Mere Town Council

We had our Annual Town Meeting at the end of April. This year we tried something new. While we felt there were many benefits, we shall be looking at how we can improve further the opportunity for all of the groups in Mere to be represented and to give residents the chance to question and suggest how the town progresses. The real ambition is to make this a more popular event in the Mere calendar and to have more residents participate. The town council will be publishing responses to the questions raised, at the meeting, on our website, on social media and in the minutes,

The Town Council also had its Annual meeting at which I was returned as the Chairman for the coming year, ably supported by Glen Ings as the Vice Chair. Councillors were allocated roles as representatives with external bodies and they will soon be contacting those groups and associations. Our Clerk presented the council with the end of year budget and expenditure report which shows that our accounts are in good order and our balance is sufficient to meet our ambitions for the coming year. A more thorough eye than ours, the auditors, will be giving the accounts a final check but I am confident that they will confirm our opinion.

Our next meeting is not on the first Monday of the month but on the **10th of June**, do look through the published agenda, which is on our website and in the display case in front of the Lecture Hall. It may be that there is something for which you would wish to speak in the public session or something which you want to hear the councillors discuss. Our clerk publishes the agenda at least three working days before our meetings.

We will be represented at the wreath laying and last post at the **War Memorial** on the **6**th **June at 11 am**. On the advice of the Royal British Legion, this will be a simple but meaningful commemoration of the **80**th **Anniversary of D-Day Normandy landings**.

Planning for AIM, Activities in Mere continues and it looks like the **9th to 11th of August** will have many opportunities for the over fifties to try new activities or to revisit ones they used to take part in. Personally, I am booking myself in for the Modern Jive dancing session and hoping there is enough swivel left in my hips to not embarrass whomever is my dancing partner.



Wiltshire Councillor ~ George Jeans Writes

It has recently been the busy time of year when all Parish Councils locally have their Annual Parish Meetings also annual council meetings when chairmen and others are appointed. I sit on Mere Town Council and I regularly attend Zeals, West Knoyle, Stourton with Gasper and Kilmington Parish Councils. I try and attend most Annual Parish Meetings, at Zeals those present received a presentation regarding Blackmore Vale North Read Easy, which is a body of people who help those to read who otherwise find it difficult. If you can encourage someone to approach them, they would be pleased to help. Text 'call me" or phone Fran on 07594318571. Also at the same meeting Zeals News were asking for more detailed and interesting input. The new Chairman of Wiltshire Council is Bridget Wayman who lives locally. The new Vice Chairman is Chris Newbury the who has sat on Wiltshire Council since its inception in 2009 as I have.

July 4th is usually mentioned in the media as it is American Independence Day, this year the medias priority will probably be voting in one of Wiltshire's 300 plus polling stations, REMEMBER please, photographic identification is now a mandatory requirement. Accepted forms of photo ID include passports, photographic driving licences, biometric immigration documents, and certain concessionary travel passes. A comprehensive list can be found at Voter ID | Electoral Commission. Alternatively, if people have a Voter Authority Certificate, because they don't have photo ID, they should bring that along to vote. If you want more information on Voter ID and what to do if you don't have photo ID, please visit Registering to vote - Wiltshire Council. Also remember to apply for a postal vote or proxy vote should you require, the provision date to apply for a proxy vote for the 2024 General Election is 19th June, 2024, postal vote application will need to be applied for sooner than the proxy vote application of the 19th June.

Please note, Wiltshire Household recycling centres, which our nearest is Warminster, now stop all vans from the 13th May. A permit costing £20 is now required which is annoying to some who appear to have a valid permit. Despite officers emailing me saying now cars with trailers are allowed, they have now agreed a trailer up to 1.8 metres is allowed on a car.

