Wiltshire Councillor ~ George Jeans Writes

I continue to attend Town and Parish Council meetings in the Mere Division of Wiltshire Council, as well as many community events, keeping in touch with what the majority want and publicising information where I can. I have been amazed by the funds raised recently: £12,500 from Mere School Fireworks, around £23,000 for the Bobby Van at a local function I attended, and—over the border in Somerset—I was told one event raised more than £30,000.

All library buildings across the county offer a warm and welcoming space for anyone to spend time in during the colder months. All Wiltshire libraries provide a friendly environment where people can relax, read, get online, access information and advice, or simply have a chat. Many libraries also host winter activities, including communal jigsaw tables, crafting groups, and other sessions designed to bring people together.

Wiltshire Libraries will be joining libraries nationwide in celebrating Green Libraries Week 2025 – a national campaign highlighting how libraries can help build a more sustainable future. Running from Monday 27 October to Sunday 2 November, this year's theme is "Seeds of Change – Make a Difference with Your Library." Activities will include free energy-advice drop-in sessions; demonstrations of thermal-imaging cameras to help identify heat loss (with information on how to borrow a camera for free); and eco-themed events for all ages, including green rhyme times, story times and child-friendly drop-ins.

As temperatures drop, Wiltshire Council's highways teams are preparing for winter with the return of the county's 24-strong gritter fleet. Last winter, crews were deployed 50 times and spread 6,500 tonnes of salt on Wiltshire's primary routes.

I recently experienced a relatively rare situation while sitting on the Southern Area Planning Committee: the committee, on legal advice, could not lawfully overturn an officer recommendation and grant planning permission immediately. Not all members agreed, but the application was refused. Without the legal constraints, the committee might have looked on the application more favourably.

The most recent ICB Dementia Diagnosis Rate statistics (October 2025) show that Mere Surgery has 73 registered patients aged 65+ with dementia. The Area

Board is exploring the idea of establishing a memory group in Mere—anyone interested, please let me know.

Wiltshire Council has successfully prosecuted a resident who repeatedly failed to pay parking fines and then damaged a wheel clamp placed on his vehicle. He was fined £200 and ordered to pay £165 in costs and surcharges. While he was in court, enforcement officers seized his vehicle, which will now be sold to recover the outstanding debt. This case was part of a wider joint operation between Wiltshire Council and Rundles Enforcement Agents, using ANPR technology to target persistent evaders. The initiative recovered more than £3,470, resolved 32 cases in full, and led to eight vehicles being clamped.

A proposal is being made to simplify the Council Tax Reduction Scheme. Currently, support levels can change every month—even with minor income fluctuations—making the system complicated for residents. From April 2026, it is proposed that support will only be updated when there is a significant change in circumstances, such as: moving house; starting or leaving a job; a substantial change in income; or someone moving into or out of the household.

Wiltshire Council has confirmed that Blue Badge holders will once again be able to park for free in all council-operated car parks, following a vote at Full Council on Tuesday 21 October. I supported this decision, as the issue is not only about affordability but also about the difficulties disabled people face when parking. Previously, charges had been introduced in car parks (though on-street parking remained free), with Blue Badge holders receiving a one-hour grace period.

A total of 635 learners have gained new skills and taken positive steps toward improving their lives through adult learning courses in Wiltshire. The Family and Community Learning (FACL) Team has had a record year with more than 600 online and face-to-face learners. The team supports people in building confidence, developing employment skills, improving digital, financial, and communication abilities, and helping parents and carers support their children's education.

Wiltshire Council has now delivered 215 new affordable homes across the county as part of its commitment to high-quality, energy-efficient housing. This follows the completion of eight homes at Corsley Heath, with a further 576 in

development and more planned. The council aims to deliver 1,000 affordable homes to address local housing need and the cost-of-living. These homes use modern modular construction: units are built in Ringwood, Hampshire, delivered to site with kitchens, bathrooms, wiring and plumbing already fitted, and then finished with a traditional roof and interior decoration.

The Renters' Rights Act has now become law, with implementation set for next May. The Act abolishes Section 21 "no-fault" evictions and introduces stronger repossession grounds to protect legitimate landlord interests.

Wiltshire Council has added a third Bobcat machine to increase the speed and efficiency of pothole repairs. Bobcats can remove large areas of damaged road surface within minutes, allowing repair teams to work more quickly and complete more jobs with less disruption.

Wiltshire Council has also successfully prosecuted a Trowbridge business owner for failing to meet legal responsibilities for disposing of commercial waste. The court imposed fines and a five-day prison sentence in default. Businesses must ensure waste is handled by licensed carriers, keep waste-transfer notes for two years, avoid presenting commercial waste as domestic waste, and register as waste carriers if transporting their own waste.

The Police and Crime Commissioner for Wiltshire and Swindon was informed just one hour before the Commons announcement that the PCC role and office were being disbanded. No consultation had taken place. The police minister stated the function had failed nationally and that disbandment would save £100 million. The PCC noted Wiltshire receives £115 per head in central grant funding, compared with more than £400 per head for the Metropolitan Police, despite Wiltshire having the lowest crime rate per capita in the country.

The Wiltshire FUEL Winter Programme opens for booking on 14 November. The programme, funded by the Department for Education, primarily supports children eligible for benefit-related Free School Meals but can also offer limited places for refugees, children in care, young carers, and other vulnerable young people. Families previously enrolled have been notified. Bookings can be made through the FUEL booking system and must be completed at least two weeks in

advance; bookings close on 12 December. Enquiries can be emailed to fuelprogramme@wiltshire.gov.uk

Dog fouling continues to be a recurring issue, with growing numbers of complaints. I am highlighting it again in the hope that awareness will help curb the problem, although improvements often seem short-lived.

Penny Fennon recorded October rainfall for Salisbury Street at 15 cm, with the 3rd being the wettest day at 3.0 cm.

Pam Baldock recorded 75 mm (3 inches) for Lordsmead, with no measurable rainfall from Sunday 5th to Monday 20th. The wettest day was Sunday 19th October with 18.5 mm.

A Black-Tie Dinner and Musical Journey performed by renowned concert pianist Rupert Egerton-Smith was held on Saturday, 1st November, at Hillbrush, Mere.

We are happy to confirm that the Link will continue to take people to medical appointments over the Christmas and New Year holidays. However, please note that our phone will **not** be "manned" on 24, 25, 26, 31 December 2025 and 1 and 2 January 2026. If you have a medical appointment between these dates, please let us know by Friday 20 December, if at all possible to give us the best chance of getting you a driver.

October was the busiest month so far this year with 143 trips completed, 21 cancelled and only 1 with no driver available. Our drivers did 5,803 miles and 343 hours and the co-ordinators made/received an estimated 800+ phone calls. A staggering effort from everyone.



We need more drivers to help us meet the demand and if you are interested in volunteering as a driver please call our co-ordinator on 01747 860096. This could be one of your New Year's resolutions! Our volunteer drivers choose when they want to drive and to where they want to go and receive 45p/mile to cover the additional costs of using their own car.

If you want to use the Link, once you have an appointment please call 01747 860096 to book a driver. But please remember we are not a taxi service! **Our co-ordinators work in their own homes – we do not have an office – so please keep calls to 9–5 Monday to Friday and only use the 01747 860096 number.** Also, we require, wherever possible, a minimum of 48 hours notice (not including Saturdays and Sundays). Our co-ordinator has to ring round to find a driver who is available to take you to your appointment and we cannot guarantee our co-ordinator will be at home to arrange last minute requests.
