Mere Town Council

While we do not usually have a Town Council meeting in August, the day-to-day work of the council goes on. Where important matters need dealing with then some of these are delegated to myself and our clerk, or we poll councillors by post. Several planning matters have arisen this summer and we have responded. I was asked, the other day, if I or the Town Council could report another resident to the Wiltshire Planning Enforcement team with regard to something they felt a neighbour should not be able to do. My reply has to be that the town council decided some years ago not to take on Enforcement complaints for residents so that they could remain anonymous. Certainly, if the Town Council decides that there is an infringement of planning conditions then we would ask Wiltshire Council follow it up – but we have not the resources, nor the expertise take on requests on behalf of residents. However, we have recently been informed by Wiltshire Council that enforcement reports DO remain anonymous and this is confirmed on their website. If you feel that a planning breach has taken place, please contact Wiltshire Council's Enforcement Team – here is a link to the relevant page on their website:

My time, this past weekend, was largely devoted to AIM – Activities In Mere. All sorts or activities for over-50s were held across the Town. Over 500 participants in 23 activities over the three days was inspiring and it would seem that it will lead to new groups taking up activities on a permanent basis. Something of this scale does not happen on its own and a second big thank you goes to the council team and volunteers and donors who made it happen. I didn't make the Zumba but the axe throwing was great fun. I do appreciate that I had said that I would be jiving on Saturday but I was worn out by then, whereas, many people attended more than half of the activities and Angela Williams managed 16 of the 23!

I find it heartening to see our community engaged with such enthusiasm and I know that the next step is to plan what to do next and to try to get even more residents taking part - watch this space!

The next meeting of the town council is on the 2nd September at Duchy Manor – do come along, watch democracy in action and do consider taking an active role.

Report from Town Clerk

Over the next few weeks, the Town Council will be considering making its response to the new government's Consultation on the proposed reforms to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) – the consultation runs from Tuesday, 30th July until Tuesday, 24th September – here is the link to the consultation

The National Planning Policy Framework acts as the rulebook for planning in England and plays a key role in guiding what gets built where. The proposed changes will introduce mandatory housing targets for each planning authority. The housing target for Wiltshire under the current framework requires delivery of 1917 houses per annum. Under the proposed framework it will require delivery of 3476 houses per annum - a percentage increase of 81%. This means an extra 23,385 houses will need to be built in the 15-year Local Plan period to 2038.

Most of these extra homes will need to be provided in the rural areas rather than the urban areas.

Wiltshire Council held an hour-long webinar on 14th August for people to find out more about the Government's proposed changes to the NPPF and how it is likely to affect Wiltshire. We would urge all residents with an interest in the future of planning developments in Wiltshire and, more particularly in south-west Wiltshire, to find out more and respond to the consultation.

Wiltshire Councillor ~ George Jeans Writes

I attended all but one of the 23 AIM (Activities in Mere), many people were present over 3 days, it was an absolutely great event. I also attended Mere Proms at St Michael's Church on July 13th, it was truly a fantastic event. On other dates there was the excellent Stourton Flower and Produce Show. Mr Rose made a 17th/18th century iron candlestick, so nice to see local iron workers creations and the flowers. Then there was the Zeals show. I attended Stourton and Kilmington Home Guard Club Fete and a fund raiser at Street Farm. I have attended most if not all local Town and Parish meetings. There are so many other functions it is impossible to get to them all.

There is at present two planning development consultations underway, which you can participate in. One is regarding but not limited to, a possible 81% increase over existing projections of housing numbers for Wiltshire which the Mere Town Council has publicised this elsewhere in Mere Matters

The second consultation is, Regulation 19 consultation, Tuesday 20 August - Friday 4 October 2024 re the draft Gypsies and Travellers Development Plan Document. The consultation will be an opportunity to make representations on the draft Plan before it is submitted for independent Examination in 2025. To enable you to find out more about the Gypsies and Travellers Development Plan Document and ask questions, Wiltshire Council are holding five engagement events at different locations around the county and one online engagement event. You can just turn up at the in-person drop-in events. If you wish to attend the online event, you must sign up beforehand. You can sign up for the webinar on Tuesday 3 September, 6pm-7.30pm,

Wiltshire Council has issued a £1,000 fly-tipping fixed penalty notice (FPN) to a Zeals resident following an investigation by Environmental Enforcement Officers. The fly-tipped mattress was reported to the council in May 2024 by a member of the public, who witnessed it being dumped in a layby off Bells Lane in Zeals. This witness received a reward under the council's We're Targeting Fly-tippers campaign.

