading from the village up to Willoughby Hedge) it was reported that Wiltshire Council's engineer had visited the site and will be making the arrangements with their contractor to carry out work on the edges and verges later this year. It will need a temporary road closure to allow them to work safely so consideration will need to be given to the availability of diversion routes and the timing of the works.

Following an internal audit of the Parish Council's accounts, kindly carried out by Mr. Derek Ward, the Parish Council approved the accounts and supporting statements for the year ending 31st March 2017, and the Annual Return was completed and signed so that it could be submitted to the external auditors appointed by the Audit Commission. GEORGE JEANS, WILTSHIRE COUNCILLOR, WRITES:

I have just returned from a two-week holiday, the first two-week holiday ever I think, to many communications that need attention. I could only monitor the e-mails once while away when I saw the relining of the Salisbury Street car park had been postponed due to several events taking place at the same time as the proposed work. We in Mere have a local community diary in the library and I hope more attention will be paid to it

in the future. The relining is wanted sooner rather than later. Events taking place, amongst others, were the well attended Mere Model Railway exhibition and Open Gardens.

I have also noted the mini recycling site in Mere Salisbury Street car park will be closed on Monday, 17th July and I will investigate to see if some facility could continue.

I stated last month that the Old Ship Hotel, Mere now has permission for 7 flats and two houses. I understand enforcement action has been taken against the Old Ship Hotel preventing it being used as a house of multiple occupation. If it should be left unused for a lawful use over a long period, I fear it may deteriorate further.

The Police informed the newly formed South West Wiltshire Community Safety Partnership (SWWCSP) at the Nadder Centre, Tisbury, that two people have been arrested and charged who are associated with beauty spot thefts in the South West Area Board area. Locally it has been reported to me two people have had their cars broken into, smashed windows, and bags stolen near Rock Arch, Stourton. Alfred's Tower has been targeted for years. The Police indicated these arrests might ease the situation, as I understood it was suggested it only takes a few thieves to make it appear there are more thieves involved than is actually the case.

SWWCSP will meet four times a year, with invited representatives from Wiltshire Police and Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service. Being the Area Board representative, I did agree to chair the first meeting and subsequent meetings, which I enjoyed. Draft terms of reference were circulated. It was decided that a recurring agenda item would be one that allowed current priority policing request for the area including, Mere, Tisbury and Wilton, generated from the safety partnership. Several facts were given at the first meeting. Please note litter-clearing and removing fly-tipping cost Wiltshire Council £2.5 million a year. The use of covert cameras was discussed to help dissuade fly-tipping offenders.

The Police often run in this area at reduced capacity. By the end of 2018 it is hoped across Wiltshire to increase the number of specials constables from 140 to 500. Note: special constables have the power of arrest. Those wishing to apply can include those just retired from full time employment, should they be sufficiently physically fit. Some specialist Special Constables are being trained to target rural crime such as hare coursing and all the problems that can and do arise from these activities. Salisbury and Wilton CCTV will be switched back on later this year. Wiltshire Police and now the Fire and Rescue service both have two drones each. The Police stated theirs have better high definition cameras than does the Police helicopter. Community Speed Watch groups can now make use of a Police Car - and no I do not think the use of the vehicle is for pursuing offenders by civilian volunteers!

The Dorset and Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service will be introducing a service similar to what was 'first responders' for medical emergencies. It is not unusual for the fire

service to respond within five minutes, which is often very much quicker than an ambulance would be able to attend a medical emergency.

The South West Area Board still has funds to help fund community projects and the youth, do you have a project?

At a recent South West Wiltshire Area Board Meeting, it has been agreed to enhance Speed Indicator Devices by the roadside, known as SIDs. Town, Parish or a collaborative scheme can apply to the Board for a grant to help purchase their own SID, or in this area, the community SID can also be used. Contact me if you need further information.

I would remind you once again that the Mere Snooker club is in danger of closing unless more members can be found. Very recently, after publicity, some have come forward. If any of you in Mere, West Knoyle, Zeals, Stourton or Kilmington would like to play Snooker, please consider the above if you would like to play.

MERE RIVERS GROUP AGM & Open Evening

Mere Rivers Group (MRG) was very pleased with the attendance and interest shown at its recent AGM and Open Meeting.

The official business, when MRG committee members were re-elected en-bloc, was followed by short talks with question and answer sessions on various aspects of Mere's rivers. These included geology, history, ecology, AIM, future demand for water and water saving initiatives.

Important points to record from the meeting are :-

- Welcome recognition by representatives of Gillingham Town Council of the strain continuing development puts on Mere's rivers. The mayor elect, Belinda Ridout, attended the meeting along with councillor David Walsh, portfolio holder for planning at North Dorset, and both took MRG's concerns seriously.
- 2) Michael Streeter, editor of the Gillingham News, attended and gave the meeting front-page coverage with a further inside report in the paper's June issue. Gillingham residents should now be more aware that their water comes from Mere and that demand effects its rivers.
- 3) MRG had commissioned a report on the quality of water in the Upper Shreen. This highlighted the danger of putting garden waste on river banks or in the stream as extra nutrients from this have leached into the water causing excess algae and brown sludge. Please do not use river banks as a dumping ground for garden waste e.g. grass cuttings, weeds, hedge trimmings etc. In many cases, such as

Waterside, the grassy banks are the equivalent of street pavements, noone expects to see garden waste deposited on public pavements, so why think it acceptable on our river banks?

Please respect Mere's environment and dispose of garden waste properly or our rivers and river life will be harmed.
