

Mere Town Council

I am pleased to report that a design for the refurbishment of the Walnut Road Play Area has been approved by the council and work will start there shortly. Also, the plans for the improvements to the footpath from Clements Lane to Angel Lane are coming along well. Both these projects will be funded from the contributions from the C J Fry's development of the old Hill Brush Factory site at Woodlands Road.

I regret that it has been necessary for me to order the closing of the public toilets in the Salisbury Street car park, from dusk 'til dawn, for a trial period of one month. The abuse and vandalism of the toilets has been building up over the past weeks and rectifying the damage is taking up a lot of our groundsmen's time. Not to mention the costs involved. The town council is keen to keep this free amenity going and we are currently considering plans and tenders for their refurbishment. However, encouraging signs of respect for the toilets is needed. We don't want to have to consider charging for their use.

A report on traffic issues made by a working group of councillors, was on the agenda at the February meeting. The group originally had a list of over a dozen suggestions for changes but in order to have credibility with Wiltshire Council it was necessary to give priority to the more pressing issues. These included, the repainting of all lines (double yellow lines and parking area as well as junction give way lines) & the reinstatement of the white line down the centre of Castle Street from The Malthouse to The Square. The on-street parking in Hazzards Hill and around the junctions of Water Street was the subject of much discussion and concerns were expressed, by members of the public attending the meeting, that the introduction of double-yellow lines right the way along the road would result in an increase in traffic speeds. It was agreed to ask a Highways Technician from Wiltshire Council to assess this and make a recommendation to the Council and also to assess and make recommendations for the problems associated with vehicles loading in Boar Street and the conflicts this sometimes causes for the Pettridge Lane priority system. The repainting of the old and faded lines is the responsibility of the Highways Authority and should bear no cost to the Town Council but the other work will require a contribution of 25% of the total cost by the Town Council.

The Annual Town meeting will be held at 7.00 pm on April 26th at the United **Reformed Church.** This is very much a meeting for the public to attend and to participate in. The Town Council would like to hear your suggestions for agenda items for this meeting so please contact the office (01747 860701) if you have an item you would like discussed.

Wiltshire Councillor ~ George Jeans Writes

We have tourists and visitors who use our many footpaths, pubs, hotels and more. I have been written to because the author finds it of real concern that one element of the Council's proposed budget will have a serious negative effect on our communities in Wiltshire. They refer to the proposed cessation of future funding of Wiltshire Council's partnership from 1 April 2024 managed by Visit Wiltshire (VW). Before the formation of VW each town/city in our county were undertaking their own promotion. In the period from 2000 - 2009 Wiltshire as a visitor destination experienced a year of little growth.

It is claimed "after the formation of VW the income in the tourism and hospitality sector in Wiltshire rose from £1billion in 2011 to £1.5billion in 2018 with employment increasing over the same period from 20,000 to 28,000 (9% of the county's workforce)."

It is further claimed "Any visitor destination whose Destination Management Organisation (DMO) is not accredited as a Local Visitor Economy Partnership (LVEP) would not be included on Visit England and Visit Britain (VE/VB) websites or in campaigns, would not be able to bid for Government/VE/VB tourism grant programmes, and would not have access to training programmes and travel trade and press visits support. VW has secured significant marketing campaign funding from government and has hosted many international and national tour operator and press visits to our county."

Mere Chamber of Trade paid an annual fee to VW, which they have ceased to do. It remains to be seen what cutting these funds to Visit Wiltshire will have on the Mere area.

I have always requested Mere Town Council calls the Mere Town Carnival AGM, as they have done historically. The Mere carnival committee is elected at the AGM. Should a committee fail to be formed, the following year the Carnival AGM will get called again by Mere Town Council and one would hope the carnival would not die for ever. Mere has had an Annual Carnival which has been organised by its Carnival Committee. This involves organising that large event once a year as well as smaller events like the Christmas Santa visit. Each year donations are made to local causes from the money raised by Carnival and its other events. The present Carnival Committee is a small group and is not able to carry on without new members to join in and actively take on roles through the year. Regular users of Wiltshire Council car parks are being encouraged to consider buying a parking season ticket as a more convenient way to commute and to save money. Having a season ticket can help drivers save approximately 50% on the daily rate at Wiltshire Council car parks. Currently a permit for the central long

stay car park in Salisbury, is £97 per month. Season tickets are available in one-month, three-month, six-month or 12-month options.

For the Salisbury/Water Street area of Mere, the January rain fall total of 24cm. was given to me by Penny Fennon. The wettest day was the 12th Jan - 4cm, rained on 13 days out of 31.