On 17 July, Wiltshire's volunteer Tree Wardens visited Stourhead for a guided tour of the grounds from the estate management team to learn more about how they look after the trees at this internationally important National Trust location.

I sit on the Police and Crime Panel of Wiltshire Council, therefore the following is of interest to me and may be to you. The percentage of crime that were solved in the 2023-24 financial year by Wiltshire Police has been requested by a councillor. The OPCC have come back with the following:

Further action taken (FAT) rates reflects specific action the police have taken to progress justice e.g., a charge, caution, out of court disposal. This covers all crime (42,000+) From May 23-24 annual further action taken levels are at 16.5%. This is up 3.% from last year. The current figure for May is 17.9% which is extremely high. We examine specific crime types to understand further and make improvements, for example rape and serious sexual offences. The majority of crime types are seeing improving FAT levels, with a few stable. Wiltshire Police have significantly improved

performance in the last year and continue to do so. Wiltshire are now performing very well compared with other similar forces and nationally.

The Police and Crime Commissioner's Community Action Fund Grants support voluntary groups to deliver activities in line with priorities 2, 3 and 4 of the Wiltshire and Swindon Police and Crime Plan 2022-25. Grants are up to £5,000 for one year and can be used to fund activities which will address the following priorities: 1. Reduce violence and serious harm 2. Tackle crimes that matter most to local communities 3. Improve the experience of victims and deliver justice

Wiltshire Council launched a brand-new web app to help both residents and visitors to Wiltshire find events and activities near them, all year round. Explore Wiltshire Events enables people to search for events based on location, category, date and available amenities.

Wiltshire Council is investing £380,000 in new car park machines throughout the county and the installation of these new machines will start in car parks in Marlborough. The new payment machines will give customers the choice of paying for their parking using cash or contactless with a card or mobile device. People can also continue to pay using the MiPermit app or by text. The new machines are compliant with the Equality Act 2010 and all locations have been reviewed in line with the Department for Transport Inclusive Mobility guidance, with ramps installed where appropriate and ensuring the machines are positioned to allow easier access for all users.

I have the following items if you have Community use for them, for short term free loan If you have any use at any local community function for a small free standing amp and microphone, or a buzz wire and stand that the user tries to get wand around without making a buzz, I have both for free borrowing, insurance not included.

Penny Fennon gave July rainfall for Salisbury Street as 23.5cm with the 6th May being the wettest with 7cm of rain. From 05/07 to 09/07 19cm fell. Pam Baldock gave July rainfall for Lordsmead as 99.5mm. Wettest day July 5th 37mm.

Wiltshire are still short of placements for foster children. Wiltshire will provide with ongoing support and training. Fostering with your local council of Wiltshire means all money goes into fostering. Wiltshire Council payments to foster carers reflect the importance Wiltshire Council place on fostering.

All were free thanks to initially being partly funded by the Wiltshire Towns Program then other sponsors came on board. Dr David Longbourne MBE, May 1927 to March 2024.

David served Mere over 5 decades. He was excellent at music and attended Winchester when young and became a Naval Doctor before coming to Mere as Doctor in the 1960s. David supported St Michael's Church and was very much involved in researching the history of Mere, publishing a well-respected local history book titled 'The Book of Mere'.

David was honoured with the MBE for creating the awardwinning Mere Museum which was founded in 1970. He started as curator in 1984 and remained in post for 22 years.



A very well attended remembrance service was held at St Michael's Church on Wednesday 10th July. The weather was kind and a wake was held in the wonderful garden of Dr Longboune's house, The Old Rectory at Church Street, Mere.

Mere Proms concert hits the right note for celebration!



On Saturday 13th July The Friends of Mere Church hosted a Proms concert for the Mere community to celebrate the completed restoration of St Michael's wonderful medieval church tower.

Over 400 people crowded into the Churchyard to listen to the 26 players of The Shrewton Silver Band play classics from the film Brassed Off as well as movie themes and all the well-loved songs from the Last Night of the Proms.

In August 2023 the National Lottery Heritage Fund awarded The Friends of St Michael's Church £247,000 to undertake two programmes of work. The first was to restore the church pinnacles, the gilded pennants and the face of the church clock. The second, to undertake a series of practical and creative events to involve and enrich the Mere community through its heritage. These are known as **The Tower Stories**. The Proms in Mere was the first Tower Stories event which will continue through until June 2025.

