Mere Town Council's last meeting was held on July 5th. Traditionally, the full council does not meet in August. This doesn't mean we have a month off, on the contrary, it is business as usual. During August it is often necessary to use "delegated powers" to address issues which have to be dealt with within a time frame e.g. planning, finance, management and maintenance, and this has been the case this year.

I am pleased to say that following the lifting of restrictions, we have now reopened all the toilets in the Salisbury Street car park, as well as all recreational facilities. Meetings of the Council can now take place without social distancing and mask wearing will be optional and they will continue in the foyer of Duchy Manor School for the time being. If you wish to attend a meeting, there is no need to contact the Clerk and you are very welcome to come along.

At the July meeting we said "good bye" to PC Richard Salter, who worked in Mere 2007 - 2015 and came back 2.5 years ago. The Council thanked him for his service and wished him a happy retirement. We were also introduced to PCSO Dan Gill who has taken over from Pete Tcherniawsky. I am sure you will see him about town.

For many years the Mere Carnival has taken place in September. Sadly, there was no Carnival last year and there will be no procession this year although I am pleased to report that the Carnival committee has decided to hold a Carnival Fun Day on **September 18th**. There will be lots of posters around town and you can read more about this in this edition of Mere Matters.

With the approach of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee next summer, a committee has been formed with representatives from the Town, the Parochial Church Council and Mere Town Council. The committee are planning events within the town and will be looking for suggestions on how to celebrate this occasion. Volunteers will also be needed to help on the day. We shall be kept up to date via Mere Matters and Mere Mutters. Mere Town Council awaits information from the official Pageant Master, who will advise us on national events in which we can participate.

I have received compliments on the painting of bins and railings around Mere and would like to thank our Street Orderly, Sam Doman, for this. Also, I would like to thank our groundsmen for keeping Mere looking so tidy. During lockdown, all our staff have worked so hard to keep up the maintenance and running of our town. Wiltshire Councillor ~ George Jeans Writes

For many years I have taken interest in the broadband intervention (subsidized) rollout and reported on it to the electorate. It has been reported that as from 2025, all households and businesses will need the internet to make telephone calls. This has not been well publicised. What happens to things like alarms, EPOS machines (Shop tills), door entry systems, CCTV, and faxes. Many businesses have already embraced an all-digital model, moving their communications to the cloud, making calls over the internet and embracing video conferencing. PSTN (public switched telephone network – the traditional landline network) lines will cease, it is said, in 2025. You will be able to keep your current number. One of the big advantages of digital systems over traditional landlines is that you can have the same number on multiple devices, computer, iPad or mobile phone, wherever you are. It means millions of customers will be online for the first time or perhaps rely on a mobile phone instead. Ofcom enforces telecoms providers have an obligation to ensure all households have access to the emergency services during power cuts. Analogue Telephone Adapter: The most common way

of using some existing phones is with an analogue telephone adaptor (ATA). ATAs allow you to connect a standard phone to the internet, allowing you to use your existing phone with the VoIP system. On the other hand, your call quality on VoIP will be affected by the state of your broadband line - slow internet can mean compromised phone calls. That said, so long as you're using a fibre optic line, all should be okay, in much of the Mere Area we have fibre to the cabinet which I hope will be OK, some are lucky and have fibre.

I would like to congratulate Mere Surgery who had the best rating in the whole of the NHS Bath and North East Somerset, Swindon and Wiltshire (BSW) CCG area with 100% of the 156 residents who completed the survey having a good experience at the practice.

Whilst attending the funeral of Reg Doman on Friday 6th August, I was hit by a downpour I had never experienced since possibly the mid-1970s when lightening hit the Church Tower. The Coop, Grove Building, Library and some private houses had flooding.

The forthcoming Environment Bill seeks to ensure that future rates of recycling are significantly increased by obligating producers of packaging to fund the full costs of collection and recycling. Government will introduce a Plastic Packaging Tax from April 2022. Manufacturers will be incentivised to use more easily recyclable materials under an Extended Producer Responsibility scheme from 2023, which will also see funding released to local authorities to support additional recycling of packaging, and also fund litter collection activities. A national Deposit Return Scheme is proposed that could significantly reduce the impact of littering of bottles and cans etc from late 2024. The Environment Bill also proposes to mandate consistency in local authority recycling collections, to include weekly collections of food waste, and free of charge garden waste collections, with additional service costs being met by government through the "new burdens" scheme. These proposals are currently subject to a second round of stakeholder consultation

Wiltshire Council have a policy of not cutting verges to September. I wish to see wildlife however I consider safety at junctions and other situations paramount. I have made high level complaints and some of the junctions and other problems have been addressed. There are further problems of thorns and walkers' eyes, pushing older walkers and cyclist further out in the carriageway or path and so it goes on.