Recycling - let's sort it! - new campaign aims to reduce increase recycling and reduce contamination. Wiltshire Council is asking everyone in Wiltshire to help recycle more, by ensuring they put the correct things into their blue-lidded bins. They have seen an increase in items that can't be recycled through the kerbside collection scheme being put in blue-lidded bins. The Wiltshire Council waste crews will be stepping up their checks of recycling bins before emptying them, and from Monday 20th February they will attach an amber hanger to any contaminated bins they come across. This hanger will advise people that their blue-lidded bin has the wrong items in it, but it will still have been emptied on that collection. Then, from Monday 6th March, crews will begin rejecting more heavily contaminated containers and will attach a red hanger that explains why the bin has not been emptied. In these cases, residents will need to remove the contamination ready for their next scheduled collection. Some of the common items incorrectly placed in blue lidded bins include: Carrier bags and bin bags. Hard plastics, such as toys and plant pots, Scrap metals, and Nappies. The council has generated more than £2.7m in income from the sale of recyclable materials so far this financial year. This income is used to offset operational costs and allows the council to invest in essential services. However, the income could have been far greater if there was less contamination in people's bins.

King Charles III's coronation will take place on Saturday 6th May 2023 at Westminster Abbey in London. Zeals are well on course with their commemorative function. Mere will have flags through the main streets, which I will help with.

Road condition, fading of yellow and white lines remain a high priority. I can continue to request for remedial work which is often a bag of tarmac in a pot hole, I have twice requested time scales for resurfacing in the Mere Division and I am still awaiting a reply, I shall pursue until I receive a reply.

It was Dad's wish to go home so I will post about the funeral arrangements when they have been made.





We had a busy start to 2023 with 92 trips in January 26 of which were to Salisbury District Hospital.

I mentioned last month that Link drivers did 975 trips in 2022 (982 in 2021) covering 36,761 miles (31,313 in 2021) and our volunteers worked 3,541 hours (3,893 in 2021). One of our volunteers, Elaine Noble has kindly produced an infographic of our work in 2022 which I hope you find interesting.

I expect you are aware that we have had some building works at school to accommodate the children from the new houses in Mere and a wonderful new car park and drop off zone. We were extremely grateful for the community patience when contractors were on site!

As a condition of planning permission for the new car park we had to update our Travel Plan. This document has now been approved and Mrs Cocker and Mrs Shannon will be taking control of our Travel Plan with help from our School and Eco Councils.

Thank you to the community, parents and staff for contributing to the document.

The aim of our travel plan is:

to support students, parents, carers and visitors in travelling to and from the school in active and sustainable ways where possible to reduce the proportion of private cars at the school gate.

The objectives to achieve this are to:

- 1 improve the safety of all users, particularly those walking, wheeling and cycling.
- 2 improve the air quality surrounding the school and reduce exposure to harmful pollutants.
- 3 help support and encourage people living within Mere to travel to the school by walking, wheeling and cycling.
- 4 support and encourage people driving to the school to car share and 'Park and Stride' where possible.
- 5 reduce unsafe parking practices and make the trip to and from school a safe, healthy and social one.

The plan noted that 'footways in Mere are poor, pedestrian safety on White Road was a concern and there is a lack of cycle routes'. However, the new car park had made a significant positive impact on the safety of our children and the access roads leading to the school.

We will continue to work closely with you and the Town Council to make Mere and the school site as safe as possible for our children and their families.

Letter from the Churches

What's holy about Holy Week?

What is Christianity? Is it a set of out of date theories...or a quaint folk tale from long ago that we can now discard...or an emotional prop for sad, inadequate people who need an imaginary friend?

During *Holy Week*, the week that leads up to Easter Day, Christian churches all over the world, including our own parish church which has stood for hundreds of years at the heart of our community, celebrate events that are rooted in history. These events took place in the city of Jerusalem, then in the Roman province of Judea. The events are recorded not only in the texts that came to be included in the Bible, but also by historians of the Roman Empire, such as Josephus.

Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, when the crowds lining the road expected him to lead an uprising against the Roman authorities, is celebrated on *Palm Sunday*. The Last Supper when he washed his disciples' feet as a sign of servant leadership and associated the bread and wine, elements of the Passover meal, with his body and blood, is celebrated on the evening of *Maundy Thursday*. His journey to the place of execution and his death by crucifixion is celebrated on *Good Friday*. His resurrection is celebrated often during the night between Saturday and Sunday but here in Mere, at daybreak on the Sunday we call *Easter Day*.

These events *are* the Christian faith. The story of Holy Week is the story of God, whom many of us struggle to grasp, picture or understand, entering human experience in the knowable person of Jesus of Nazareth. It's a story of love triumphing over hatred, self-sacrifice triumphing over self-interest, forgiveness triumphing over enmity and of life triumphing over death. In a whole host of ways these are things that our world desperately needs today, as we see every time we watch the news coming to us from around the globe.

In St Michael's Church, in common with churches worldwide, the events of Holy Week are celebrated so that we can enter the story and connect with it: no longer a vague theory or an old folk tale but something we can experience for ourselves, today. All are welcome to come and explore what's taking place day by day during the week that's called *Holy Week*: 2nd to 9th April.