As well as the enormous generosity of the national lottery players, Mere is also indebted to the generosity of the Garfield Weston Foundation, The Fudge Trust, The Wiltshire Historic Churches Trust and donations from the Friends of St Michael's church.



Register for Priority Services

Disruption to essential services like electricity can sometimes happen and it affects our everyday lives. For some, a power cut can be worrying or difficult.

Most of the companies who keep the lights on, TVs running, and homes and businesses heated throughout the year can offer extra advice and support for when there is an interruption to the power supply.

What is the PSR and who is eligible?

- Have a disability.
- Live with children under five.
- Have a chronic illness.
- Have anxiety, depression or any mental health condition.
- Loss or impairment of smell.
- Need documents translated into another format or language.
- Temporarily need extra support.
- Everyone has different needs. Contact your distributor to discuss your requirements.

Solar Together

Following the success of the previous schemes in 2022 and 2023, Wiltshire Council has launched a third solar together scheme with Swindon Borough Council and independent group-buying experts, iChoosr.

Solar Together is a group buying initiative where residents can club together to get the best prices for solar panels and installation as well as battery storage and EV chargers from trusted providers.

The process is straightforward with dedicated support throughout and residents can expect to make a 10-25% saving against the market average.



The previous schemes have delivered 1,110 installations, totalling more than 10,660 solar panels and resulting in over £11 million invested by residents into the green economy. All of the schemes combined are also estimated to lead to a reduction of 22,000 tonnes of CO2 over the 25-year guaranteed lifetime of the solar panels installed.

The scheme is a great way to reach the climate goals for the county and for residents to save money on their energy bills, and even sell excess energy back to the national grid.

Grove Building Projection and Sound Improvements

I'm delighted to say that the Grove Building has been granted ± 5000 from the South West Wiltshire Area Board (SWWAB) as a



contribution towards much needed improvement of our projection and so und arrangements. This is part of the "All Together" initiative supporting community activities in Wiltshire and puts Grove Building in line with other village halls in the County. I've been ably supported by Richard Jefferies and Rosie Jordan-Barr in achieving this success.

For some time we have been considering how to modernise and improve the facilities in Grove Building. Increasingly, organizations hiring the building require technical arrangements which our current equipment is incapable of meeting. Our Trustees (the St Michael's PCC) have agreed a plan to upgrade the projection and sound facilities. We will be able to show slides and films in high definition, and to reproduce music and speech with clarity for both the direct audience and those using the loop hearing aid system. Being able to show films in Mere over the winter is a positive boost to local entertainment opportunities.

The overall cost will be £13,000, including VAT. Along with the £5000 from SWWAB (helped by our Wiltshire Councillor) we are providing £3000 from Grove Building reserves accumulated over several years. Once again Mere Town Council have shown their commitment to improving facilities in the Town and we thank them for a contribution of £500. We are now close enough to our target to proceed to final selection of a supplier which will be made in the next few weeks.

We thank the several groups who use the Grove Building who have already contributed to achieving our target amount and look forward to other contributions to complete the funding. A full list of contributors will be presented when the project is complete.

<u>Public Consultation on proposed Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) to extend the</u> <u>30mph speed limit along Shaftesbury Road:</u>

Mere Town Council has requested, through Wiltshire Council's Local Highways & Footpath Improvement Group (LHFIG) process, that the 30mph speed limit currently in place on the C59 Shaftesbury Road, Mere be extended to cover the section of road currently subject to a 40mph speed limit to ensure that there is a consistent speed limit in place along the road.

An independent speed limit assessment arranged through the South West Wiltshire LHFIG considered the introduction a 30mph speed limit to be appropriate for the length of road in question when assessed against the criteria for introducing a 30mph speed limit detailed on DfT Circular 1/13 Setting Local Speed Limits.

The Traffic Regulation Order currently being consulted upon proposes the extension of the 30mph speed limit to cover the length of the C59 Shaftesbury Road currently subject to a 40mph speed limit.

Deposit copies of the Order, plans and Statement of the Council's Reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at the offices of Wiltshire Council, County Hall, Bythesea Road, Trowbridge during normal office hours. Details of the proposed scheme may be seen at Mere Library, Barton Lane BA12 6JA during the hours of 10am to 7pm Monday, 9.30am to 5pm Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 10am to 2pm Wednesday and 9.30am to 1pm Saturday until 23rd September 2024. 
We have reached the final of the Westbrook League, Harold Ford Cup which will be played on 23rd August at Salisbury.