Mere School ~ Children enter the dragon's den

Some years ago John Jordan (our then Chair of Governors) came up with the idea of collaborating with Mere's biggest employer – Hillbrush - to develop a Design Technology (DT) project for our year 6 children. He persuaded Chairman Philip Coward that it would be a great opportunity for our Year 6 children to visit the factory to see how the brushes are made, and to learn about the history of Hillbrush. The children then went



back to school to design their own brushes, before returning to Hillbrush to pitch their creations to the 'Hillbrush Dragons.' And so our Dragon's Den Brush Project began.

It has been one of our most successful projects, giving the children a real purpose for their learning and a valuable experience not available to many primary school children. Due to COVID restrictions, it was not possible to visit Hillbrush this year but we were determined to continue with the project. We used the Hillbrush website to find out about the history of the brush factory and the products they make and then one of the Hillbrush dragons - aka Phil Norris - came to school to listen to the children's pitches.

The children worked in small groups to think of an innovative new brush, draw their design, consider the materials it would be made from and how it would work. They then had to write a persuasive pitch about their product. In the pitches they had to include information on what was unique about their brush, who the target market would be, production and selling costs.

It is quite a daunting task for an adult to pitch to an expert, so you can imagine how scary it must be for ten and eleven year olds not only to have to present their pitch, but also to answer tricky questions on the spot.

This year the standard of pitches was extremely high. The children impressed our

dragon with their knowledge about their product, the professional and confident manner in which they spoke and their ability to answer those tricky questions. Usually certificates are presented to the winning group, but this year the children were so impressive that there were 2 winning groups and the Hillbrush have taken their designs to study further!

I have written thanking him for his strong advocacy for the Link Scheme and his work for our local community which has been much appreciated by our passengers and those receiving their prescriptions.

Our volunteer drivers are available to take you to medical appointments, including Covid vaccinations, and shopping, if resources allow. Once you have an appointment please call 01747 860096 to book a Link driver. Please try to give us 48 hours notice if possible, as we cannot guarantee to arrange last minute requests. Also, please remember that our co-ordinators work in their own homes so keep calls to 9-5 Monday to Friday and only use the **(01747 860096** number. Any other number you have recorded will most likely be a co-ordinator's private number. Please do not use it.

Following the Government's decision to reduce coronavirus restrictions on 19th July we have told our drivers that the use of our coronavirus safety guidelines is now optional. This means the driver and passenger can choose whether to wear a face covering while in the car and whether passengers have to sit in the back where this is practical. Where there are any concerns from either the passenger or the driver the default position is to carry on with the safety guidelines. Also, where the driver and passengers agree we can now take people from different households in the same car. Drivers still carry hand sanitiser and wipe down all surfaces that may have been touched by the passenger while in the car at the end of each trip. Mere U.R.C.

With the renovations in the church now completed, this seems a good time to look back at its history and then to look forward.

The first Congregational Church in Mere (now the United Reformed Church) opened in 1795 in Dark Lane on the present site of Jeans' showroom. Robert Butt, who financed the building of the church, also built a house for himself, which later became the Manse, the building



in Boar Street adjacent to the present church. The first minister to live in the Manse was John Hyatt. However, for the first year of his ministry and before moving into the Manse, he rode his horse from Sherborne to Mere each Sunday. (The present Minister enjoys a much easier journey!)

By 1852 the original church was too small and it was demolished and a larger one built on the same site. Although this was only used as a church for 16 years, it continued as a school until Duchy Manor opened in 1965.

The church on the present site was built in 1868 and there have been several alterations and improvements over the years. In 1993 the main area of the church was divided by a screen, leaving a smaller worship area and a hall that has been available both for church occasions and for public use.

The recent renovations have extended the area of the hall and modernised the whole layout. In addition to the worship area, there are now two rooms available for public use, one on the ground floor with a kitchen, the other in the old gallery area. This is reached either by stairs or a small lift. It is hoped that these two rooms will be well used by different organisations (either for one/off or for regular bookings) or for private functions. Enquiries re booking should at present be made to Mrs. Eileen Burfitt, **\$** 860685.

We have been asked if regular Saturday Coffee Mornings will be resumed. This will depend on finding volunteers to help. If you would be willing to help occasionally, please let us know.