The Council Chamber was full recently at Trowbridge largely because of a notice of motion regarding Solar Farms to consider the following motion submitted in accordance with the constitution:

"Whilst not opposed to the principle of the development of solar farms in line with the National Planning Policy Framework, this Council is increasingly concerned at the concentration of solar farms, battery storage and associated infrastructure in Wiltshire. Some villages are now completely surrounded by solar farms and their continued concentration represents a significant cumulative impact and industrialisation of the countryside. Wiltshire Council therefore calls on the Secretary of State for the Department of Levelling Up, Housing and Communities to define more closely what is meant by 'cumulative impact' regarding solar farms and to take clear steps to ensure that solar developments are more evenly spread across the UK and not concentrated in specific areas effectively industrialising the countryside.

We would also ask for clarity of the priority given to ensuring that food production and farming are not destroyed as industries in specific areas through an excessive concentration of solar farms given the massive impact that would have on the rural way of life in villages that have been farmed for time immemorial. "

The motion was passed largely as above with agreement with most councillors present.

I have attended the Postmaster Conference at Warwick recently. Some Postmasters in very built-up areas are doing well however many are working for less than the minimum wage. The Government and many want the Post Office to survive, with some claiming about 200 have closed in recent years and the Post Office seem to be claiming there are still about 11500 Post Offices and about 7000 Postmasters, someone is possibly wrong. It appears many Drop and Go points have opened which seems to be classed as a Post Office. I was interested for our area what additional services and hence income may be on the horizon for Post Offices I could hear of none except retail which many Post Offices have done as an extra for decades.

Wiltshire Council has made an Order to temporarily close the roads below to all vehicles. The Order, which previously came into operation on 23 October 2023 will now recommence on 29 June 2024. It is required to enable carriageway patching, surface dressing and associated maintenance works. Access will be maintained where possible although delays are likely due to the nature of the works. The closures are anticipated to take place between 29 June 2024 and 03 August 2024.

- 1. The roads affected will be Bells Lane, Zeals and Stourton with Gaspar; from its junction with C380 to its junction with High Street.
- 2. Butts Lane, Kilmington; from its junction with New Road to its junction with Cokers Lane.

Wiltshire Council supports "No Mow May", a national campaign that looks to allow grass to remain unmown for the month to create habitats for pollinators. As ever, the challenge is to find a compromise that attempts to meet the requirements of those who want grass cut regularly, and those who would rather grass was left to grow to encourage wildlife to thrive. Wiltshire also have to ensure highways are safe, and that communities still have opportunities to play, for example, on community football pitches. This May, as in previous years, Wiltshire have continued to support No Mow May, but only in specific areas.

Wiltshire Council has created the Wiltshire Summer Arts Programme, cultural, creative and entertaining activities taking place across the county throughout this summer for everyone to take part and enjoy. The programme includes information from large arts events such as the Devizes Outdoor Arts Festival and Salisbury International Arts Festival through to local village fetes. So, whether people are looking for something to entertain the kids, or a workshop to have a go at and take part in, the programme contains a wide range of activities and events to suit all ages and abilities. A review of the boundaries of Mere town was requested by Mere Town Council, specifically in relation to the boundary with Zeals near and including The Hill Brush site. Full Council have voted for this area to become part of Mere and not Zeals as it is at present. I abstained as I represent both Mere and Zeals, their Town and Town Parish Council was not in agreement with the proposal.

Wiltshire Council has confirmed that holders of Wiltshire concessionary bus passes will be able to use their passes for travel from 9am on local bus services on weekdays from 1 May.

I am pleased to report, Wiltshire Police has been taken out of 'special measures' due to the significant and sustained improvements made to the service it provides

Penny Fennon gave April rainfall for Salisbury Street as 18.5cm with the 1st April being the wettest with 4cm of rain.

Fostering is highlighted with an attended stall at County Hall. I learnt from that stall that some children when fostered must be fostered as a family of children, which for example could be three children. Wiltshire are still short of placements for foster children and looking for those interested. There are situations that arise unexpectedly which mean young people need emergency care and support at short notice. Foster carers under this scheme provide temporary emergency care to any child or young person needing a safe place to stay until a suitable home is found. Young people in this situation are dealing with uncertainty and may also be traumatised and will need extra support. Emergency foster carers receive £900 per week per child when they have a child to stay with them and £500 per week when they don't have foster children to care for. The council would like to recruit more carers to help meet the demand.

John Larcombe, John Phillips, John Mitchell, Henry Jukes, Charles Lander, and eleven others, in all 16 persons, indicted for feloniously rioting on the 1st of June, 1835, and with force and arms, collecting to disturb the peace near there, and destroying a cottage, situate in the road leading from Mere to Shaftesbury, which had, it was alleged, been in the possession of Mr. Brine and his family for a period of 35 years, were acquitted.

Hospital visits in 2022 and again in 2023 stopped me going to London for the Garden Parties and the State Funeral but last week my wife (Anne) and I finally made it to Buckingham Palace. I understand that there were some 8,000 in attendance. How we were all served with sandwiches, cakes and cups of tea was remarkable. It was absolutely amazing to think that the vast majority

> attending were also being honoured with invites for their services. It was a wonderful to witness; pomp and ceremony at its very best and to be able to

glimpse sight of Prince William and the other Royals through tiny gaps between a vast assortment of umbrellas fending off the stair-rods falling from on high. It didn't let up all afternoon but we just ignored it.

I know I bang on about volunteers, but without the 109 who helped make life bearable by collecting medications, shopping, posting, walking the dogs, checking on neighbours etc etc;, lockdown would have been far worse for many. Not all communities rose to the challenge as Mere did, and once again I salute you all for supporting those who were in need.

The medal has my name engraved around the periphery but I like to think the wording reads: *Mere Covid Volunteers*.

In April we again did 104 trips so we are still averaging 100 trips per month this year. As ever, Salisbury District Hospital was the busiest destination with 26 trips.

One of our passengers, James Bunton, says I have been using the Link Scheme for eleven years and during that time have found the co-ordinators and drivers very helpful and friendly. When I had more serious medical issues the link scheme provided a simple way to attend my hospital appointments without stress and I still use them for medical appointments that would be difficult to get to by other means.

Do you want to volunteer as a Link driver? We are a local charity and we take clients to medical appointments, including Covid vaccinations, and even shopping when resources allow. New drivers are always welcome. You choose when you want to drive, use your own car and we pay 45p/mile to cover your costs. If you are interested in volunteering as a driver, please call our co-ordinator on 01747 860096.

If you want to use the Link, once you have an appointment, please call 01747 860096 to book a driver. As a charity we do not charge for trips but ask for a donation. Please remember that our co-ordinators work in their own homes – we do not have an office - so please keep calls to 9-5 Monday to Friday and only use the 01747 860096 number. Also, it is a great help if you can give us a minimum of 48 hours notice (not including Saturdays and Sundays). Our co-ordinator has to ring round to find a driver who is available to take you to your appointment and we cannot guarantee our co-ordinator will be at home to arrange last minute requests.

Mere Rivers Group

April showed a slight reprieve to the very wet weather of the previous few months. An average of 68mm of rain fell across Wessex, 128% of the long term average. While April was not a record breaking month in terms of rainfall, the last 3, 6 and 12 months have been the wettest since records began in 1871. Monthly mean river flows were exceptionally high, notably high or above normal across the area. Throughout April

reservoir levels for Wessex Water remained close to 100%, with Bristol Water reservoir levels remaining consistent at around 95% capacity.

Both our streams are still running well and do not need stream support, but the effect of the winter storms has been to change the river beds and bringing to the surface broken glass and china which was previously buried. With the warmer weather coming more children will be paddling in the streams so please make sure that they are wearing something on their feet. Dogs in the streams are also at risk, so be aware.



Portland Bird Observatory have reported a reduction in the numbers of House Martins arriving this year, this appears to be

the same in Mere, plenty of Swifts and Swallows but not Martins. Have you found the same?
